Their business is so healthy, in fact, that they make more money on the average than bank presidents. But bank presidents, as economists have suspected, make considerably more than shoeshine boys.
All this, and more, is revealed in a survey by the U. S. Bureau of Laor Statistics.

Inasmuch as there is scarcely anything more fascinating than poking a nose into someone else's business or bankbook, it is interesting to earn that doctors head a list of 321 occupations by earning an average annual income of \$14,561. This may not be as much as you have suspected your doctor makes, even on the average. But it's almost \$2,000 more than the average

Lawyers are third with \$10,587. It is perhaps indicative of some thing or other that clergymen, with an average of 17.1 years of education, do somewhat better financially than bartenders, but not as well as truck drivers.

The clergymen earn an average o

\$4,008 a year to rank 245th, while the truck drivers make \$4,188 and the bartenders \$3,740. But bartenders meet such interesting people. 
