Oviedo police investigating suspicious death

Oviedo police are investigating what they consider suspicious circumstances in the death of Marcos Rivera, 31, of East High Street.

Just after 6 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 10, Oviedo police along with Fire and Rescue personnel responded to a 911 call on East High Street regarding an individual who was not breathing. When no vital signs or indications of life were found, he was pronounced dead.

Earlier that same morning, at approximately 2:15 a.m., another 911 call had been made by family members, and Fire and Rescue responded to the same address, where another adult male member of the family had reported experiencing breathing problems. At that time, Rivera's 33 year old brother was transported to the emergency room at Florida Hospital East, where he was admitted.

Regarding Marcos Rivera, family members told officers he was observed multiple times between 3 a.m. and 5 a.m. that morning, and no difficulties were found. Officials say there was no obvious cause of death for Rivera and it has been determined that an autopsy will be performed.

Multiple members of that same family had moved to that address only recently.

Due to the investigation still in progress, no additional details were available from Oviedo Police.

McCoy named Orlando's top cop

SANFORD — Deputy Chief Mike McCoy, one of the men responsible for the turnaround at the Sanford Police Department, has been chosen for the top law enforcement job for the city of Orlando.

In an announcement over the weekend,

Glenda Hood chooses Sanford officer to replace city's outgoing police chief

Orlando Mayor Glenda Hood said McCoy would replace outgoing police chief Jerry Demings, who was named Orange County's public safety director.

"It's obviously a sad day for Sanford," said Mayor Brady Lessard. "I hate to see McCoy go because he has done a heck of a job for the city. It was an opportunity he

couldn't pass up, though. We're proud of him."

McCoy was hired by Police Chief Brian Tooley shortly after Tooley took over the Sanford job in August 1999. Prior to Tooley's hiring, the Sanford department had a reputation tarnished by infighting, poor morale and citizen complaints. A national consul-

tant reported to the city commission that the SPD was "the most dysfunctional department" he had analyzed.

"In my first three weeks on the job in Sanford, we had 19 openings," McCoy recalled. "We advertised the positions and had five people show up to take the test."

Sanford's low pay, bad morale and a lack of professionalism were among a list of reasons officers in other law enforcement agencies cited for not considering the jobs in

Heathrow firm ranked No. 1 by Commission

SANFORD — County Commissioners ranked a local architectural firm with strong ties to Sanford as the top firm to design a conference center in the city's downtown.

Eleven firms submitted bids. Burke Bales & Mills was one of two firms to earn an A-plus from a five member evaluation panel. Commissioners voted 4-1 to rank Burke Bales & Mills as the top firm. VOA Associates Inc. — the other firm that received an A-plus — was rated as the No. 2 firm. The Scott Partnership received an A rating and was ranked third.

Though its offices are in the new Colonial Center in Heathrow, Burke Bales & Mills has a large presence in Sanford. Two of its principals, Bob Burke and Jerry Mills live in the city limits, and Mills serves as chairman of the city's Waterfront Steering Committee.

A third Sanford resident in the firm, Scott Singelsen, will be the project manager and currently volunteers as the chairman of the Historic Preservation Board. Mills is no longer on the board for 12 years.

"We have a very vested interest in this project," Mills said Tuesday morning after the rankings were announced. "We live and work in Sanford. This is not just a job, this is our home."

"This will be the largest project we work on during 2003," Burke said. "There's no doubt it will be the highlight of next year as far as our work schedule."

The firm assembled a team that includes Sanford-based CPH Engineering and Rabun, Hogan, Ota & Rasch, a conference center and hotel architectural firm in Atlanta. Rabun Hogan has extensive experience in designing conference centers across the nation.

Burke Bales & Mills teamed up with Rabun Hogan last fall to work on a combined hotel/conference center proposal the city of Sanford made to Seminole County. The county rejected that proposal because public money would be used to secure funding for the hotel component.

The firm was also the primary architect when PRA

Richie and Raisa O'Farrill have invented the perfect gift for the avid sports fanatic, who may also love birds.

