Editorial Comment

Commission Action Brings Plaudits

The Seminole County Commission, accustomed to receiving, as do all elective bodies, complaints and criticisms for some of its actions or lack thereof, deserves a well-placed "pat on the back" for its Tuesday vote, which reversed an earlier stance established a week before, thereby freeing building permits for two residential and apartment developments.

The commission action loosened the wheels of financial arrangements, that were abruptly braked the week previous, when the commission reversed the banking gears after they had meshed to provide the necessary transfers of finances from various banking institutions, so needed by developers of South Seminole's Wingfield Reserve and Lake Brantley Arms.

Tuesday's commission action also affirmed in the public's eye that the county body meant what it said a month earlier, when it gave approval to these developments, as well as others still in the embryonic stage.

A special recognition should also be extended to one of the county's bright, young politicos- Mike Hattaway, who advised his colleagues Tuesday he had decided to "stick to the decision" made by the former commission a month before.

Realizing that he was not a member of that board when the first decision was made, but also cognizant that he was morally bound, though not legally, to uphold the credibility of the county's ruling body, young Hattaway showed he was

Hypocrisy Word Game

All too predictably, Arab governments in the United Nations are lining up to frustrate action on a resolution condemning international terrorism - a resolution holding out hope for a unified stand by all nations against airline hijackers and political kidnapers, bombers and

What is hard to swallow is the contention of Arab spokesmen that the crime of terrorism has not been adequately defined.

The draft resolution offered to the U. N. in September by the United States of America could hardly be more explicit. It refers to acts of violence not by members of hostile armed forces, committed by citizens of one country on the territory of another, directed against citizens of another, and aimed at exacting concessions from a government or damaging its interests.

The only trouble with that definition is that it fits perfectly the kind of crimes being committed by terrorists who enjoy sanctuary in Arab



Better Air

Aircraft Noise, Exhaust Emissions

The wild blue yonder is becoming cleaner and quieter with every passing month.

That, at least, is the theme of a new advertising and public relations campaign by the airline industry as it reacts to charges that aircraft engine noise and exhaust emissions are wreaking ecological havoc.

In the infant years of the commercial jet era, galloping passenger demand for jet travel led to rapid expansion of More jets meant more exhaust smoke, more engine noise

and more irritated citizens-especially around congested urban areas. According to the Air Transport Association, airliner emissions never amounted to more than one per cent of the

total air pollution in metropolitan areas. But the formidable jets, with their telltale smoke plumes and high-pitched engine whine, were conspicous targets for irate little old ladies in tennis shoes, backyard barbecue chefs, housewives, environmentalists and other concerned

The ATA says that when the first bleats of protest were heard following the belching of airliner exhaust smoke, the nation's airlines began a campaign to eliminate exhaust emissions and muffle engine noise.

The drive was undertaken in concert with engine manufacturers and has been going on for 15 years. Recently, according to the ATA, the years of research and development began to pay off.

The dividend came not only in the design of engines that were relatively clean and quiet for the latest commercial airliners-such as the Boeing 747, D-10 and the L-1011-but also in the introduction of antipollution modifications for previously built airliners.

By the end of 1975, according to ATA President Stuart Tipton, 13 per cent of the combined airline fleet will be comprised of new, advanced-technology jets with low-noise,

Another 51 per cent of the jet fleet will be powered by refitted engines—older engines which have been modified to reduce smoke emissions. Altogether, 64 per cent of the airline fleet of 1974 will be

powered by virtually smoke-free engines. That compares to less than one per cent in 1969, Tipton said. Since the new wide-bodied airliners are not only cleaner and quieter than their predecessors, but also larger and more powerful, they can carry up to three times the passenger

Airlines using these aircraft can therefore absorb hefty increases in passenger traffic without crowding the skies by adding so many new aircraft. "A key factor in our pollution and noise abatement program has been the design of new engines with a higher

loads of first-generation jet transports.

bypass ratio," said Tipton. "Obviously, all jet engines take in huge quantities of air. Some of that air is compressed and burned by combustion. But some of the air is purposely bypassed around the combustion chamber and exhausted along with the combusted air. The bypass ratio compares the amount of air that bypasses the combustion process with the amount of air that is burned in the engine.

"Moreover, net reductions in engine emissions have also been brought about through improvements in combustion efficiency," Tipton said.

Tipton said that front-end design changes in commercial jetliner engines have helped to further reduce jet noise. "As a result of the intersive antipollution programs of our various member airlines, we believe that the smoke plume and whine usually associated with jet engines will soon become as much of an anachronism as the staggerwing biplane," Tipton said.



What to Look for In Cabinet Shuffle

President Nixon heads into his reorganization of the administration with some very definite ideas of what the role of the President should be.

