Sprinkle over tuna and place under low or moderate heat in broiler, about 4 inches from source of heat, so that crumbs do not get too brown before fish is hot. Watch closely. In about 7 to 10 minutes or so fish should be thoroughly heated and topping a beautiful golden brown. Garnish with parsley aprigs, tucking short stems into sauce. 4 servings.