For the past year, the Longwood couple have built birdhouses with a unique twist — decorative car tag roofs. For every sports team, they've created a birdhouse to match.

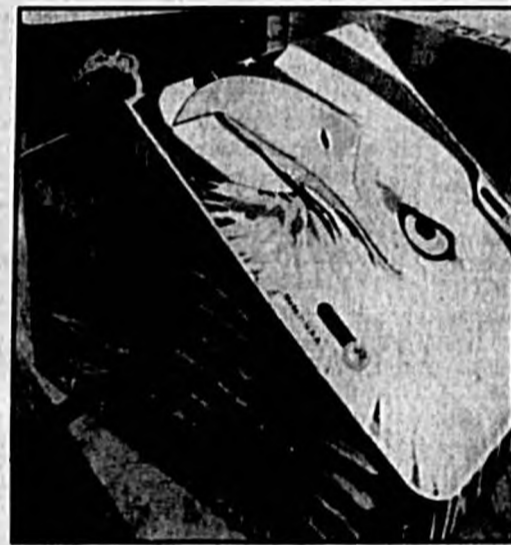
It wasn't the couple's love for sports, however, that gave them the idea for the birdhouses. It was the patriotic fervor that swept the nation following the events of Sept. 11 that inspired their outdoor creations.

"Before Sept. 11, we were already selling patriotic tags and American flags," Richie said. "But, after what happened, we wanted to do more. So, we started making patriotic birdhouses."

Richie makes the foundations for the houses from sturdy wood that will withstand the elements. Both Richie and Raisa decorate the outside of the houses depending on what tin tag is chosen for the roof.

The patriotic birdhouses became so popular, the couple decided to expand their inventory to include other themes.

"There's actually tags for everything," Richie said. "We've got tags that support our troops, there's the sports tags, and tags for your grandma or grandpa."

The Florida Gators birdhouse, for example, has the team's mascot painted on it with a tag roof that boasts allegiance to the team. It's the FSU birdhouses, however, that seems to be the most popular seller.

"We sell them as soon as we put them out," Raisa said.

The couple can make as many as 50 bird-

Chamber Hob Nob slated for Thursday

SANFORD — Primary day is less than a month away, and the Sanford Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring a Political Hob Nob designed to put the candidates in front of the voters.

Angelia Gordon, the chamber's director, said she organized the event so voters will be better informed when they go to the polls on Sept. 10.

"It's important for people to meet these candidates and find out where they stand on issues that are important to them," Gordon said. "Just about every candidate Seminole County residents can vote for will be there or have a representative to express their views."

"With everything that has gone on during the last year, it's also a good time to come together to celebrate our freedom."

Response has been good, Gordon said, not only from candidates but from the public as well.

"We've sold several hundred tickets and have a great group of sponsors," she said.

The event begins at 5 p.m. Thursday at the Sanford Civic Center. Candidates will first meet at City Hall and will arrive at the Civic Center by limousine beginning at 4:45 p.m. Each candidate will have five minutes to speak from the stage about their race. In addition, each will be provided a booth to hand out literature and meet residents.

The Hob Nob will also include a straw poll where each ticket holder will be provided with one ballot to vote for their favorite candidate.

"They'll get their ballot when the first arrive but we won't open the polls at the beginning," Gordon said. "We want people to have time to meet the candidates and make their decision."

Polls will close and 7:30 p.m. and results will be announced 15 minutes later.

Gordon said there will be plenty of entertainment during the night, including performances by the Seminole High School choir.

Music maestro plans Mozart Marathon

OVIEDO — Playing one of Mozart's sonatas isn't a daunting task for most well trained pianists. Playing all of them in less than five hours, however, isn't such an easy task.

Nevertheless, that's exactly what Rod Gorby, music director at Epiphany Lutheran Church, plans to do this Saturday during a "Mozart Marathon." The 25-year-old musician will play the Austrian composer's complete list of sonatas beginning at 2 p.m. in the Oviedo church.

"This is the first time I've played all of them in a row," Gorby said. "I like a challenge, and I saw this

as an opportunity to present myself with a challenge. Not only is there the athletic side — playing for more than four hours — but there's the musical challenge. I've got to keep the music interesting for four and a half hours."