As Mr. Nixon put it years ago, "The job of the presidency has gotten so big that we no longer can afford to have the president making so many of his decisions him. self. He must be free to make the great decisions, particlelarly on foreign policy, and some of those on domestic policy; but he must have strong men as secretary of state. secretary of the treasury, secretary of defense, who on their own as members of the team will be able to provide the leadership that this nation needs.

In his reorganization, Mr. Nixon will be more determined than ever to have a Cabinet of men who will run their own departments day to day and not bother him with routine matters, leaving him free to concentrate on what he believes to be the crucial problems of the nation

The Nixon tendency to isolate himself from his Cabinet members on a day to day basis, already evident in the past three and a half years, has been construed here as downgrading these department secretaries. But in the Nixon point of view, it upgrades these men, in that each has more of a free hand to run his department as he sees

These men do, however, have less say on major innovations and on other crucial decisions than Cabinet mem-

The kind of strength President Nixon wants to see more of in the major Cabinet posts is strength in the power to administer, to get things done, to handle great numbers of men and complicated projects with efficiency. He doesn't want great arguers or debaters. As in foreign affairs, he wants the great break-throughs to come from

This means, if Mr. Nixon chooses correctly, the new men he chooses at high levels of his government will be men less inclined to rush to the White House. When they do have problems or ideas which must come to the President's attention, they will, wherever possible, outline what they have to say in concise memoranda.

They will not be men who insist on personal meetings except in Cabinet sessions and except for very unusual circumstances. For Mr. Nixon believes even Cabinet members get so emotionally involved with their depart ments that clear thinking suffers and confrontations are inevitable. He wants the emotions subdued and the confrontations defused before problems come to him.

The reorganized administration structure thus will provide for even more diffusing of authority (and perhaps more layers of men) to filter departmental and agency

Nixon Landslide? Take Another Look

When is a landslide not a landslide? Well, when yo start pushing the figures around, and look at them from

inside out and upside down. Judging from a spate of post-election letters to the New York Times, a lot of people were less than impressed by President Nixon's showing Sure; says one writer, 521 Electoral College votes for

Richard Nixon and only 17 for George McGovern was a blockbusting victory on the basis of states. But few people seem to reflect, he says, that four out of 10 voters cast their ballots for McGovern. If only one out of 10 votes had been switched, the popular count would have been even.

Another writer agrees. The true reality, he says, is 30 million against 45 million, not 521 against 17. The "reality" becomes even "truer" when you chew on this thought he offers: Each vote cast for the challenger to an incumbent president "weighs on the sociopolitics scale more than a vote for the incumbent. How about this? says another. The deficit in the Democratic vote between 1968 and 1972 was less than 6 per

cent. In many key industrial states, it was only 2 to 3 per cent. So much, he says, for the alleged "massive" defec tion of Democrats to the Republican side. If this doesn't impress you, still another writer points out that the percentage of total eligible voters who actually participated in the 1972 election was about 55.35 per

cent, the lowest since 1948. (In the recent German elections, by comparison, 91.2 per cent of the eligible voters If we multiply 55.35 by President Nixon's 61 per cent margin, says this observer, we get 33.7 as his percentage of the eligible 1972 vote. In other words, two-thirds of the eligible voters either did not vote or voted for George

Is 33.7 per cent a "landslide"? he asks. Hardly, he Kind of makes you begin to wonder if Mr. Nixon will have the nerve to show up for his inauguration on Jan.




Building trades unionists in South Africa are urging the government to lift its restrictions against black workers in favor of equal pay for equal work. 

DEAR POLLY-I have a suggestion for Mrs. L. C. T. who has trouble with purple spots (left by flying birds) appearing on her sheets when they are hung outside to dry. Lay the material over a pan, with the spot in the center, and pour boiling water through the spot. It will vanish like magic if the article has not been laundered after being spotted. I had the same problem all during the elderberry season and found this method works on most fruit stains if used BEFORE the article is laundered .-

DEAR POLLY-I suggest that Mrs. L. C. T. use her garden hose set at full force just as soon as she sees purple spots the birds have left on her hanging sheets. Rinse from both sides until the purple stains are gone or until only a light stain is still visible and then the sun will do the rest. Since the stains are purple there must be a mulberry tree or berry bushes in the neighborhood. Birds usually fly over the same area of a yard because of trees or wires so I have found one line of wash will be spotted and another remain spotless. Hang wash only on lines that are rarely soiled. I have learned this the hard way as my neighbors have a mulberry tree and it seems these spots always show up on white things.-FRANCES

DEAR POLLY-If you have an electric clock that refuses to run any more (the kind that runs on electric current, not the battery type) perhaps my remedy will help Unplug the clock, turn it face downward at an angle with the top part down and the bottom of the clock at the top. After two or three days of this turn the clock upright again and plug in. The oil has been re-distributed so it will doubtless run like new. Mine has been running five months since the upside-down treatment.-MRS. I. F. (NEWSPAPER ENTERPRISE ASSN.)
