The Rush To Get To Israel

NEW YORK (AP) — When threats of war rumbled across the Sinai Desert last month and reverberated around the world, the reaction of many Americans was to help Israel. In money, in mind and often in person. Some said they would fight for Israel if the U.S. government would permit it. Some went there to work on collective farms and in factories to free Israeli men for battle. When the war ended, those who wanted to help were joined by those who simply wanted to see.

The result has been nearly six weeks of massive tangle in the State Department passport division, with one of every five passport applications being speculating trips to Israel and many other Arab nations where there is no ban on travel, especially Lebanon. "We're in a virtual state of siege," said Joseph R. Callahan, in charge of the New York City office where the brunt of passport applications were filed. Outside Callahan's office, hundreds of persons stood in lines hour after hour waiting to file their applications or pick up their passports. The influx has pushed what is normally the office's busiest time of year into the nightmare category. "I don't know if we've had some sort of record in applications," Callahan said, "but I don't remember anything like it in my career." Normally during the busy early summer months, the office averages 1,000 applications per day. Since June 2 of this year, the average has been 2,100 with very little decrease during the few days that the green travel to Israel was prohibited. "They weren't allowed to go but they kept applying anyway," Callahan said. "And I really don't know what this might signify."

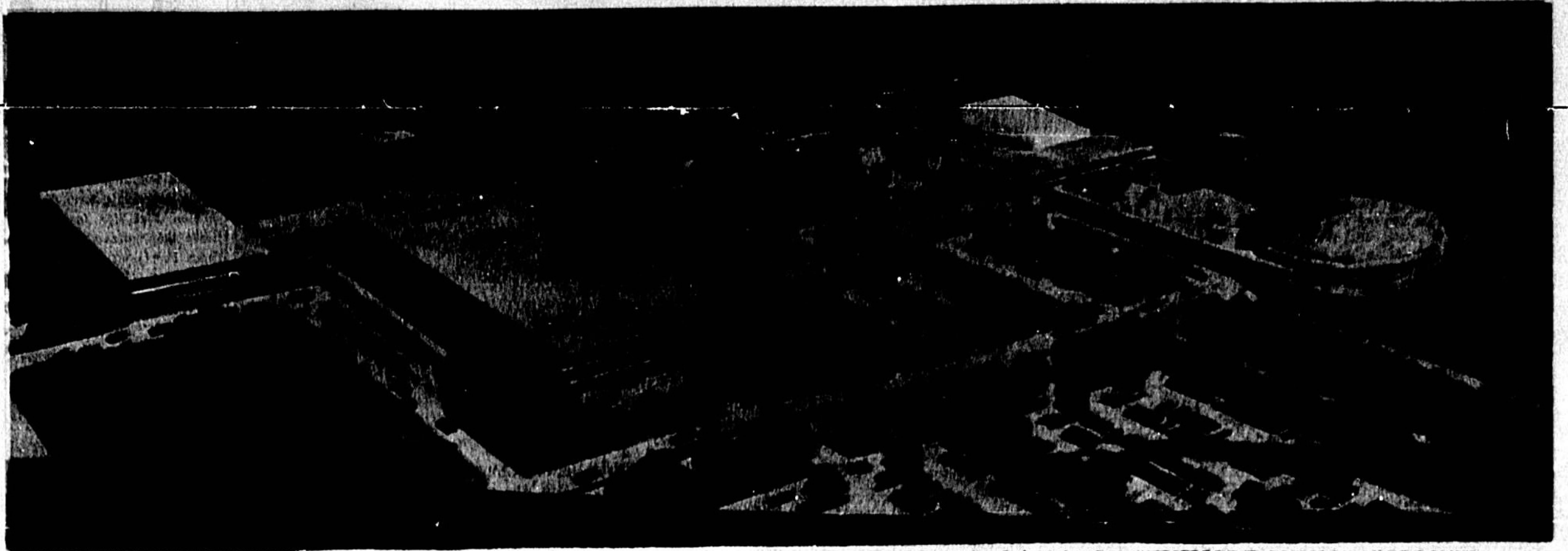

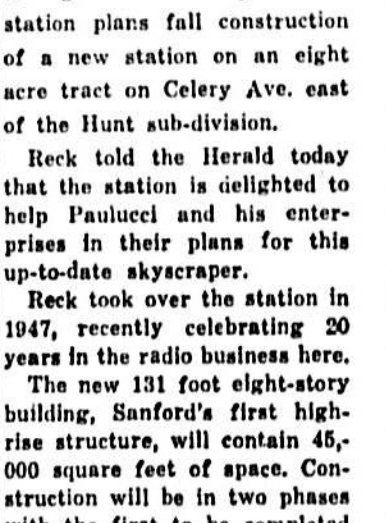

Price Estimated At \$50,000 WTRR Property Sold

Sanford industrialist Jeno Paulucci has purchased Radio Station WTRR property paying the way for an eight story skyscraper at Seminole Blvd. and Meltonville. Purchase price could not be disclosed until the sale is finalized but is "around \$50,000" according to owner Myron Reck.



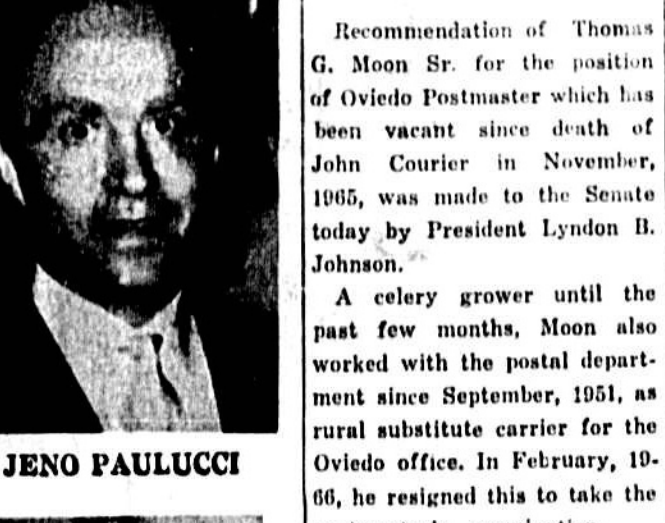

