"I would say that things are working a good deal better in the first two departments than in the third."

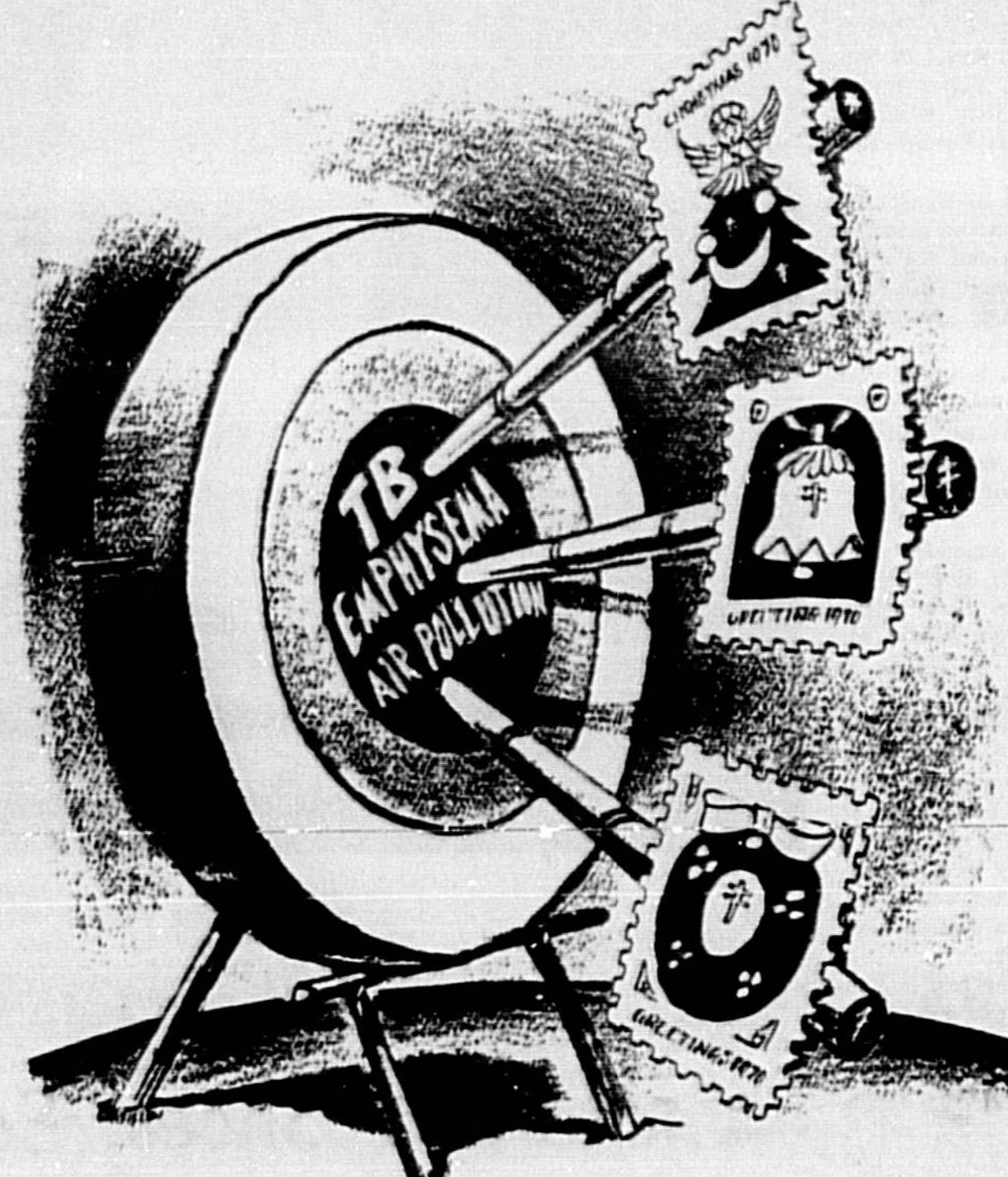
The Marketplace

The Arabs and Israel continue the cease-fire along the Suez Canal and representatives of the United States, Russia, Britain and France have resumed bargaining.

Now, I am informed, Moscow's emissaries are in contact with Israel's diplomats for the first time since the six-day war in 1967.

The contacts are informal and secret and the Russians, in public statement, continue to attack Israel as the "aggressor."

But even Russia's hawk, judged by Moscow's press, are increasingly worried by the in-ability of the bickering Arabs to co-ordinate their action against Israel.

