

Tucker made an extensive tour of the county and reported heavy citrus foliage damage as well as complete ruin of the tender vegetable crop.

He estimated that temperatures were below freezing for a period of more than 20 hours.

Tucker also revealed the damage could reach the proportions of the severe freeze of 1957-58 when losses to the county's agriculture soared well over the \$1 million mark.

A low of 11 degrees was reported in Paola with temperatures at the experiment station at Sanford ranging from 16 to 20 during the early morning hours.

Buddy Hawkins of Markham Rd. reported light flecks of snow fell on his car as he was on his way to some also was reported on Orange Blvd. west of Lake Monroe. Hawkins said it was down to 16 degrees in the Markham area.

Sanford was plagued by frozen water pipes, stalled autos and severe damage to lawns and gardens and ornamental shrubs.

Assurance was given Longwood Mayor Al Lormann Wednesday that funds would be forthcoming from the Housing and Home Finance Agency for the construction of a new City Hall, town sewage system and for new streets, if proper application was made by the town.

The mayor pointed out that the city had more than doubled its population in the past three years and town projects had assumed such proportions that a "pay-as-we-go" method of financing was rapidly becoming impossible.