At the same time, Station manager Bill Reck reported the station plans full construction of a new station on an eight acre tract on Cleary Ave. east of the Hunt subdivision. Reck told the Herald today that the station is delighted to help Paulucci and his enterprises in their plans for this up-to-date skyscraper. Reck took over the station in 1947, recently celebrating 20 years in the radio business here. The new 131 foot eight-story building, Sanford's first high-rise structure, will contain 45,000 square feet of space. Construction will be in two phases with the first to be completed within two years.

This phase will include 16,000 square feet of office space on levels three, four and five. Seventy per cent of the ground floor level will be devoted to parking area and first level will have a reception area and lobby along with provisions for vehicular and pedestrian egress beneath the surface. Design, as done by Architect Eoghan Kelley, places emphasis on verticality, both in esthetic and functional design consideration.

The study will include airport uses when the Sanford Naval Air station is phased out as well as industrial uses. EDA officials will pick one of three engineering firms recommended by Knowles to conduct the study. The three firms, according to EDA officials, are Howard Needles Tammen and Bergendoff; Maurice Connell and Associates; both in Miami and J. E. Grimes Co. of Tampa.

Salfi has been serving as attorney to the Republican members of the Seminole-Orange legislative delegation and represented Rep. E. Pope Bassett in Bassett's suit to gain the seat in the County Commission which he lost to Lawrence Swafford of Altamonte Springs by little more than 100 votes in 1964.

The Orlando attorney, in the firm of Fishback, Davis, Dominic and Troutman, is a graduate of North Miami High School and the University of Florida Law School. A native of Philadelphia, Pa., Salfi moved to Florida in 1952, is married and the father of three children, a son and two daughters. He is a member of the Seminole County Republican Executive Committee, the Maitland Jaycees and the Catholic Church of the Nativity. The post he now holds as state attorney in the circuit which comprises Seminole and Brevard Counties will be up for election in November, 1968, and indications are Salfi will then seek election to the position.

