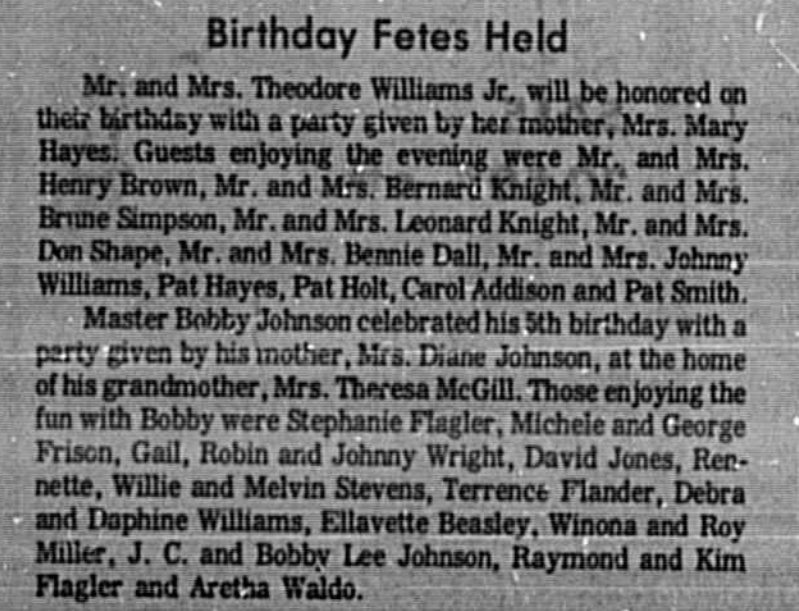

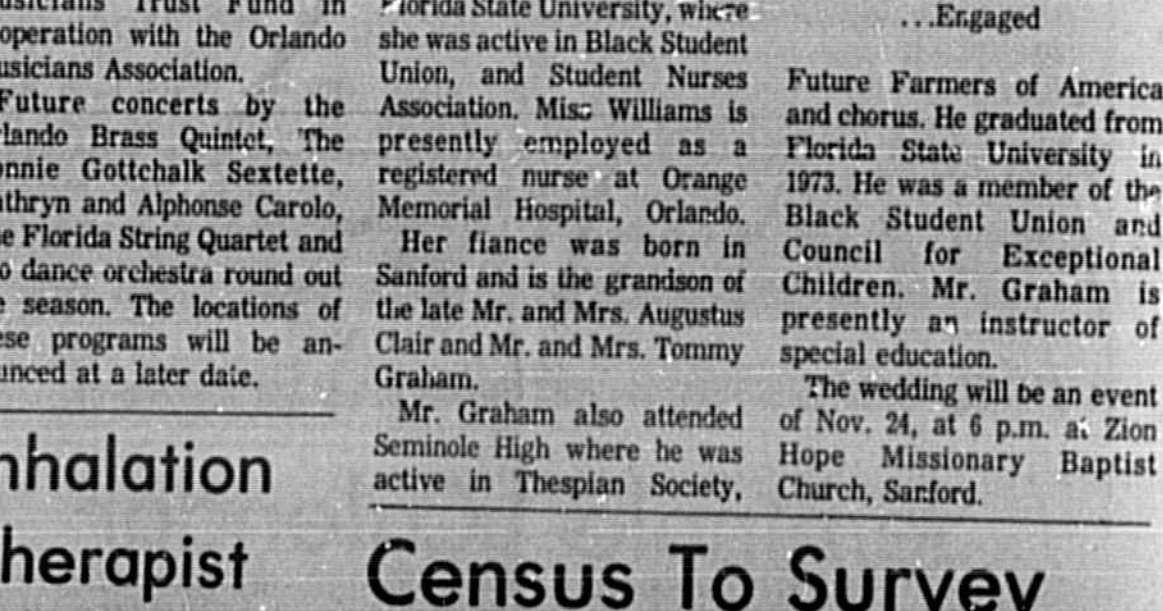

Israeli Planes Hit Egypt Bases

Israeli warplanes attacked Egyptian air bases 27 miles north of Cairo today and hit at Egyptian and Syrian forces on the two battlefronts in the

fourth Arab-Israeli war, the Israeli command reported. But there was no report of a resumption of the ground fighting as the war went into its fifth day. The Israelis said their pilots

reported "accurate hits" in raids on air bases at Khamsa and Abu Hammat, west of Ismailia in the Nile Delta, and on a radar station on the Mediterranean coast 60 miles east of Alexandria.

