

Ted Kluszewski's Powerful Hitting Asses To Redlegs

CINCINNATI (AP)—If Ted Kluszewski isn't the greatest power hitter the Cincinnati Redlegs have ever had, name a better one.

Already leading the major leagues in home runs with 44, mighty Theodore yesterday also took over the pace in the run-batted-in department in the National League with 119. His nearest competitor in that category is Stan Musial had held the RBI lead most of the season.

Kluszewski is batting .330 which makes him the fifth most effective hitter in the senior loop and about seventh in the majors.

With 13 homers in August and three so far this month, two of them yesterday, Kluszewski's argument for the Cincinnati fan's hottest thing in either league. He has hit safely in 18 straight games and at his present rate seems a sure thing to top the National home run title.

Kluszewski is within nine RBIs of the all-time Cincinnati season record set by Frank McCormick in 1929.

Well Trained Dog Helps Bag Game, Gives Enjoyment

Hunting as a recreation is gaining more followers every year, and a good dog as an aid in the sport not only means a fuller game bag, but a lot more fun, says Harry Miller, director of the Gaines Dog Research Center, New York.

If you are about to join the group who find hunting an absorbing hobby, choose the dog that best suits the facilities you have for keeping a dog and for hunting the kind of game most prevalent in your area.

If the best opportunities in your area are for rabbit hunting, then a Beagle, or Basset Hound, will probably be your choice. For small or pheasant hunting, one of the pointing breeds, or a spaniel is desirable. In coastal or lake sections where duck hunting is the most available sport, one of the retrievers, a Labrador, Chesapeake Bay or Golden, is preferable.

A Beagle or spaniel can be kept in a small back yard, as long as he is exercised regularly. You



need more spacious quarters for a retriever or other big dogs like the pointers and setters.

Just because the pup you get is one of the sporting breeds doesn't mean that he will be the perfect hunter, warns Mr. Miller. Look for a pup whose parents and grandparents have been good hunters. Look for their field records if they have been entered in field trials, not at the records of the ancestors four or five generations back. Strains that have long been bred for beauty alone rarely retain their hunting ability.

Even with a strong, inborn hunting instinct, all good hunting dogs must have the benefit of training to be useful in the field. There are professional trainers for all the various hunting breeds, and training may take anywhere from three to six months or more. No dog is ready for training until he is at least seven months old, and meanwhile you can decide whether you want to try to train your pup yourself, adds Mr. Miller. This can be done by following one of the many good books on the subject and having the facilities, such as available game and time, for training.

You can also buy a dog already trained, or partially trained. A trained dog costs far more than a pup, of course, but in any case, don't expect to buy a good dog cheap.

Texas Girl, 24, Badly Injured When Gored By Bull In Arena

CIUDAD ACUNA, Mex. (AP)—Patricia McCormick, a Texas girl who quit college to fight bulls, was lacerated on the horns of a charge, 1,250-pound black bull yesterday when she turned her back on him in a crowd of cheering fans.

The plucky, 24-year-old blonde lay in serious condition today in a hospital at Del Rio, Tex., across the Rio Grande from here. She had a deep laceration in the groin and had received surgery and three blood transfusions. Doctors said only that she was "holding her own."

Fat was gored fighting the second bull of the afternoon here. She killed the first with such skill she was awarded its ears and tail. Her manager, Joe Blair, called the first fight the best of her 3-year career.

"She had lots of confidence in her second fight," Blair said. "He gave this account:

They call it the 'fire' when the bull, after being fought for some time makes a pass, which around steps and starts at the bullfighter. The bull usually stands there a while, and it is customary at this point for the matador to turn his back on the bull, strut and take bows.

McCormick turned her back to face the charging crowd. But this bull charged, horns low, and beat her around and started to turn and defeat her with her red cape. The bull lumbered on a couple feet from behind and lifted her high in the air. She was stuck and couldn't move.

