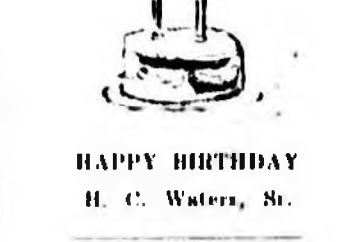
Miss Patty Brown Honored On Birthday

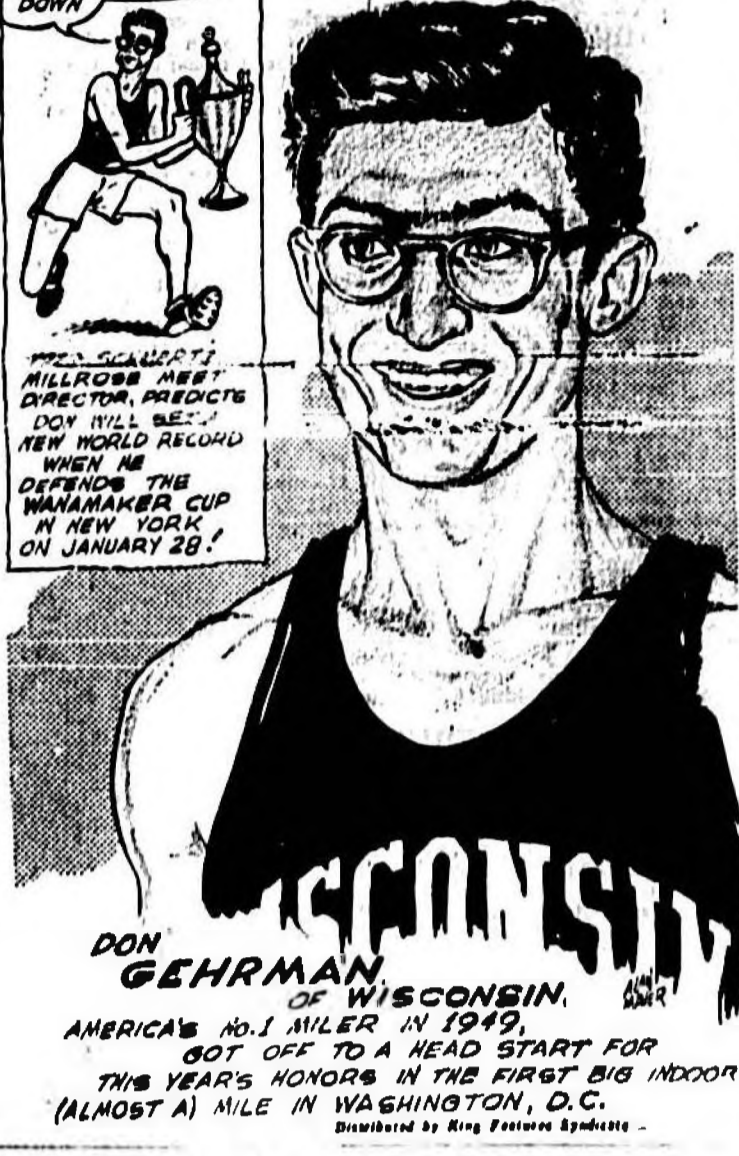