Israeli spokesman said Israeli planes also flew missions in support of the ground forces facing the Syrians on the Golan Heights and the Egyptians on the east bank of the Suez Canal.

Syria claimed its air force brought down one Israeli Mirage jet in a dogfight over the Heights, and its anti-aircraft gunners blew up an Israeli Skyhawk. But Israel said Tuesday night

was "generally quiet" on both fronts. Egypt and Syria said Tuesday that they had beaten back repeated Israeli attacks and were poised for new advances. An Israeli spokesman

admitted Tuesday night that Israeli's counteroffensive had stalled in both the Sinai Desert and the Golan Heights. Unconfirmed reports said Israeli armor was taking up positions in Lebanon.

Halloween

Cookies Are Fun

By CECILY BROWNSTONE Associated Press Food Editor If you are planning to bake cookies for a youngster's Halloween party, or to give to neighborhood doorbell ringers as a treat, you might like to use the following recipe.

We chose this recipe because it is made with peanut butter, a flavor that children favor, and because although these cookies are thin, they are not fragile. A friend who lives in the country took some home for her two sons and reported that even the broomstick shapes, with their thin handles, arrived without a crack.

To shape the cookies we borrowed a set of Halloween cutters from another friend. These come five to a box in bat, owl, cat, pumpkin and the broomstick shape. Our friend tells us she bought the cutters in a variety of hardware store — she can't remember which! The bat shape is 2 inches high and 4 inches wide. The owl is 3 inches high and 1 1/2 inches wide. The cat is 2 1/2 inches high and 2 1/2 inches wide. The broomstick is 5 1/2 inches high and 1 1/2 inches wide. When we say "high" and "wide" we mean of course at the highest and widest points. With these cutters we managed to achieve 18 bats, 20 owls, 19 cats, 27 pumpkins and 10 broomsticks — over 8 dozen cookies in all.

The reason we give you these details is that if you haven't set of Halloween cutters or can't acquire one, you may want to cut the shapes out of cardboard, flour them and cut around them on the cookie dough.

HALLOWEEN COOKIES
3 cups flour, stir to aerate before measuring
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/4 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon clove
1 teaspoon ginger
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup creamy peanut butter
2-3/4 cup sugar
1 egg
1/2 cup molasses

On wax paper thoroughly stir together flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, cloves, ginger and cinnamon. In a large mixing bowl cream butter, peanut butter and sugar. Add egg and molasses and beat until blended. Add flour mixture and beat until blended. Chill dough, covered, until firm enough to roll — about 1 hour. Dough may be chilled longer; it keeps for weeks in the refrigerator.

Cut dough into fourths and work with 1/4 at a time, keeping remaining portions in the refrigerator.

On a floured pastry cloth, with a floured stockin-covered rolling pin, roll out one portion of the dough as thin as possible — about 1/16-inch thick. With floured cutters, cut into desired shapes. Place 1/2-inch apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven until lightly browned around the edges — 6 to 7 minutes. Yield will depend on the size of the cutters used.

2 tablespoons fine dry bread crumbs
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
Thinly sliced Swiss cheese
With toothpicks, skewer the chop tails against the meatier parts. Stir together flour, salt and pepper; coat chops with mixture; dip in 2 tablespoons of the egg, then in bread crumbs. The rest of the egg may be refrigerated and used next day in scrambled eggs. In a large skillet in the hot butter over moderate heat, brown chops — about 10 minutes on each side. Cover and cook gently until tender — 20 to 30 minutes. Cover chops with a layer of cheese; broil until cheese melts. This may be less than you think if high heat is used and chops are close to source of heat. Remove toothpicks. Makes 2 servings.

MARLBLED PEANUT BUTTER BROWNIES
23rds cup unsifted flour, stir to aerate before measuring
1/4 teaspoon baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup creamy peanut butter
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1 cup firmly packed light-brown sugar
2 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla
3 squares (each 1 ounce) semi-sweet chocolate
Grease bottom and sides of a square cake pan (7 by 8 by 2 inches).
In a medium bowl of electric mixer beat together peanut butter and butter. Gradually beat in brown sugar. Add eggs and vanilla; beat until blended. Stir in flour mixture. Turn into prepared pan; spread evenly with spatula.
In a small saucepan over very low heat melt chocolate, stirring constantly. Drizzle melted chocolate from tip of spoon over top of batter. With a knife, swirl chocolate deep into batter to give a marbled effect.
Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven until a cake tester inserted in center comes out clean—30 minutes. Cool in pan on wire rack. Cut into squares. Store in tightly covered tin box.
NOTE: One-half cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces may be substituted for the semi-sweet chocolate squares. The pieces do not set up as well as the squares; if necessary, refrigerate the cooled brownies long enough to set the chocolate.