Gorby began preparing for the marathon two months ago when he began memorizing 300 pages of

music. He plans to play everything from the heart and mind during Saturday's recital — no sheet music will be in front of him while he plays.

"It's just going to be me, the piano, Mozart and the audience," he said.

Gorby's love for the piano began more than 15 years ago as a case of sibling rivalry.

"I had to be better than my older brother," he said. "In enough time, I was. Now, I play for the pure love of it."

His studies began with the usual weekly piano lessons. He realized, however, he wanted to do more with music and began

Drowning Update

The mother is identified as Leah Keala Royals. The child's father, who was also home at the time, is identified as Brian Raymond Cliequennol. The investigation continues.

Florida Power and Oviedo reach new franchise agreement

Florida Power and the City of Oviedo have reached agreement on a new 30-year electric utility franchise. Florida Power has signed new franchise agreements with more than 45 cities and towns during the past six years, including 20 during 2001-02.

"We're pleased to have a new franchise with the City of Oviedo," said Billy Raley, vice president of Florida Power's North Central Region. "It's the result of both parties' hard work and includes many new provisions that benefit the City of Oviedo."

A "franchise" is an agreement between a municipality and Florida Power describing how the company will work within a city's public rights-of-way. The new franchise agreement provides Oviedo an option to purchase Florida Power's electric

distribution system at the end of the 30-year term. The agreement also authorizes Florida Power to collect and remit to the city six-percent of revenues, often referred to as a "franchise fee," which the city may use for a variety of purposes.

"The city and Florida Power recognize that the best course of action is to put the litigation behind us and move forward with what has historically been a very strong relationship," Raley said. "We have worked very hard to ensure our new agreement meets the needs of the city and our customers in Oviedo."

In February, Florida Power launched its Commitment to Excellence plan aimed at reducing rates, increasing customer satisfaction, improving operational performance, and better preparing the company for stability in the fast-changing ener-

gy industry. The company has since announced a \$500 million rate reduction decreasing customer bills nine percent, a \$100 million plan to improve reliability by 20 percent over the next three years, and a commitment to increasing generation reserve from 15 percent to 20 percent by 2003.

month. The latest saw its inauguration Friday, when Southeast Airlines launched regular flight service between Sanford and the Lehigh Valley International Airport near Allentown, Pennsylvania. A number of local dignitaries were on hand for the observance.

Sanford Airport President Larry Dale gave the inaugural address along with TBI Airport

management President Larry Gouldthorpe of Lehigh Valley International Airport.

Southeast said the aircraft to be used are 165-seat MD-80s.

Southeast Airlines will operate the service Thursday through Monday with two flights per day in each direction. One is a non-stop and the other stops briefly at the St. Petersburg-Clearwater International Airport.

Oviedo Fire and Rescue receives federal grant

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) have announced 389 fire departments will receive grants in the third round of awards under the Assistance to Firefighters Programs. Included on the list are eight fire departments from Florida.

The city of Oviedo Fire and Rescue is scheduled to receive \$67,500, the third highest amount given to any Florida depart-

ments.

While the majority of departments in the state receiving funds will be allocating them to the purchase of firefighting vehicles and operations and safety, Oviedo has listed its grant for fire prevention.

According to USFA Administrator R. David Paulison, "Our goal is to ensure every American community is protected by the most highly trained and best equipped firefighting force in the world. We are making a

significant investment in the nation's fire departments, an investment that builds upon strong local support that is critical from our local officials and the public."

More than 19,500 fire departments, volunteer as well as regular, applied for the grants this year. It is anticipated that 5,500 departments will receive awards before the end of the year, with 389 announced in this latest round of recipients.

Teague student receives Points of Light Award

Gov. Jeb Bush recognized Nadine Currie, a Teague Middle School student formerly from Goldsboro Elementary School, as a Points of Light Award recipient. The award recognizes exemplary volunteer and community service throughout the state.

