**'Business Is Fine... Looks Good'**

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Commerce Secretary John T. Connor says business is fine and it looks good for the future with the wildly gyrating stock market only cloud on the economic horizon.

Asked why he thought the market has declined, Connor said that certain "comments" had caused some investors to sell their stock and take a profit.

He did not mention Federal Reserve Board Chairman William McChesney Martin Jr. But market observers have pinned at least some of the blame on Martin, who earlier this month spoke of "disquieting similarities" between the current economic era and the boom of the 1920s which preceded the crash of 1929 and the resulting great depression.

Connor said he found no such similarities. The secretary quoted a Commerce Department report to back his contention.

It said that U. S. business output would show a "good sized rise" in the April-May-June quarter.

Karl and Dick departed Sanford Tuesday morning and they don't expect to roll back in until early August.

The pair, both members of the Sanford-Orlando Motorcycle Club, collected 110 signatures for the trip a year ago. A major step was realized this spring when they both acquired the new Harley-Davidson 74's.

Wearing white jeans, western style shirts and boots, and a classic crash helmet, the duo delayed their long-awaited journey a few minutes to pose for a picture and interview on the grounds of the First Federal Reserve and Loan Association on West First Street.

Their first destination is Grand Rapids, Mich., where they'll participate in a three-day motorcycle rally. Next stop is Milwaukee, Wis., and then it's all right-angled as the pair will try to take in as much of North America as possible, including some sections of Canada, as many national parks in the west as possible, down the Pacific Coast from Washington to southern California before coming home to Florida.

Karl, a slim, wiry type, wears during the winter for Max's Oil Company and resides in the Glendeville area of Sanford. He's been cycling for 35 years and has already made one trip to California and back on a motorcycle, 25 years ago when he was 17.

Dick, a bulky handsome, six-footer, owns Gator Cycle Supply in Orlando. He's been married for 21 years and has four children—three boys, 11, 15 and 16, and one daughter, 18.

# Politician's Wife Expresses Christmas Desires

HARRISBURG, Pa. (UPI) — Mrs. William Scranton has told her husband what she wants for Christmas next year, and Republican politicians planning strategy for the 1968 presidential election had better pay attention.

Scranton's term as governor of Pennsylvania expires on Jan. 1, 1967, and under state law he cannot run for re-election. So does that make him available for another try at the GOP presidential nomination, if so, is he interested?

"Well," he said, "I'll tell you what my wife said to me. She said that for a Christmas present next year she would like me to promise that I would come home for dinner every night until she is 80 years old."

Running for President and getting home to dinner every night probably are beyond the reach of a mortal man. But as this date Scranton cannot be written out of the race nor can he be shored into it. He says with a ring of sincerity in his voice that he hasn't even thought about the possibility. He adds that he doesn't intend to make any decision until he walks out of the governor's office.

At no time during a half hour talk in his office did Scranton evidence any bitterness or frustration over the events in and around San Francisco's Cow Palace when the Republican assembly failed to nominate a candidate.

That, you will recall, was the occasion when he stood alone in the middle of the road and tried to hal the Goldwater-Democratic Republican coalition and badly crashed and bruised.

Scranton still is fighting for the Republican party and this is his formula for victory: "We must concentrate on 1968. Lots will depend on local state issues and we must get good candidates at all levels. We must build the national organization, improve the party's financial situation, but above all, we have to make sure that the best candidates are running on the Republican ticket."

Asked about the new conservative society led by Barry Goldwater, Scranton said he believes that Republicans lost the presidency last year on the basis of "personal feelings." What he means is that too many groups are fighting one another inside the party.

Any action that fragments the party is an invitation to defeat. On national issues Scranton stands as follows: —The Johnson administration is guilty of lack of candor about the war in South Vietnam. It either feeds out misinformation or withholds information. "If you're going to lead a nation in a situation as serious as this, you have to be honest."

—The Atlantic alliance is in serious difficulties and we must not really dig much about it. It regards Western Europe as "the strongest and most important area of the United States in the present world situation."

—America's balance of payments position is a dangerous one. It threatens the stability of the dollar. "The real answer is to increase exports tremendously. They (the Johnson administration) are always pussy-footing about the gravity of the situation. Business men are co-operating, but you can't go on forever asking people not to expand abroad."