As seen in Moscow, the election of Anwar al-Sadat, as Nasser's successor has not put an end to struggles for power in Egypt. Soviet commentators continue to denounce "national and international reactionaries."

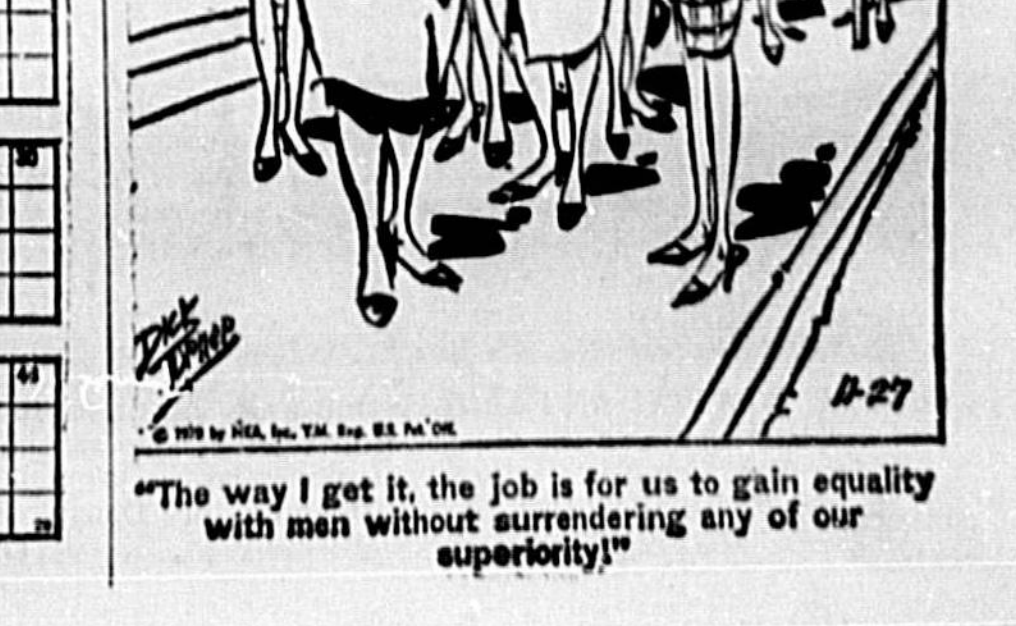

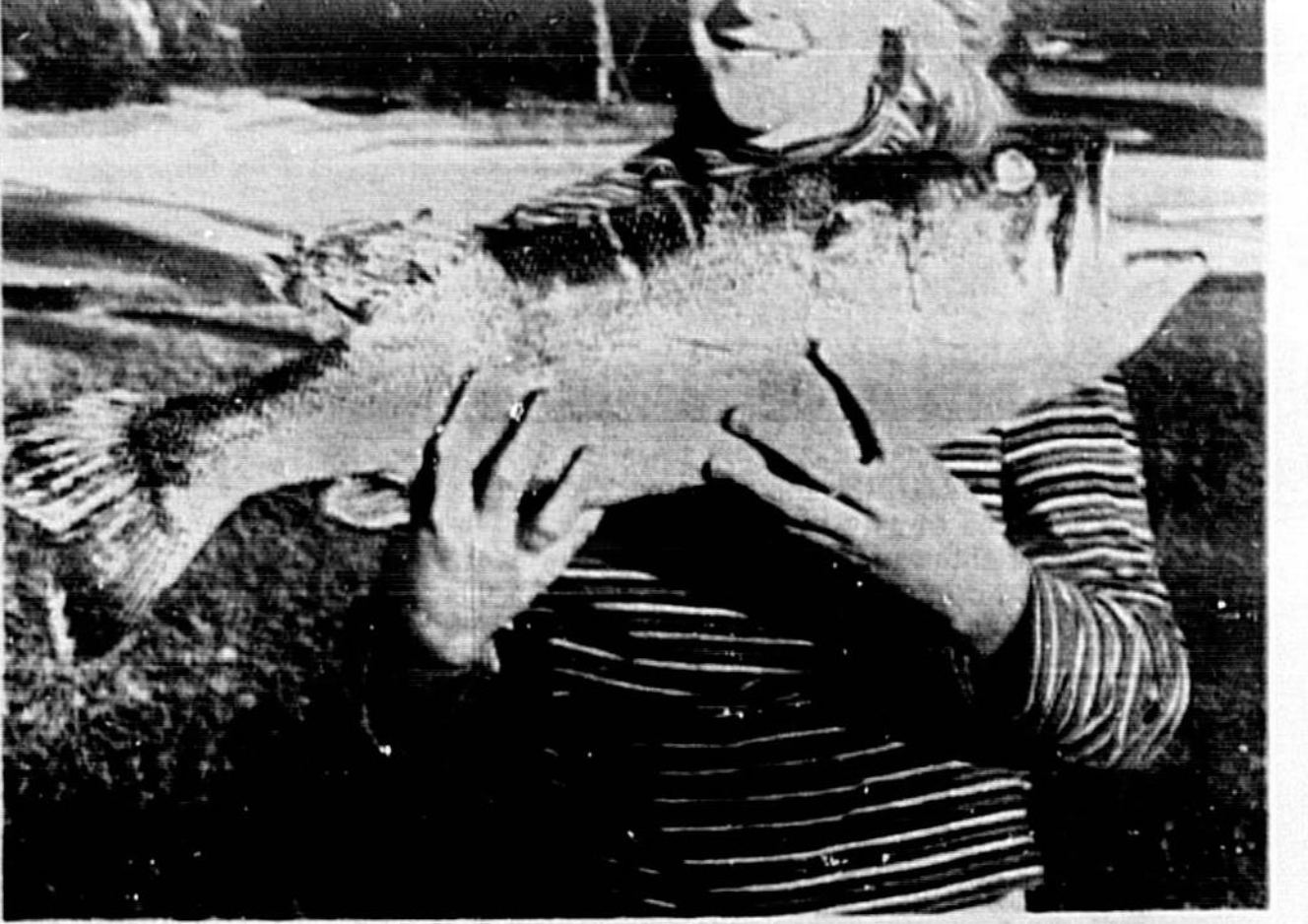
'Night of Stars' To Benefit Crash Victims

