





Water Pollution

The idea is spreading that the clearing up of water pol-lution is a regional problem, one in which the whole area of a stream or lake must be considered as a unit. Linked with it is a painfully slow disillusionment with respect to the old and still often maintained sdage that running water purifies itself in a few miles.

It has now been realized by those who deal with water that the pure water which used to be found a few miles below a source of stream pollution was a result not of purification but only of dilution. In most streams and lakes the volume of sewage and other waste has now become so great that there is no longer enough water to dilute it to the point

of apparent purification.
So an old myth must disappear. With it goes the notion that water pollution is a purely local matter. This already has been recognized by many states, which have enacted pure stream laws and are embarked on the long and rugged road of enforcement. The obvious next step in many cases will be agreements among states which share common waterways, leading to the elimination of pollution throughout

the length of a river or shoreline.

Modern plumbing has so long isolated most Americans from their sewage that we are inclined to forget how important it is. That isolation has been a fundamental factor in lifting the general health level in America above that of a
large part of the rest of the world. We are in danger of
losing that benefit of sanitary plumbing unless we face
frankly the matter of isolating our waters from our sewers.

Expenditures for community recreation in 1.635 cities in the U. S. and Canada exceeded \$95,000,000.

Taxes and other funds paid \$8 per cent of the bill. Nearly quethird went for leadership salaries. Sixty-seven cities passed recreation bond issues totaling more than \$21,000,000.

There were 48,548 men and women employed as recreation leaders, and 5,899 had fulltime, yearround jobs. Another \$9,234 volunter workers pitched in. Men outnumbered women in both paid and volunter leadership.

Playgrounds and indoor centers with leaders present drew 465,000,000 children and adults during the year. Swim centers had nearly 162,000,000 customers. Tennis players used 11,964 public courts, and there were nearly as many softball diamonds. There were more picnic areas than baseball diamonds, and almost as many ice skating areas.

Archery ranges, shufflehoard

Archery ranges, shufflehoard courts and bowling greens attracted people seeking mild exercises. Children and young adults used 13,520 outdoor playgrounds, one-quarter of which stayed open all year.

School buildings made up more than half the 8,561 buildings used for community recreation. These

were headquarters for many of the forms of crafts, music, nature activities, and hobbies.

Activities for older folks showed the greatest relative growth. Lass year 404 cities provided such pro-grams, compared with 264 in 1946.

A majority of the cities re-porting have separate recreation departments, Eleven out of every 12 had unpaid citizen boards.






