Last year there were more automobile accidents than ever before in the history of this country. This fact is largely attributed to the nation's greater defense efforts. the great rush to get the wheels of armament industries turning, the frightful congestion around newly constructed camp areas, and the generally increased use of the highways by motorists. Altogether more than 40,000 persons perished in highway accidents while over 100,000 met death from all accidental causes.

The traffic toll was over 16 percent higher than it was in 1940 when 84,501 persons died on the highways, and over 350 deaths higher than the previous record of 1937 when 39,643 persons died. Other accidental death causes taking high rank included 18,000 workers killed in occupation accidents, 29,000 off-the-job mishaps, 32,000 killed in their own homes, and 14,500-public accidents, not Including traffic.