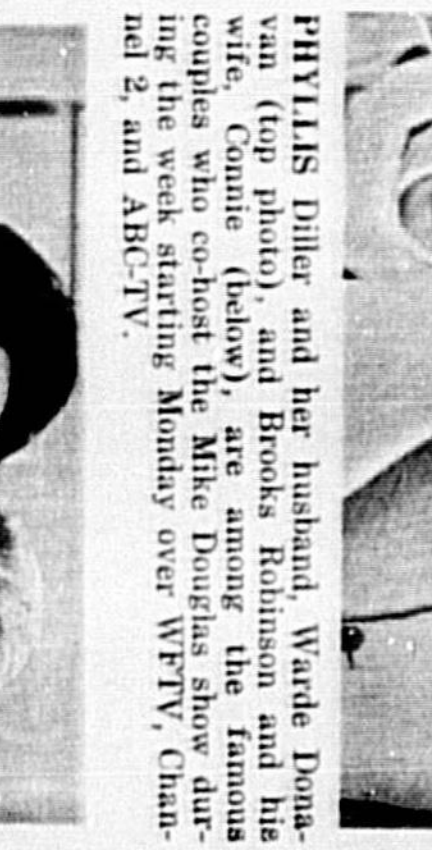

Train Derailment Attempt Probed

The attempted derailment of a Seaboard Coast Line train by placing three barricades on the railroad tracks just south of Lake Mary Boulevard is receiving the attention of the sheriff's department.

Chief Deputy Duane Harrell said today that somebody was trying to wreck the train and he believed juveniles were involved in the placing of wooden barricades on the track.

Sheriff's investigators made three trips to the railroad crossing during the weekend to remove the barriers that were placed across the tracks and, according to Deputy E. H. Standley, one subject was seen to run from the scene after county authorities arrived.

Harrell said Standley's car received front end damage because of the barricades. Deputy Standley, in his report, stated that someone had shot at the train during the course of the harassment.

Harrell pointed out that in the latest attempt a large metal door was also used in the barricades and that a finger print was obtained.

He said county investigators are working to determine the identity of suspects and explained that the persons responsible for the actions may be guilty of felonies.

In a separate county report, Det. Sgt. Tony Cangeloso is investigating the opening of a grave located at the county cemetery.

Investigators were called to the location, just off Highway 17-92 near the junior college, to examine the reported removal of dirt from over a box, which apparently contains a body.

The number of the grave was listed as 89 but there was no immediate determination that the box had been opened or whether there was tampering with the remains.

Altamonte Council Delays Meet Again

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - The almost continual problem of City Council members being absent has necessitated the continuation of tomorrow's meeting until Dec. 8 at 4:30 p.m. According to Administrative Assistant Rolf Wagner, the meeting was cancelled because of lack of a quorum.