CHECKING THE REFRIGERATOR
Too often food flavor is lost or food spoils because a refrigerator, freezer or freezer compartment is not working properly or the temperature is set too high (too warm). Using a good thermometer, check your refrigerator periodically. The temperature should be constantly below 40 degrees to hold foods properly and to avoid the risk of harmful bacterial growth. The freezer cabinet should be maintained at 0 degrees or below. If it cannot hold this temperature then do not store frozen foods in it for more than three to five days.

LUNCHEON TREATS FOR YOUNGSTERS... Marbled Peanut Butter Brownies

Dessert For Kids' School
Thousands of youngsters still take their lunch to school in spite of the fact that the school room meal is frequently available in school lunchrooms. And one of the foods often included in both lunch boxes and lunchroom meals is peanut butter. That's because not only is peanut butter a favorite of children, but because mothers and school lunchroom supervisors know it offers important nutrients.

If you're the sort of mother who on occasion enjoys adding a special treat to a lunchbox, you'll be interested in this brand-new and delightful recipe for Marbled Peanut Butter Brownies. When we tried these bar cookies on our niece and nephew (eight and thirteen years old) they gobbled them up.

On wax paper, thoroughly stir together the flour, baking powder and salt.
In medium bowl of electric mixer (using the peanut butter and butter. Gradually beat in brown sugar. Add eggs and vanilla; beat until blended. Stir in flour mixture. Press into prepared pan; spread evenly with spatula.
In a small saucepan over very low heat melt chocolate, stirring constantly. Drizzle melted chocolate from tip of spoon over top of batter. With a knife, swirl chocolate deep into batter to give a marbled effect.
Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven until a cake tester inserted in center comes out clean—30 minutes. Cool in pan on wire rack. Cut into squares. Store in tightly covered tin box.

NOTE: One-half cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces may be substituted for the semi-sweet chocolate squares. The pieces do not set up as firmly as the squares; if necessary, refrigerate the cooled brownies long enough to set the chocolate.

2 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons flour
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup cream
1/2 cup chicken broth
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese

2 tablespoons sherry

Sam Snow Tells How To Clean Up At Races

Sam Snow, a man who claims to regularly clean up at the races, says he has a "no-fancy, slide-rule system" for this 53-year-old gent. Snow, you see, is a contractor janitor for Dei Mar Race Track.

In addition to the obvious cleanup chores he performs when he works among the janitors during a 4 a.m.-to-11 a.m. shift, Snow has a sideline he'd prefer to keep a secret.

It concerns the retrieving of perfectly good mutual tickets which are discarded during a hectic day at the track.

The state estimates more than \$1 million in winning tickets go uncashed each year. The money reverts to a special state fund if the tickets are not found or cashed within 60 days after each racing meeting.

And Sam Snow (a well-used alias) says he collects his share of these winnings "nobody wants."

How does he do it? Let Sam tell the story.

"First, you have to get on the cleanup crew," says Sam. "If you aren't one of the 27 regulars on the 4-to-11 shift, you get to the track around 3:30 every morning and wait to see if you can sub for someone who doesn't show."

"Then, you come prepared. Either you memorize the winning numbers from the last day's races or you can write them on your shirt or pant cuffs so you can see them at the same time you sweep the tickets up."

"The big thing nowadays is not to let a supervisor see you taking time to pick up a ticket or check a number. They come down on you for that action."

"So you try to smooth it out, you understand? Do it all in one big motion. Like you just are cleaning up."

"Too many professional stoopers," he says.

A stooper is a person who goes around the track "stooping," looking for tickets. The practice is illegal but hardened pros have the art refined and few people can tell they are doing it.

Meet Ed Scoville, the Dei Mar plant supervisor who heads a near-100-man cleanup, janitorial and maintenance operation. From his grandstand office, he also gets an occasional glimpse of professional stoopers.

"We had a new stooper here recently," says Scoville. "He'd just use a flick of his shoe to turn over a pile of freshly discarded mutual tickets and they'd turn right side up as if he'd just stepped out a deck of cards. He had the art down pat."