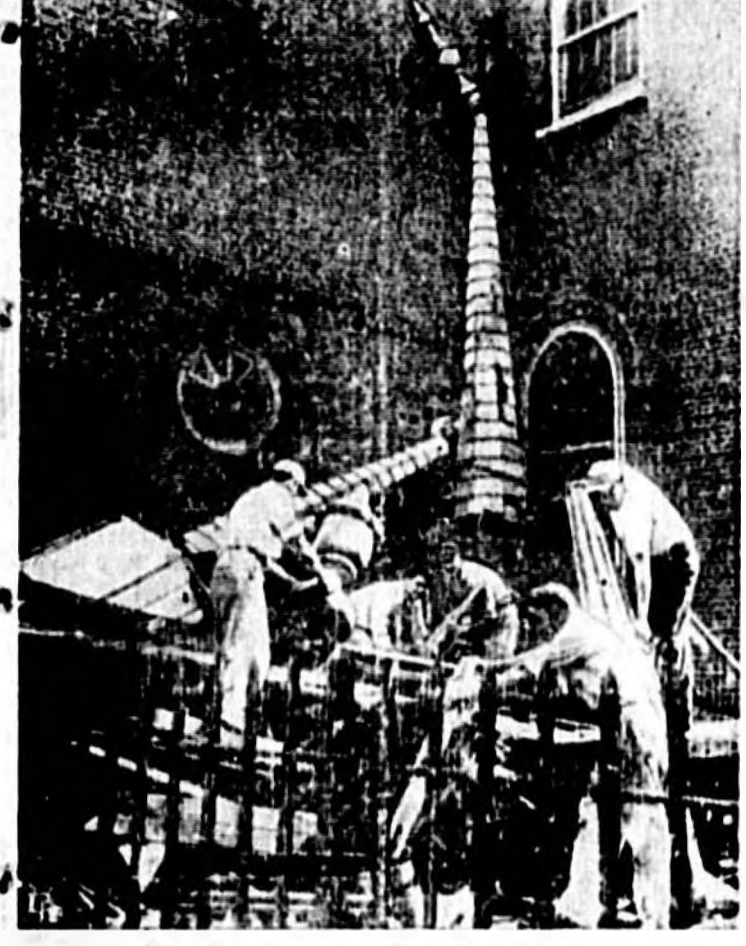

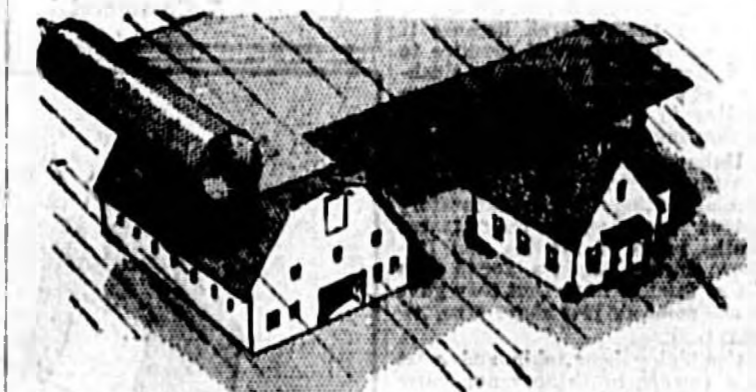

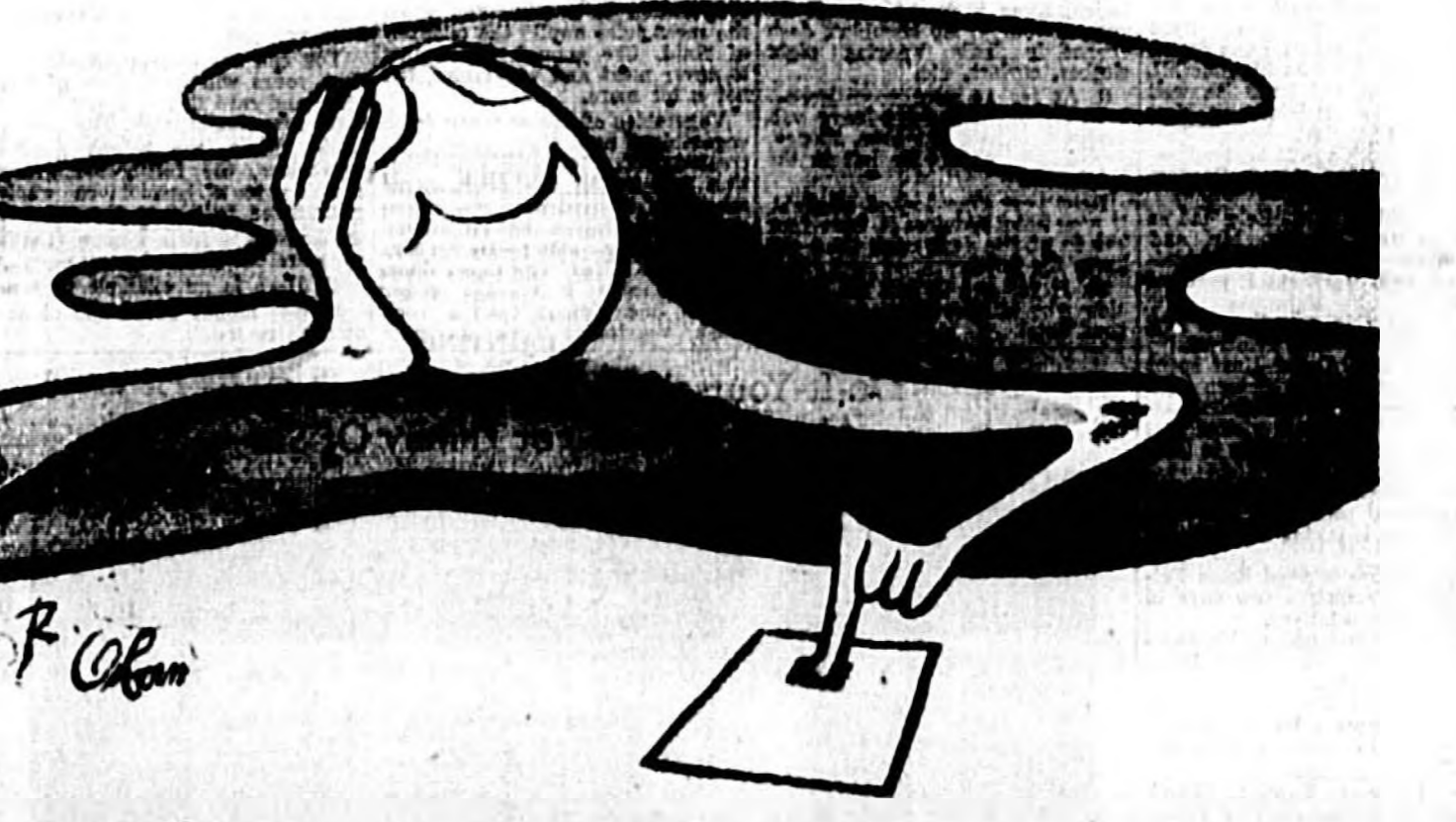