Junior High Design Gets Board Okay

A wholly new concept in school design for the new Sanford Junior High School using bold futuristic triangular shapes featuring triangular shaped classrooms received the approval of the School Board Thursday afternoon. John Burton IV, architect on the project, was given the "go" sign from the board to proceed with plans for the school. First phase construction of the school is estimated to cost \$543,501 and work is expected to begin in early October on the plant to be located on a 20 acre site. "I will have to see what results of today's legislative action is before we can determine what our future direction will be. If the veto is sustained by the Legislature the funds will have to come from somewhere; I absolutely deplore the idea of any raise in student fees, but this may be the only action open to us," Dr. Weldon stated. In his veto message to the House, Kirk said appropriations for the junior colleges were \$4.9 million, an increase of \$1.9 million or 37.6 per cent more than estimated expenditures during the current biennium. He said the proposed supplemental appropriations would cause an additional one per cent cutback in appropriations which already have been reduced three per cent by the Cabinet Budget Commission. The governor insisted a bill providing \$11 million in supplemental appropriations would be reported. Work sessions to begin work on the budget were set for 7:30 p.m. next Thursday.

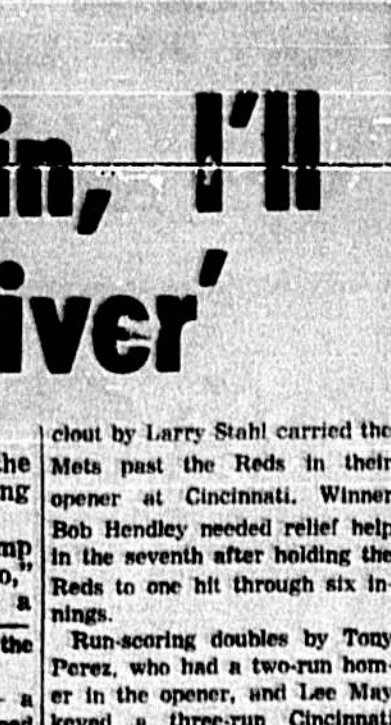

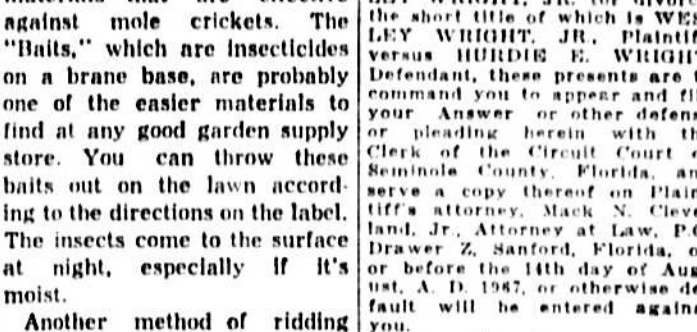

With enactment of two new sales and use taxes so far this year, 41 states and the District of Columbia now levy these revenue producers.

Nebraska's 2 1/2 per cent tax became effective June 1. Minnesota will begin imposing a 3 1/2 per cent tax to replace the earlier 2 1/4 per cent sales tax.

Nebraska has levied both a corporate and personal income tax, effective for income earned or received after Jan. 1, 1967, with rates to be set annually by the State Board of Equalization and Assessment.

Corporate income taxes have been boosted in three states—Maryland from 5 per cent to 8 1/2 per cent, in Montana from 5 1/2 per cent to 5 1/4 per cent, and in Tennessee from 4 per cent to 5 per cent.

Minnesota has hiked the basic income tax rates on corporations from 7 1/2 per cent to 9 1/2 per cent, and on banks from 9 1/2 per cent to 10 1/2 per cent. North Dakota also boosted the tax on banks from 4 per cent to 5 per cent.