In June 2001, 11-year-old Currie read an article in her local newspaper about the St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) needing athletic socks for an aquatic plant project to help clean Lake Apopka. The purpose for the socks would be to secure young

bulrush, a plant that helps filter pollutants, to the bottom of the lake. The socks would be filled with sand and tied to the bulrush creating a new permanent lake bottom.

Currie immediately wanted to help. She sent a letter to 10 different sock manufacturers in North Carolina explaining the SJRWMD's need for socks. After two months, she received a call from the Sara Lee Company, producer of Hanes socks, saying they were sending 6,000 pairs of athletic socks to the SJRWMD for the Lake Apopka project. The socks will be used not only at Lake Apopka, but also at Lake Jessup and other central Florida lake restoration programs. "My hope is to one day take my children fishing for bass at Lake Apopka," said Currie.

"The long-term benefit from

Nadine's efforts are cleaner, healthier lakes in central Florida," said Kirby Green, III, executive director of SJRWMD. "She is providing a long-term legacy to central Florida through her involvement in the restoration of Florida's lakes."

The Governor's Points of Light Award, sponsored by Royal Caribbean International and Celebrity Cruises, recognizes a Florida resident or organization that demonstrates exemplary service to the community. Award recipients are announced weekly.

A panel of judges comprised of leaders in the areas of volunteerism and service evaluate incoming nominations and make recommendations to the Governor. Volunteer Florida, a governor-appointed commission administers the award.

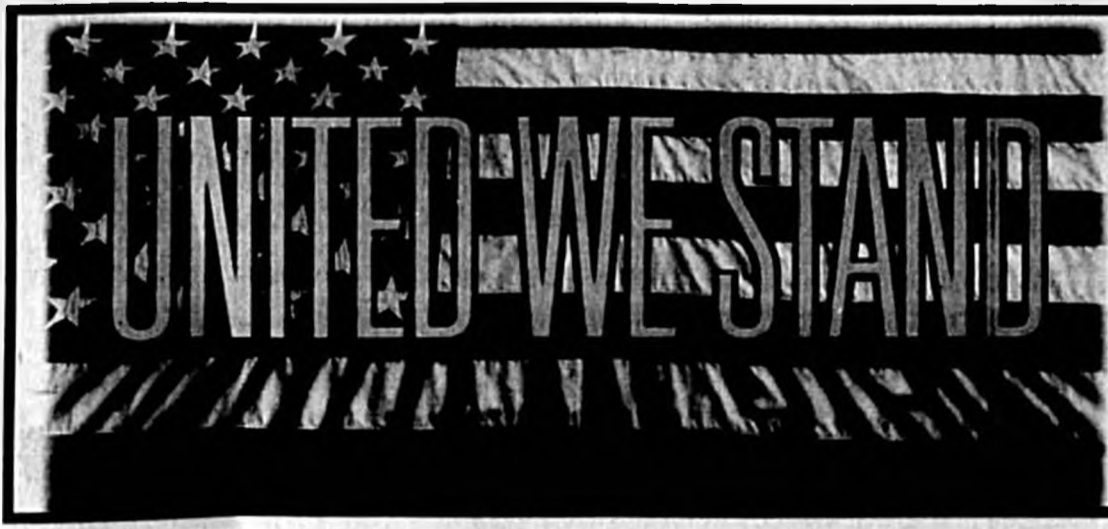

Sanford, McCoy said.

Three years later, Sanford's officers are among the top three in salary. In addition, innovated programs like take-home patrol cars and a mortgage incentives that pay officers to live in the city limits have increased the competitiveness when jobs come open within the department.

"Now when we have a position to fill, we get 20 or 30 people showing up for one or two spots," McCoy said.

Better pay and benefits aren't the only reasons for the turnaround, McCoy said. The department has created bike patrols and proactive crime prevention teams, as well as a community policing approach that has earned praise from residents. McCoy said support from the community and the city commission played a key role in improving the department.

"I have never been anywhere or heard of any community that throws a party on a Saturday afternoon solely for the benefit of police officers," McCoy said, referring to an event sponsored by the Sanford Historic Trust this spring. "To see those residents volunteer their time to cook hamburgers and lug coolers of ice for drinks is an amazing thing. It shows how much the community respects and appreciates our officers."