Scheduled on the agenda from the Nov. 17 meeting was a discussion upon an ordinance annexing the Cross-County financial district. Opposition to the annexation was expressed in concern of pollution in the Crane's Roost area by the Orange Audubon Society, Florida group of the Sierra Club and the Environmental Coordinating Association. David Gluckman, representing these associations, appeared at the meeting to express views of the pollution aspect, but was dismissed by Mayor Lawrence Swofford.

Also appearing to speak upon the matter regarding a statement of the county's policy was County Planner David Farr, who was told that he would be placed upon the agenda for the next meeting, and presumably will do so on Dec. 8. Mrs. William Burdette, representing the League of Women Voters, was also told that she would be placed on the agenda.

The assessment roll for the paving and draining of First Street was to be considered tomorrow relative to a review by the city's consulting engineering firm of Glace and Radcliffe. Residents appeared on Nov. 17 to state that the assessments are inequitable in that many contributions were not included in the assessment, while conversely some were assessed who did not live on the street.

Swofford agreed that there might be some disparity and requested the review by the firm, although residents asked that another firm perform the review, since they felt that Glace and Radcliffe would not "admit mistakes."

Councilman Dan Dorfman contended that he would rather see a watershed district and could not justify "taxing people who live 200 feet up another street. Presumably the review will also be made on Dec. 8.

2 Robberies Probed; Fire Loss At \$4,000

Two armed robberies, a barn burning and the arrest of a Sanford man on traffic and drug charges highlighted this weekend's crime reports at Sanford police and Seminole sheriff's department.

The 7-11 convenience store at Park Avenue and 12th Street was robbed of an estimated \$76 Sunday by three men, one wearing a pistol.

Det. Roy Williams reported three men, described as black and wearing blue work clothes, came into the store and took the money from Mrs. Irene Frenier, the cashier. They reportedly made their escape on foot.

County investigators are probing the robbery of the Eastern Oil Station on SR 436 in Altamonte Springs by two men, who slugged the attendant over the head and took a total of \$140.

Fred Demorandille, the attendant, said the men took \$50 from the station's cash drawer and another \$60 from his pockets after first striking him on the head when his attention was diverted by one of the men who asked for a package of cigarettes.

Deputy Steve Willis investigated the report and stated the men left the area walking, according to the attendant.

A barn and its contents worth approximately \$4,000 was burned Sunday, according to sheriff's reports.

The barn, located in an orange grove on South Cameron Avenue, quarter mile south of SR 46 east, belonged to Robert Partin, 1520 Howell Branch Road, according to report filed by Deputy Charles Gilbert. The barn contained a number of pipes and two pumps and other items.

Deputy Gilbert quoted Thomas L. Sullivan, who lives near the area, that he heard what sounded like a truck stuck in the mud before spotting the blaze.

Patrolman Gary Swain and Det. William Foster early today arrested a Sanford man on a total of four charges, including carrying a concealed weapon, possession of central nervous system stimulants, driving while intoxicated and reckless driving.

John Alfred Hansen, 37, of 2412 Decettes Avenue, was lodged in jail in lieu of a \$500 bond on all charges after police stopped his car.

According to police reports, the man wore a revolver in a holster and had in his possession six capsules, some of them containing amphetamines.