Scoville would rather talk about his building cleanup operation which begins unfolding early in the morning when horses and bettors are sound asleep. That's when a small army of men and machines sweep the racetrack grounds, hauling away 15 tons of trash a day and, in the stable area, 100 tons of manure.

The huge race-track lighting system, which never is turned off, burns all night for the operation. "It's a massive job," says Scoville.

Federal Funds Halt Advised By Buchanan

WASHINGTON—In his recent testimony before the Senate Watergate Committee, Patrick J. Buchanan, speech writer and special consultant to President Nixon, acknowledged advising the President to block federal funds from going to tax-exempt foundations that were supporting groups whose activities did not support the Nixon administration.

Buchanan, discussing a March, 1970, memo to Mr. Nixon, told the committee that the Ford Foundation, for example, uses tax-exempt dollars to support the Brookings Institution, which, he said, is a "government in exile for the Democratic Party."

He suggested to Mr. Nixon that in those instances where the federal government has discretion in the awarding of federal funds to foundations, such money should go to conservative groups.

Buchanan said it would be "a policy of favoritism in all future federal grants to those institutions friendly to us... and we should direct future funds away from the hostile foundations, like Brookings."

And after the 1972 presidential campaign, Buchanan said, he further proposed that, under White House

guidance, a conservative foundation be created, "that we ought to establish our own institutions."

Later, under cross-examination by Sen. Herman Talmadge, D-Ga., Buchanan conceded two points:

1. If a foundation—liberal or conservative—is educational, he has no objection to its tax-exempt status;

2. Institutions that study public policy issues should not participate actively in politics, and the Brookings Institution does not engage in politics.

What has rankled Buchanan since he went to work in the White House in 1969 is that so many of the foundations seem to be underwriting studies, projects, seminars, public television programs and other public policy forums that appear to promote liberal or progressive government action at odds with the Nixon administration's themes and programs.

Old Cars Returning

The old saying, "Gold is where you find it," doesn't necessarily have to refer to that shiny metal.

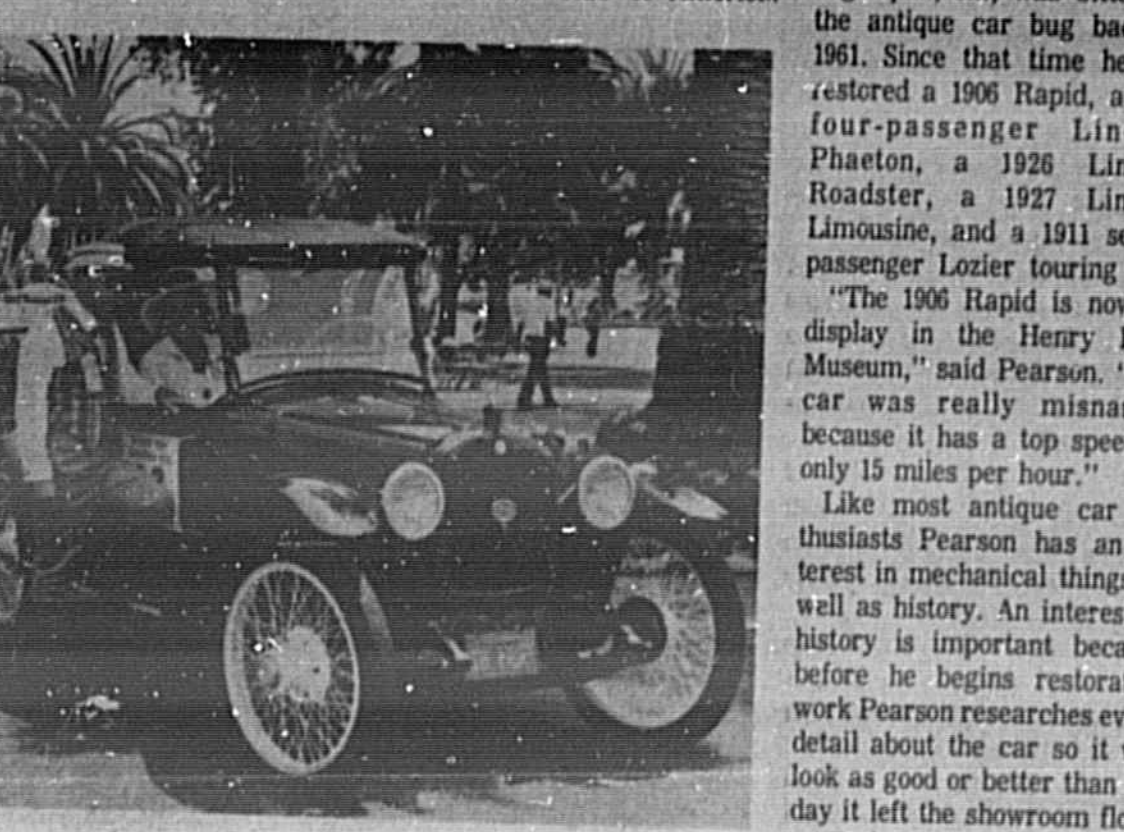
If you have any doubts, just talk to an antique car buff and you'll learn that "gold" could be found in any old garage, barn or junkyard from Bangor, Maine, to Temecula, Calif.