"You've got to give a lot of credit to the city commission, too," McCoy added. "Each commissioner was behind us 100 percent. They provided the things we needed and pushed us to improve."

Lessard got the news of McCoy's leaving in an early morning phone call Saturday.

"Mayor Hood called first thing in the morning and told me she wanted to hire Mike McCoy as Orlando's police chief," Lessard said. "To be honest, I had a feeling when she called. I knew she was either calling about Mike or Chief Tooley."

"I think it says volumes about how much the Sanford Police Department has improved," Lessard added. "You've got a major metropolitan city like Orlando hiring Sanford's No. 2 law enforcement person."

McCoy brings a wealth of experience to the police chief's position. He spent 24 years in the Orlando Police Department, including a tour as the SWAT commander and as second-in-command under two police chiefs.

"I came to the department at 18 years old," McCoy said. "They hired me as a full-time patrol officer when I turned 21. I was raised by the department in terms of my

Development, led by owner Joseph Pacitti, made the original bid to build a hotel/conference center in downtown.

"The third time is a charm," Burke said. "We did say that this has got to be our time because we tried twice before."

"To use a baseball analogy in an old baseball town: the first two pitches were strikes and we hit a home run on the third one," Mills added.

During Tuesday's county commission meeting, voting was done on an individual ballot for each ranking. Four commissioners ranked Burke Bales & Mills as the top firm. Commissioner

Carlton Henley voted for the Scott Partnership.

Should the county and Burke, Bales & Mills not be able to reach an agreement, the second company selected was VOA Associates Inc. Three of the commissioners — Daryl McLain, Grant Malloy and Dick Van der Weide — voted for VAOI. Commissioners Henley and Randy Morris voted for the Scott Partnership.

Should the second choice not accept the contract, the third choice, by a four to one vote, was the Scott Partnership.

If a contract can be negotiated and approved by the county commission, the firm will provide full architectural and engineering services for the 63,000-square-foot convention center project.

It will be located in downtown Sanford at the northeast corner of Sanford Avenue and First Street, the location of the current Sanford Civic Center, which will be demolished. While the 3.95 acre site is part of an overall area, it does not include 7.9 acres where a hotel may be constructed. The hotel was not included in the matters taken up by the commission this week.

During discussion of the hotel complex however, Commissioner Grant Malloy suggested an evaluation should be made across the county to determine the needs and feasibility of the hotel.

"With the new hotel in Lake Mary," he said, "I'm not sure this project would be feasible at this time."

Commissioner Carlton Henley pointed out that Tuesday's vote did not bind the commission to a contract.

"We won't be getting into that until we receive an interlocal agreement with the city of Sanford," Henley said.

The county is expected to bring back for approval a contract with Burke Bales & Mills, as well as an interlocal agreement with the city of Sanford, at the last meeting in September.