Food Stamps Go On Sale Wednesday

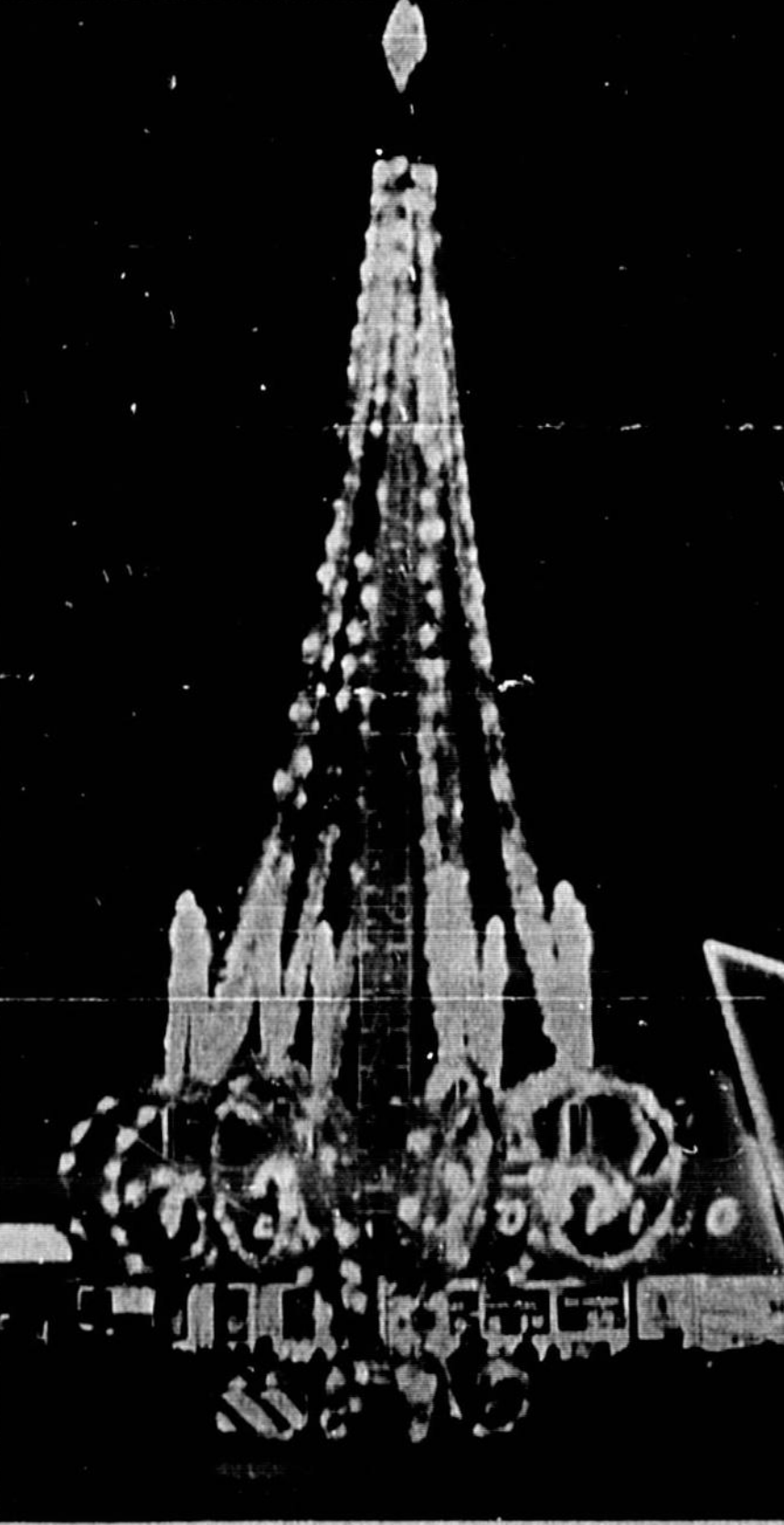
The Seminole County food stamp office will begin to issue food stamps on Wednesday.

All those who have been approved for the program and who have received their identification cards may pick up their food coupons at the food stamp office located on Highway 17-92 behind the Agril-Center building on Wednesday or any day thereafter.

Food stamps will be issued between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Low income families of Seminole County who have not yet applied for food stamps may do so at the food stamp office between the hours of 8:15 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

When making application remember to bring written proof of income and written proof of current payments for rent, mortgage, utilities, medical bills, fire insurance, and any resources such as bank checking or savings account.

County Ponders Budget Request

County Commissioners face a relatively light agenda at tomorrow's meeting. In addition to routine reports, only three items are scheduled for consideration.

A discussion will be held regarding the contract the county has with the Mental Health Association. The association had made an initial request for funding from the county in the amount of \$15,000. A similar figure had been appropriated by the School Board and matching funds were available from the state. The county, however, authorized only a four-month contract in July, which expired at the close of the county's fiscal year in October. The association has requested a contract for the next fiscal year in the amount of \$15,000.

Commissioners will make a decision regarding signs for recreational facilities at various county schools. The county has been erecting these facilities at the schools upon a four year program, which are available to the general public after school hours and on week ends. It was felt that many persons do not avail themselves of these facilities since they are unaware of the hours. Therefore the signs will designate the hours.

The maintenance department had earlier provided the commission with two figures for the cost of the signs. Metal signs would necessitate an expenditure of \$1,200 and wood signs would cost approximately \$400. The commissioners, tomorrow, will decide upon the erection and type of signs.

Three public hearings, all appeals against decisions of the Board of Adjustment, are scheduled.