"Some people still go out and beat the bushes, checking out farms, small towns and other places where antique cars might be found," said Ken Pearson, an antique car buff of the first order.

"But today it's getting harder and harder to find them through this method," he said in an interview.

"Today, people interested in owning and/or restoring an old car will usually get it through trading or dealing with members of antique car clubs.

Pearson, who is part owner of a tool and engineering firm in Algonquin, Ill., was bitten by the antique car bug back in 1961. Since that time he has restored a 1906 Rapid, a 1923 four-passenger Lincoln Phaeton, a 1928 Lincoln Roadster, a 1927 Lincoln Limousine, and a 1911 seven-passenger Lozier touring car.

"The 1906 Rapid is now on display in the Henry Ford Museum," said Pearson. "The car was really magnificent because it has a top speed of only 15 miles per hour."

Like most antique car enthusiasts Pearson has an interest in mechanical things as well as history. An interest in history is important because before he begins restoration work Pearson researches every detail about the car so it will look as good or better than the day it left the showroom floor.

"To be a member of an antique car club you are required to have an antique car which has been restored so it is historically correct in every detail," said Pearson. "The last project was the Lozier which he completed in 1970 after two years of work."

"Restoring a car is pretty costly," he said. "For this reason, I do as much of the work myself as I can."

Most antique car owners reluctantly admit that their vehicles are worth a great deal of money.

This aspect, they say, takes a rumble seat to pride of ownership and the enjoyment they get out of restoring, driving and displaying their cars which can best be described as mechanized labors of love.

In 1911, Pearson's Lozier was valued at \$5,000. He wouldn't estimate how much it was worth now that it was restored but he did say it cost him \$2,000 to buy it. Pearson's Lozier recently won the Best Restoration in the Nation Award from the AACA.

"Antique car prices are going up as restoring them becomes more popular," he said. "I paid \$1,000 for my '28 Lincoln Roadster which was in really bad shape but I've seen some in worse shape lately selling for \$2,000."

According to Pearson finding parts for some cars can be rather difficult.

"For rare cars you may have to make your own or alter parts from other vehicles," he said. "But you can buy new parts for Model As and Ts. There are even a number of tire manufacturers who make tires exclusively for antique cars."

Pearson's wife, Louise, isn't left out of the fun. She helps with the polishing of the cars and when she and Pearson take one of them on an antique car driving tour she does all the navigating.

There's a real camaraderie between antique car owners. A perfect example is M.J. "Shelley" Shelton's 1918 Hupmobile. Shelton's son located the car for his father upon hearing it was for sale.

"Shelton, who lives in El Cajon, Calif., edits the "Footwarmer" newsletter for San Diego County antique car buffs.

"I had the Hup for awhile but work on it was going real slow," said Shelton in an interview.

"I told some friends that there wouldn't be any more editions of the 'Footwarmer' until after I got the Hup ready in time for the Golden Antique Car Tour of California."

"Well, the next weekend all the members of our local antique car club showed up at the house and within two hours had the entire car apart."

Shelton is doubly proud of his Hupmobile because it is the first car he had ever completely restored although he has done work on two others: a 1924 Standard Six Buick Sedan and a 1947 Mercury Sedan.

"The Hupmobile came with a lot of spare parts and luckily we were able to get original replacement parts for such things as the locks and head gaskets even though the car is 55 years old," said Shelton. "Even the original light bulbs still work."

Shelton says the car has nine coats of hand-rubbed paint and the only concession to progress he made while working on it was replacing the weathered canvas top with a vinyl plastic one.

How does it run? "Just like new," said Shelton. "She'll do 30 to 35 m.p.h."
