



New Disorders

The attempted assassinations of Pierre Laval and Marcel Deat reveal to what extent Hitler's New Order in Europe is succeeding "even in those conquered nations where all opposition is suppressed in the most ruthless manner which brutal and cunning men can devise. Nowhere is Nazi domination being accepted lying down, but everywhere there is unrest, discontent, sabotage and dangerous acts of violence.

Despite wholesale arrests, and numerous executions, German officers have been killed, automobiles have been wrecked, trains derailed, bridges blown, factories dynamit-ed and many similar protests filed. Not only in occupied France is this so but from Norway to Turkey, in every European nation which the Germans have overrun, and in those like Poland and Czechoslovakia, where news is searce, more than any is there the most viscous opposition to German policies.

As a consequence the Nazi high command is calling for additional volunteers for its armed forces. It is not on the fighting fronts that the Germans need more men, but in the occupied examples where within an edition hand. Buys of 17 and "old men" of 45 and 60 are being called to the colors for the purpose of helping suppress these peoples who, now that they have lost it, realize what a priceless possession liberty really is.

The Germans, great fighters though they may be, have he knack for government. They can rulin but they cannot rule. The only way they know to maintain order is to threaten with the guillotine, or to use it. Everywhere they have sent their armies, they have had to detail as permanent parts of the local governmental machinery their firing squaits and their gestapo agents. 
