

# Radio Signals Spur Searchers Of Lost C-54

Weak Signals Revive Hopes Of Finding Survivors Of Miss ing Plane In Alaska

WHITEHORSE, Y. T., Feb.1. (AP) - Search headquarters confirmed here early today that weak radio rignals had been picked up in the ara where a USAF C-54 dirappeared six days ago with 44 persons aboard.

Capt. E. G. Nogar, attached to the search operations office confirmed the report and said full details had been filed with the coordinating headquarters here.

No investigation of the signals has yet been attempted, he said, but planes will comb the area, 132 miles northwest of Fort Nelson, B. C. at daybreak today.

Word of the signals, first denied missing aboard the lost plane may be alive.

A plane was ordered to take off before dawn with special radio technicians. They will concentrate on locating the faint signals and tracing them, if possible, to their

# To The TAXPAYERS and CITIZENS of The City Of Janford, Florida

A group of progressive citizens of Sanford noted a recent advertisement by Mr. Randall Chase asking "DO YOU KNOW" questions regarding the con-

struction of the terminal. These gentlemen made an investigation of the matter. The source of information used in this investigation was the report of Smith & Gillespie, Engineers employed by the City of Sanford for the project. This report is on file at the office of the Chamber of Commerce and the City Manager. The legal opinion was from a competent attorney who studied the acts of the Legislature and the

RFC contract. 1. Mr. Chase asks why only \$800,000 was committed by RFC when the original engineers estimate indicated a cost of \$850,000. Mr. A. K. Maddox, RFC Field Inspector, reviewed the plans with Smith & Gillespie, and suggested certain revisions which would result in a saving of about \$50,000. This indicates RFC's good faith; they are trying to save money on the project, which means it will be free

and clear at an earlier date. 2. Mr. Chase asks where \$120,000 for annual operation and maintenance costs are coming from? Smith & Gillespie's report indicated that for an annual business of 100,000 tons income would be \$180,000 and operation, including debt retirement, would cost \$120,000, leaving a profit of \$60,000. Lesser tonnages would cost less to handle and would bring

in less income, in proportion. 3. Mr. Chase states that the City has bartered away its authority in matters of operation of the terminal and location of the parking meters. Any reputable banker will look to the operation of a business before he risks a loan; a hostile City Administration might decide to eliminate parking meters by locating all those now owned on Geneva Avenue; these are safeguards that would normally not be needed. 4. Mr. Chase states that the City has given a blank check to RFC to cover expenses of inspection, audits, etc. Any large lending agency requires the right of inspection and checking on the use made of its money, at the expense of the borrower. These charges are usually nominal and in cases we have investigated involving the RFC they have been practically nil.

5. The following statement was made by Mr. G. W. Spencer in reply to Mr. Chase's next question:

"The City of Sanford would issue the bonds as authorized by the law and by contract with Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and would sell the bonds direct to Reconstruction Finance Corporation, who in turn sells the bonds to individual holders.

The law giving the City its authority in this matter provides that the City, among other things, is authorized as follows: 'To issue and deliver interest bearing bonds, notes, as evidence of said loan. The principal amount of said bonds, notes; vertificates or obligations shall not exceed \$350,000.00, annum. payable semi-annually.

"The contract entered into between City of Sanford, Florida, and Reconstruction Finance Corporation is by Resolution of City of Sanford, Florida, which in part provides : The bonds shall be coupon bonds dated as of a date satisfactory to the Chief (Chief of Public Agency Branch of Reconstruction Finance Corporation); in the denomination of \$1,000.00 each or such other denomination or denomina-tions as may be satisfactory to the Chief; shall be designated and be registerable as satisfactory to the Chief; shall be payable at such place or places and shall have such other specifications as may be satisfactory to the Chief; shall bear interest at the rate of four per cent (4%) per annual payable semi-annually on days of the year as shall be satisfactory to the Chief.'

"It therefore appears that City of Sanford, Florida, authorized by law to pay four per cent per annum on the bonds issued pursuant to said law, and that the City in strict' compliance with said law has executed a Resolution with Reconstruction Finance Corporation providing for interest at four per cent.

"It would therefore be my opinion that it would be illegal and unlawful for City of Sanford, Florida, to pay more than four per cent interest, and based on the law, coupled with the Resolution from which I have above quoted, I would say that the payment of four per cent interest only is provided and not six per cent as suggested by the question put in said advertisement.

"It would further be my opinion that if City of Sanford, Florida, violated the law and its Resolution and arreed to pay six per cent interest, any citizen could enjoin the City from so doing."

6. Mr. Chase states that the City agrees to comply with any . additional resolutions required by RFC, which could mean the biggest blank check the City has written.




