Permits Issued Thus Far In Month Of May Total \$14,450

A decrease in the estimated value of building application at the City Hall for the first 15 days of May as compared with the corresponding period in April is indicated by the fact that May applications to date total \$14,450 in value, whereas between April 1 and 15 the estimated value of permits issued was \$81,650.

Local building contractors and materials supply men yesterday attributed the building slump to shortage of materials caused by two factors: strikes and resulting limitation of transportation as in the coal strike, and to complicated OPA restrictions and regulations.

Coming Events

Assuming that this county does not become involved in another world war, or tear itself apart in labor-management disputes, Florida is on the threshold of the greatest period of progress and development in its entire history.

Speaking at the Sugarland plantation near Clewiston the other day, Clarence Biffing revealed that his company alone had just harvested over a million tons of sugar, cane, the greatest in Everglades history.

In other fields, too, Florida is just beginning to make a name for itself. During the next ten years oil is likely to do for this state what it did a generation ago for Oklahoma, Texas and California.

And due to the oil industry and the proximity of cheap fuel, the industrial development of this state will be greatly facilitated. Fuel has always been a great handicap in the location of factories in this state.

Of course, tourists who have long been the backbone of Florida will continue to be one of this state's greatest assets. In fact, its greatest opportunities for tourist entertainment still lie ahead of it.

And so we say, that whatever may have been the peaks of Florida's great achievements in the past they will be dwarfed to insignificance by the events of the future.

China's War Record

Theodore Roosevelt had a favorite term of contempt for nations that he regarded as weak and worthless. He called them "Chinified." But all in all, the Chinese have surely done their share of fighting in the long course of human history.

It need not be expected, however, that our western nations will achieve such a distinction in the matter of military duration. For modern weapons and methods of human destruction improve so rapidly that, with the present rate of progress toward general destruction—both military and human—the race may not last very long.

Ivanhoe in Movies

Roman London Relics Sought In Blitz Area

LONDON — While Lords and Commons debate the re-building of war-ravaged Britain, take a socialist state, workmen are busy in the Palace of Westminster re-building the bomb-scarred building, which was damaged by Hitler's raiders on 12 occasions between September 11, 1940 and May 10, 1941.

On the latter date the House of Commons was completely destroyed, and now work is underway on foundations for the new House. It is expected that the work will be started on the superstructure later this year and will take at least three years, at an estimated cost of \$4,000,000.

With enlarged accommodations, the new building will in many respects follow the lines of the chamber in which the Commons had held their debates since 1852, for during a paper salvage drive in December, 1941, Charles Marshall, the architect who died last year, found the original drawings of Sir Charles Barry, which Marshall had as a student and tucked away in canvas bags in his lumber room.

Lord's Chamber III, Too On the same night that the Commons chamber was gutted, a high-explosive bomb went through the roof and floor of the House of Lords—but failed to explode. Very little damage was done—even the red leather benches were hardly marred.

At present the Commons are using the Lords' chamber, while the members of the Upper House conduct their affairs in the King's Robing Room. Outside the Houses of Parliament, only superficial damage is visible to the ordinary observer. The Victoria Tower, largest and highest square tower in the world, has its lower part swathed in tubular scaffolding. This, however, is for normal maintenance work on the structure, which before the war was covered with scaffolding to the top of its 336 feet pinnacles when many stones in the fine facade were found to be cracked and had to be replaced.
