### Kissinger Debate Stirred By Report

Sen. Mike Mansfield filed a dissenting report as a member of the commission that just completed a two-year study of how the U.S. government conducts its foreign policy. The commission's recommendations are too timid, says the Senate majority leader. They would do nothing to diminish the preeminence of the executive branch in the conduct of foreign policy - "the inflated role of the presidency," as he put it.

No doubt the rest of the commission, which was headed by former under secretary of State Robert D. Murphy, recognized that the President's preeminence in managing foreign policy is nothing to quarrel with. It has its roots in the Constitution, and is also practical. The recent efforts by Sen. Mansfield and some of his collegeagues to try to manage our foreign affairs from the partisan arena of Congress has had regrettable results.

The Murphy commission did concern itself with an "inflated role," but not the President's. It recommended that in the future separate persons fill the posts of secretary of state and assistant to the president for national security — the positions Henry Kissinger has been filling in a "Two-hat" role since 1973. The commission acknowledged that "special circumstances" justify the arrangement in Mr. Kissinger's case, even if it is a bad

President Ford has let it be known that he plans to keep Mr. Kissinger in both jobs because of his unique capabilities, but the commission report is sure to fuel more controversy over this departure from tradition. As the commission noted, the dual Kissinger role has tended to concentrate power in shaping our foreign and defense policies. It has eliminated the presence of a third figure in what would otherwise be a triangular relationship involving the secretary of defense, the secretary of state and the national security assistant.

Ideally, considerations of defense and diplomacy emerge from separate cabinet departments and are sorted out for the President by his assistant for national security. Critics can maintain that this balance was disturbed when Mr. Kissinger, who became national security adviser in 1968, also became secretary of state two years ago.

The defense of President Ford's position on the matter is obvious. The ultimate responsibility for foreign policy remains his own, and how the military and diplomatic contributions to it are generated are not so important as what finally receives the President's approval. It would be unfair and unwise to prevent a president from using the talent available to him in a way he believes to be most beneficial.

Reports of many governmental commissions are filed on the shelf and forgotten. The Murphy commission's report may be an exception. It will add substance to a debate that promises to continue as long as Henry Kissinger retains the high degree of confidence he commands in the eyes of the

troversial new federal regulations aimed at removing sex discrimination from athletics and many other campus activities at schools and colleges. The Department of Health, Education and Welfare is catching it from two sides for its interpretation of a 1972 law that is supposed to deny federal funds to any school that treats the sexes unfairly.

Darrell Royal, president of the American Football Coaches Association, says the requirement that women have equal access to sports programs, or at least the money that supports them, could be disastrous for college athletics. On the other hand, some advocates of equal rights claim the rules are too vague and do not go far enough in opening up academic opportunities for women beyond the area of athletics.

It is obvious enough that Congress opened a can of worms when it adopted the anti-discrimination Title IX amendment in 1972. Fortunately, Sen. Jesse Helms of North Carolina sees a way for Congress to clarify what it meant to do in that





## Story Hour Turns To Last Page

If you're a Sanford parent of a 4- to 6-year-old, you'll probably know Lanita Brown. And your children will surely love her, because to them this attractive young woman represents all kinds of fun - bear hunts and finger plays and stories of ad-

Since February, Lanita has been presenting Story Hour on Wednesday afternoons in the Sanford Civic Center, sponsored by the Sanford Recreation Dept. Now, with summer vacations stealing her audiences, the story hours are drawing to a close, but not before the lives of dozens of young Sanfordites have been enriched by the tales and activities enjoyed in Lanita's classes. "Books are my number one love," said Lanita, "so naturally I'd like to see all parents read to their children every day. I'm sure, if children are exposed to reading from the

eginning, they'll enjoy books and read more as they grow Her background and experience are well adapted to confucting such sessions as story hour. Lanita is a college graduate specializing in early childhood education, with a speech and drama minor. She has taught kindergarten and fifth grade in public schools near Gainesville and conducted story hour

programs in Gainesville Public Library. In November, she and her husband, Reginald, who is an extension agent specializing in vegetables and ornamentals, moved to Sanford. Their home is on Park Avenue. Lanita was disappointed to learn that the Sanford Public Library has a rather limited selection of books for young children; she hopes the situation will improve after October when library members will be able to order books through the Sanford library from Orlando Public Library.

She was also saddened that her suggestion to hold the story hour in the Sanford Library met with little enthusiasm. "It makes so much more sense," Lanita explained, "after story hour, to be able to go right to the bookshelves and help the children make their selections."

Perhaps that'll change, she hopes. In the fall, Lanita will be teaching at the First Presbyterian Church's Pre-School Education and Development Center in Sanford. She also hopes someone will volunteer to continue the story hour in her stead. "The kids have so much fun. I hate to

think they'll be without story hour again," she said. Variety, Lanita explained, is the secret to a successful story hour. Variety not only in the books read, but also in the other activities interspersed among reading sessions.

A change of pace, the chance to shout and run for a few mon.ents is essential if pre-schoolers are going pay attention while she is reading. A favorite diversion, she unscovered, was to play the bear hunt game or have finger plays. Simple stretch and bend exercises also helped, she remarked.

The children in story hour definitely had favorite stories, she said, and probably top of the list was, 'Where the Wild Things Are,' written and illustrated by Maurice Sendak. "It was good and scary, but at the same time it didn't disturb the kids because they knew it was only a dream."

'William's Doll' by Charlotte Zolotow was another favorite, and Lanita was interested to note how readily the children accepted the idea of a boy wanting to play with a doll. 'Fish is Fish' by Leo Lionni, delightfully illustrated, was also rated highly by the children.

## Universities Facing Facts: Women Equal

WASHINGTON (AP) - Most university athletic departments, some reluctantly, began facing the reality today that women will have to have equal opportunity to participate in

Congress enacted Title IX of the Omnibus Education Act three years ago banning sex discrimination in schools receiving federal funds. But the regulations implementing the legislation did not become effective until Monday, after much wrangling in

The regulations prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex in 16,000 school districts and 2, 700 institutions of higher education

They apply to a wide variety of ed: cational areas such as recruitment, hiring, admissions and scholarships, but the section on athletics was the most controversial and brought the most

The National Collegiate Athletic Association and its member schools have claimed that no one is opposed to equal opportunity for women in sports but they believe it means "equal expenditures." The Department of Health, Education and Welfare, which wrote the guidelines, denies this.

Efforts to block the legislation were defeated in the House and Senate last week, but the NCAA says it will pursue passage of an amendment to the law which, in effect, would exempt moneyproducing sports such as football and basketball.

Under the amendment, money produced by football and basketball would first be spent on those sports and what remained could then be used for the rest of the athletic program. "We feel that this is not only a very desirable but necessary amendment," said Thomas Hanson, assistant NCAA executive director, by telephone from Kansas City.

He said the NCAA plans a convention in Chicago next month to see how economy moves can be made. "It is ironic that much of the saving we could expect in Chicago would be more than offset by Title IX," he said.

"We have to accept that it is law and do all we can do to comply within reason," he said. "The reason ends when you demand that football and basketball programs be matched."

In a survey of NCAA schools by The Associated Press, most athletic directors said their schools had already begun efforts to comply with the law, long before the Monday effective date of

At several schools, such as William & Mary and Northwestern, a survey of the students will be conducted to see what sports they are interested in, a proposal that was in the original HEW regulations but later discarded.
