Gives Enjoyment Hunting as a recreation is gaining more followers every year, and a good dog as an aid in the aport not only means a fuller game bar, but a lot more fun, says Heryry Miller, director of the Gaines Dog Research Center, New York.

If you are about to join the group who find hunting an absorbing hobby, choose the dog that heat suits the facilities you have for keeping a dog and for hunting the kind of game most prevalent In your area.