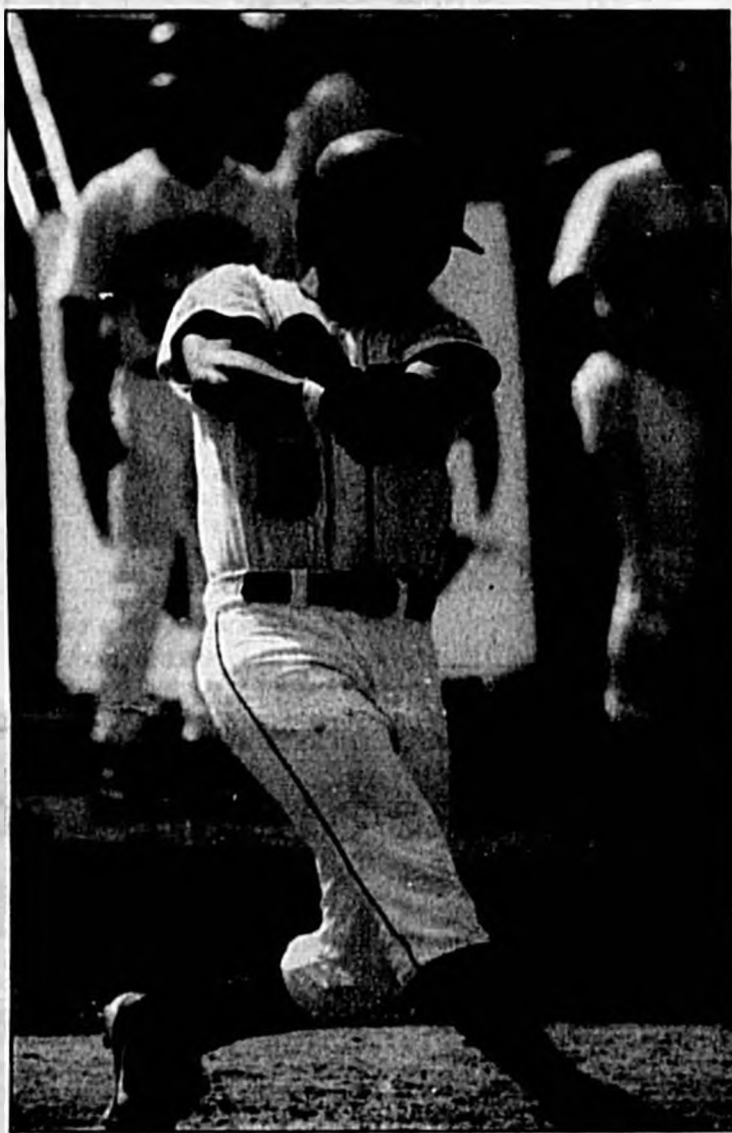

Pads crack for first time at UCF

ORLANDO — The University of Central Florida football team began its first full week of two-a-day practices on Monday conducting two sessions in full equipment with live contact.

After dressing in just helmets and shoulder pads, players must once again look to adjust to not only an increased workload, but an increased physical load as well.

"Things went well," said UCF Head Coach Mike Kruczek. "They (players) have to get accustomed to having all their garb on, but things went well. I felt the tempo of practice was good."

Often times full gear means all-out contact, however at this early stage of the game the coaches know that you have to be careful as there is still a long season ahead.

"Philosophically we are not going to do a lot of intense hitting," Kruczek added. "We

are going to learn how to get good fits, we are not going to take the ball carrier to the ground unless it is necessary in scrimmage situations. It is more of a 'thud' situation, so we go into that first game healthy which is critical for our success. We need to have all our important guys lined up to play."

In many situations the cracking of pads means the flaring of tempers and at times some heated physical exchanges after the whistle. This serves as more of a distraction and only takes away from the focus of the football team. It may be inevitable, but it will not be tolerated.

"It happens, but we do not allow them to practice that way," Kruczek stated. "I have given them one warning and from now on it will be taken care of. The NCAA doesn't allow you to do that in games, so we will not tolerate it on the field. It is normal to get a little hot at times, but you have got to learn to control your temper."

Lightning dictated the day's second session as practice was delayed for nearly an hour before officials would clear the start of practice. Judgments are based on flash-to-bang ratios and for the sake of safety lightning must be outside a six-mile radius.

Despite a substantial amount of rainfall and a soaked field, the team conducted a productive second practice in helmets and shoulder pads focusing primarily on skeletal passing drills, line reads and concluded with team time.

Kyle Watkins was cleared to practice with the team during the second session. Watkins, a 6-8 340-pound tackle who was a projected starter for the Golden Knights, was nursing a severely sprained ankle.

home runs, which is beautiful.

It should be an inspiration for anyone that lacks (Barry) Bonds-type talent. There is a place in this game for people like him. Maybe we'll make a trade and get him over here."

Monday, Eckstein stayed hot, leading off the bottom of first inning with his sixth triple of the season and wound 2-for-4 in the game to raise average to .283 in a 7-0 victory over the Detroit Tigers.

The Angels are now 70-48 on the season and trail the Seattle Mariners by two games in the race for the American League West Division lead.

But if the playoffs started today, Anaheim would be involved as they lead the Wild Card Race by a game over the Boston Red Sox and two games over the Oakland Athletics.

