Normally during the busy early summer months, the office averages 1, 000 applications per day, Since June 2 this year, the average has been 2,100 with very little decrease during the few days of war when even travel to Israel was prohibited. "They weren't allowed to go but they kept applying any-way." Callahan said. "And I eally don't know when this
