

Beirut Fighting Escalates With 52 Persons Killed

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Fighting escalated along the front line separating the Christians in eastern Beirut and the Moslems on the west, and security officials reported 52 persons killed and 120 wounded.

Three mortar rounds hit a Moslem hospital, killing five persons and wounding 25, police said. The police blamed leftists for a fire in the parliament building which they said destroyed important documents. Firemen braved occasional bursts of machine-gun and sniper fire to battle the hour-long blaze.

Most furniture and files in the building had been looted or burned during the two months since the leftists took control of the downtown area around the building. A session of Parliament last week to start the process of replacing President Suleiman Franjieh was held in a

ROME (AP) - The Christian Democrats have made a lastditch appeal to the Socialists to save Premier Aldo Moro's government and stave off the elections in which many expect the Communists to run first. The Socialists are expected to refuse. Dissolution of parliament appears likely, with elections to follow in June, a year ahead of schedule.

Palm Beach Condo Plundered; **Broken Tool Only Clue**

PALM BEACH (AP) - Police and FBI agents say they're without a solid lead in a luxury condominum robbery that netted three armed men \$3 million to \$4 million in jewels and cash from 180 safe-deposit boxes. One source said it may turn out to be the biggest such

theft in history. The only physical clue police said they had to the crime was part of an unidentified tool used to pry open the boxes. Only a few of the tenants who had their valuables stolen had insurance, police said. It was still not known whether the condominium had coverage against theft.

BOSTON (AP) - They sat in their academic robes Rosa Parks, the black woman who 21 years ago refused to move to the back of the bus, and Linda Brown Smith, whose father did not want her to go to the segregated

schools of Topeka, Kan., 22 years ago. They were honored by Boston University, alma mater of the late Rev. Martin Luther King on the eighth anniversary of his assassination.

But in this city torn by strife over school integration, fewer than 50 people came to pay tribute Wednesday to 15 heroes and heroines of the civil rights movement.



Foreign Policy In A Crossfire

Because of the powerful and visible positions they hold in administrations, secretaries of state probably are never wholly aloof from politial campaigns. However, there is no doubt that Henry Kissinger has become a central issue in the 1976 presidential selection process, something that he undoubtedly had no intention of becoming.

The principal reason probably is because Americans have deep misgivings about our relationships with other countries and particularly whether we could stand up to the Soviet Union if things came to that. Ironically, the more Mr. Kissinger tries to reassure citizens that the United States is all right, the more deeply he becomes enmeshed in politics.

In part it is because the philosophical gap between President Ford and his challenger Ronald Reagan is narrow. But there is a great spread among Republicans about the status of national security and the Administration's policy toward the Soviet Union. Mr. Reagan speaks for the party's hard core right wing on both issues. And although the challenger is running far behind Mr. Ford in the primaries, the conservatives are encouraged because Mr. Reagan is picking up more than 40 per cent of the popular vote, which gives the right wing political muscle. The President needs conservative

Up to a point, discussion of foreign policy in campaigns is fair game. If incumbent presidents can point to their achievements abroad, challengers can dispute them. However, Mr. Reagan's full frontal attack on defense and detente, using Mr. Kissinger as the lightning rod raises some disturbing questions.

For one thing, foreign policy cannot be fully exposed and conducted in a free swinging political campaign. Mr. Kissinger indeed has taken some seemingly contradictory stands over U.S. policy in Rhodesia and his threats against use of Cuban guerrillas do seem hollow. Still it is entirely possible that he cannot divulge his full reasons for doing so without endangering some sensitive negotiation. It might be entirely true, for example, that the Soviet Union has promised that Cuban troops will not be used in Rhodesia, but to say so officially would almost certainly result in their use.

In a sense the entire Kissinger issue is as productive as running on a treadmill. Mr. Ford's campaign manager, Rogers C. B. Morton, was stating what has been an open secret when he told California Republicans that the secretary of state probably would not remain in office beyond the end of the year. His pride, ego and pragmatism undoubtedly will drive him from public office whenever he believes that the time is right. And he will remain a magnet for the conservatives' disaffection as long as he does remain in charge at the State Department.

The big question that Americans must ponder in the interim is whether they are damaging the office as much as they are the man.


Can any highly qualified and effective citizen be an effective secretary of state under the increasingly tumultuous and circumscribing conditions that are beginning to hobble the office?



Gun Law Proving A Point

ough new mandatory sentencing law, are a widespread campaign to publicize it, are lending considerable weight to the arguments of those who maintain that the most effective way to reduce gun crimes it to control criminals

Last year, the Sunshine State enacted a law which promises criminals who commit serious gun crimes at least a three-year mandatory entence, and possible life imprisonment.

To publicize this new statute - which a statewide survey showed 80 per cent of the public was not familiar with — the Florida Sheriff's Association distributed 10,000 posters to retail stores showing a hand gun and bearing the word "Hold Up? Think twice. Three years to life."

Radio and TV stations have also agreed to run public service ads carrying this message, and it is appearing on 150 outdoor billboards throughout the state. The results to date are very

In an interview, Tom Miller, assistant to the president of Handy Way Food Stores, which has 62 quick-shop convenience stores all across Florida, told me that publicizing the new law has had a "significant impact" on armed robberies. He reports that serious gun crimes in his stores have decreased 40 per cent, which he says is

Taking One-up-manship Aloft To New Heights

Stunt pilot Joe Hughes is in Sanford for the Third Annual Rotary Air Show this weekend. Several newsmen were invited to "wing-walk" on Hughes' specially outfitted bi-plane. When Bill Currie of the Herald accepted the challenge, Herald newswoman Jean Patteson (above) demanded - and got - equal time for the distaff side to prove - or fail trying — that "anything you can do I can do, too."

I'm a wing walker. I received my wings on Thursday after standing on the top wing of Joe Hughes' Super Stearman and flying over the City of

My 10-minute performance - well, it was an experience. Scared, I wasn't. Hughes has logged more than 5,000 hours in the air and has performed in air shows more than 100 times and he flies more than 50,000 miles each year in thrilling and captivating his

So why should I be frightened? I figured he wasn't going to allow anyone on that wing and take off if it were unsafe. Of course, I did remember the words of the spouse when we took off on the East-West Runway of Sanford-Central Florida Airport and they were: "Watch out for the first step, 'cause it's a long way down." Another thing I thought of was that even though Joe Hughes was at the controls, I had the Good Pilot right there along

Some people might say it takes guts to do'a crazy stunt like this, but I didn't feel that way at all. I just placed my fate in the hands of that Good Pilot and let someone else do the worrying.

I knew that in addition to being an experienced fixed-wing pilot, Joe Hughes is also licensed to handle helicopters, gliders, jet aircraft and he's even flown the Goodyear blimp. (Note: I didn't say Goodrich.)

The 10-minute, super spectacular, wing walk that I took was breath-taking to say

After a briefing from Hughes, I climbed on top of that wing and stepped into the stirrups that hold you in place. Then he showed me how he wanted my hands and arms positioned during takeoff and landing, especially the latter, cause with outstretched arms during those periods would act like additional rudders and might throw him off. 