Corey Patterson, who played at Five Points Complex until his family moved to Georgia, did even better, launching a pair of home runs at Coors Field on Sunday to help the Chicago Cubs outscore the Colorado Rockies, 12-9. It was the first two homer game for the rookie Paterson.

Unfortunately for Patterson, his heroics came on a day when Sammy Sosa hit a grand slam and totaled five RBI, in the process setting the National League record for RBI in consecutive games.

Sosa, who knocked three three-run homers in consecutive innings Saturday night to place his name in the record books in several categories, drove in 14 runs total in the final two games of the weekend series. The previous record was 13, which was shared by players who did it in one day. San Diego's Nate Colbert drove in 13 on Aug. 1, 1972 — five in the first game and eight in

the second game of a doubleheader. St. Louis's Mark Whiten drove in one in the first game and 12 in the second of a doubleheader on Sept. 7, 1993.

The Major league record for RBI in consecutive game is 15, set by the Yankees' Tony Lazzeri with four on May 23, 1936, in the second game of a doubleheader, followed by 11 on May 24, 1936.

Also on Saturday, Sosa tied Hall of Famer Johnny Mize with his sixth career game of at least three homers, became the fifth player to hit homers in three consecutive innings, and tied the Cubs' 91-year-old record for RBIs in a game with nine.

Monday night, Patterson stayed hot, launching his 12th home run of the season out of Wrigley Field during a 9-6 loss to the Houston Astros.

The homer broke up Roy Oswalt's (14-6) shutout bid and was the first off the Astros ace in 26 2/3 innings.

Sosa again stole a lot of the thunder as he hit his Major League-leading 40th home run, a two-run shot, in the seventh inning and became just the third player in National League history to put together five consecutive 40-homer seasons. He joins Hall of Famers Ralph Kiner and Duke Snider.

Named the Co-Player of the Week in the National League Monday after batting .560 with six homers and 19 RBIs, Sosa now has five homers in his last three games. He also has 490 in his career.

Another ex-PONY star also made news on Sunday, as the Florida Marlins avoided a shutout in the eighth inning when 21-year veteran Tim Lincecum opened the frame with a double off Arizona Diamondbacks ace Kurt Schilling, the 2,600th hit of his career, and later scored on Kevin Millar's single. Schilling won his 19th game in his third attempt as the defending World Champions won 9-2.

FWC EXTENDS BAN ON HARVEST OF PUFFERS

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) has extended an order for an additional 90 days to prohibit all harvest of fish commonly known as puffers, genus "Sphoeroides," from the waters of Volusia, Brevard, Indian River and St. Lucie counties.

The FWC has also expanded the closure to include Martin County at the southern end of the Indian River estuary

further precautionary measure.

This action continues the 90-day closure issued on April 25, which would have expired on July 24. The order is based on verified toxicity in puffers and the continued risk of illness to consumers. The Commission's intent is to prevent harm from puffer consumption to the public.

Several species of puffers are included in the harvest prohibition. They include southern puffer, northern puffer, marbled puffer, bandtail puffer, checkered puffer and least puffer.

Puffers, sometimes called "puffer fish" or "blowfish," achieve their globular shape as they swell by swallowing water or air.

The FWC has coordinated with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (DACS), the Florida Department of Health (DOH), and various federal agencies on this issue.

The FWC will consider the future management of puffers and receive public comment regarding the puffer fishery in Florida during its Sept. 4-6 meeting in Pensacola.

Nine seniors who have experienced many successes in the past three years wearing the black and gold will lead UCF's 2002 squad. They have won two conference titles and played in the NCAA Tournament twice.

Keeping in mind that she would be losing so many players after this season, head coach Amanda Cromwell went out and recruited a big class of newcomers. Her efforts have landed UCF one of the strongest recruiting classes in recent history.

Soccerbuzz.com, the "home of women's college soccer on the web," has ranked UCF's 2002 recruiting class as the ninth best in the Southeast Region. Speedy defender Danny Shea, and forward Mark Wong, who had 25 goals and 16 assists his senior year, round out the incoming class of freshman.

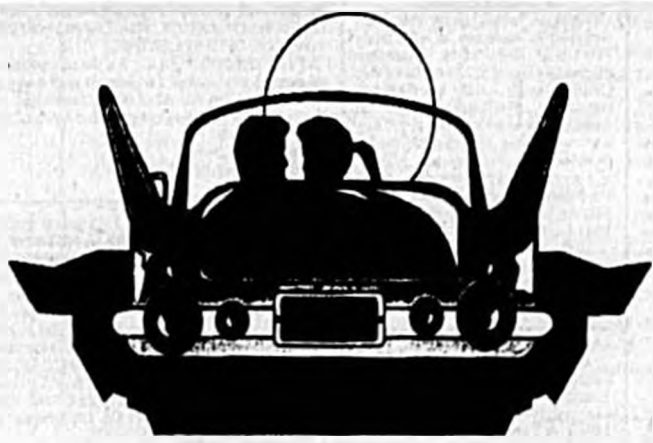

Phase One of development of the 20-acre Eugene "Stetson" Gregory Law Enforcement Memorial Park, was approved Tuesday by unanimous vote of the Seminole County Commission.

An impressive presentation was made at the commission meeting by Suzy Goldman, Director of the Library & Leisure Services for the county, along with Seminole County Sheriff's Department Chief Penny Fleming. Also on hand were Deputy Todd Moderson and Sheriff Don Eslinger.

Goldman explained that phase one of the park will include parking areas, a group pavilion, paved driveways, benches and picnic tables, beach volleyball courts and children's playground equipment with separate areas for children 2-5 years old and 5 to 112 years old.

Also planned in Phase One is an on-site Sheriff's Office substation. The facility's physical address is 1610

Lake Harney Road in Geneva. It is at the extreme eastern end of the road, at the shore of Lake Harney.

One of the biggest assists in the project is the donation of the land for use as a park by the property owners.

Construction on the park is expected to begin within a year.

To finance the development of the park, through the efforts of Deputy Moderson, the

sheriff's department has raised more than \$60,000. Goldman said over \$400,000 has been promised in services, materials and in-kind donations by area businesses, and Seminole County had previously set aside \$134,881 for the project.

It is not known at this time if there will be a swimming beach at the lake. The Seminole County Health Department will be reviewing that situation at a later time.

Goldman said that in a heavy rain season, it is possible the lake may rise to the point where some of the lake's edge at the park

Denver Cordell, former sheriff, mayor dies at 96

A kind and gentle man who played important rolls in the history of Sanford and Seminole County died this past week. Denver Cordell a former sheriff and Sanford mayor, died Thursday, Aug. 15, 2002 at the age of 96.

Born in Hartwell, Ga., he moved to Sanford in 1926 and except for a stint in the U.S. Navy during World War II, he never left his beloved city.

Cordell was a former mayor of Sanford, having been elected unanimously by his fellow City Commissioners on Monday, Jan. 3, 1955. The term was to run for the full year of 1955.

"Two months before the end of my term," he once commented, "The governor appointed me as sheriff of Seminole County, so I decided to leave the commission, but they wouldn't let me. So I was probably the only person to serve in both positions at the same time, even though it was only for two months."

According to Seminole County Chief Deputy Sheriff Steve Harriett, Cordell took over during the brief period of time when Sheriff J. Luther Hobby was suspended from office.

"Denver was appointed to serve in that position during the suspension," Harriett said.

At the time of his election as mayor, Cordell, already a member of the city commission, owned a garage, in addition to many other occupations and businesses during

his years in Sanford. Friend Mona Walker commented that Cordell was still very active, especially in church work.

"He kept driving that pickup truck around until just a few weeks ago when he was hospitalized," Walker said. "Denver took pride in visiting older friends at their homes and in nursing homes, including one who had reached his 100s."

On July 27 of 2002, Cordell celebrated his 96th birthday. On Cordell's 95th birthday, long-time

Astronomers use telescopes to observe the moon. Young scientists in William Cavins class at Lake Mary Elementary School, however, used microscopes during their recent lunar studies.

Sandy Adams led the District 33 voting with 78 votes, followed
