

Board selects Vogel as superintendent

School system will conduct contract negotiations with St. Lucie resident

SANFORD — In the end, it was the questions Bill Vogel asked, not the ones he answered, that earned him the chance to be Seminole County's next school superintendent.

The School Board on Tuesday unanimously selected Vogel from a field of four finalists who completed a rigorous interview process to replace Paul Haggerty, who retires in July. Chairman Sandra Robinson will conduct contract negotiations with

Vogel before bringing the final package — expected to be in the \$135,000 to \$160,000 range — back to the board for approval.

"I'm delighted in the selection of Dr. Vogel," said Karen Coleman, principal of Seminole High School. "I look forward to working with him."

All four candidates, two out of state and two in state, have impressive resumes, and

School Board members noted that each was well qualified to lead one of the state's premier school systems. However, board members said it was Vogel's attention to detail that set him apart from the other finalists.

Each finalist showed a genuine commitment to students, staff development and build relationships within the school system and the community, said board member

Larry Furlong. At the end of each interview, candidates were asked if they had questions about the community or the school system. Only Vogel took the opportunity to "walk the walk," Furlong said.

"(He) asked each one of us what our goals were for the school system," Furlong said. "That shows someone who understands the importance of hearing what everyone else has to say. ... That sealed the deal for me."

School board member Diane Bauer agreed, noting that while all the finalists

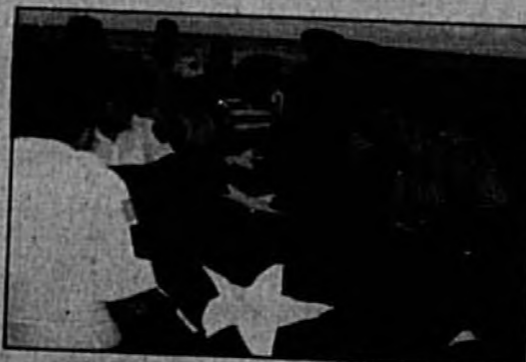

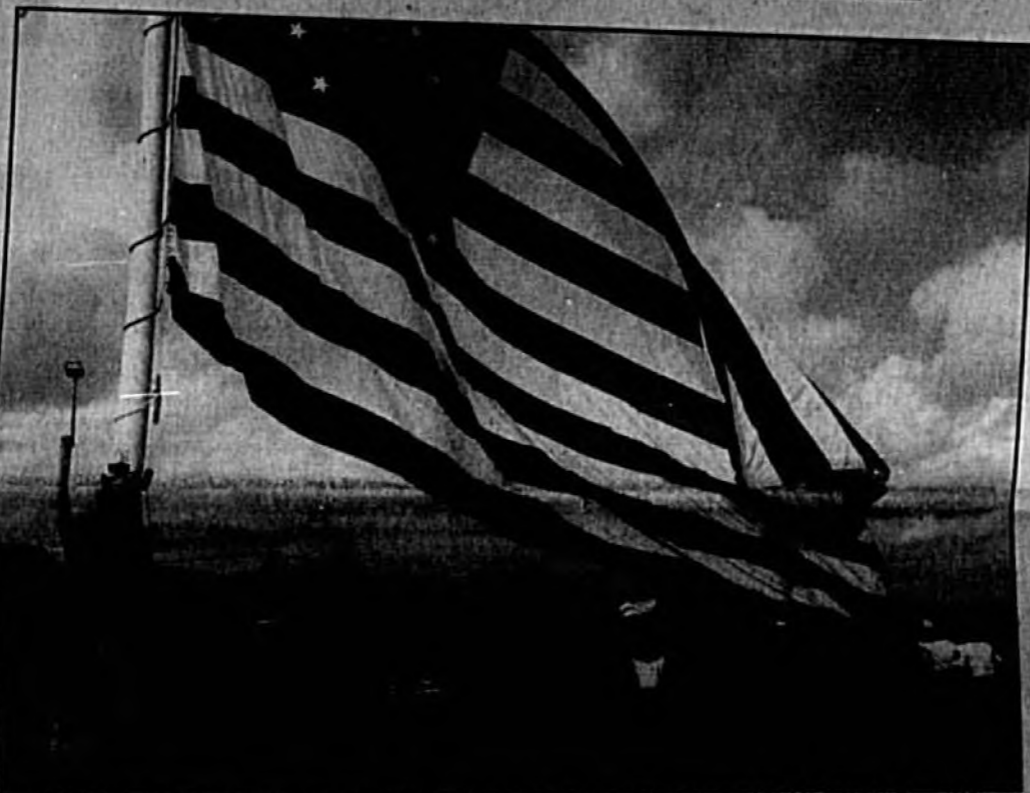

Commission decides airport best location for elections office

SANFORD — The Seminole County Board of County Commission voted 4-1 Tuesday to move forward with plans to relocate the Seminole County Supervisor of Elections office to the Orlando Sanford International Airport.

"This is in the best interest of the supervisor of elections, citizens and voters," said Chairman Daryl G. McLain. "During the last election we had people standing in the streets waiting to enter the building."

"It is very important to me, and I have no problem moving forward with this project ... because I feel 100 percent confident that this is the right decision," he added.

The decision was made after weeks of debate concerning where

the new office should be located. In March, the decision was narrowed to two alternatives — Reflections, an office building in Lake Mary, and building an office at the airport.

The need for a larger location to house the election office was first brought to the commission in late February by Supervisor of Elections Sandra "Sandy" Goard. Although it looked as if Commission would approve the construction of a 20,000-square-foot building during its previous meeting on March 25, it postponed the decision until Tuesday.

Goard was thrilled with the decision, stating, "The new construction will be specifically designed to the elections office needs and specifications. We would be forced to make do with

Mother Weaver resolves its time to retire from Rescue Outreach Mission

SANFORD — Over the course of her life, Mother Blanche Bell Weaver has gone well out of her way to help the less fortunate. For the past 17 years she has operated the Rescue Outreach Mission, a shelter on West 13th Street in Sanford that she founded to provide assistance to the homeless within the Sanford community.

"When she was a child, she grew up through the Great Depression," said her daughter Sylvia D. Izquierdo, the Administrative Director of the mission. "My mom was always sharing what she had with other children in the neighborhood. And this stayed with her when she grew up. She knew what it was to have hard times, and to be hungry and have no clothes."

Indeed Weaver has continued to care for the well being of others, as her mission has served over 800,000 meals since it opened its doors in 1987. In addition, the mission provides clothing and also gives out food boxes each holiday. Last year alone it served over

85,000 meals and provided shelter for over 500 people. And it's the only such facility in Seminole County.

But now quickly approaching her 80th birthday and dealing with the beginning stages of Alzheimer's disease, Weaver has stepped down from the day-to-day operations of the mission. Now she leaves it in the capable hands of Marvin Jones, and so far the transition has gone well.

"Mr. Jones has stepped up to the plate," Izquierdo said. "He is a very caring person. And he's a person who's looking for growth."

The relationship between Weaver and Jones goes back about thirty years. They met in the early 1970s while Jones was a juvenile probation parole officer in Sanford.

"She was basically doing what she's doing now," Jones said. "Giving her time, her love, everything to unfortunate individuals in the community."

Jones has worked in the ministry/social work/day care fields for the past 35 years. In August of

Local branches honor National Library Week

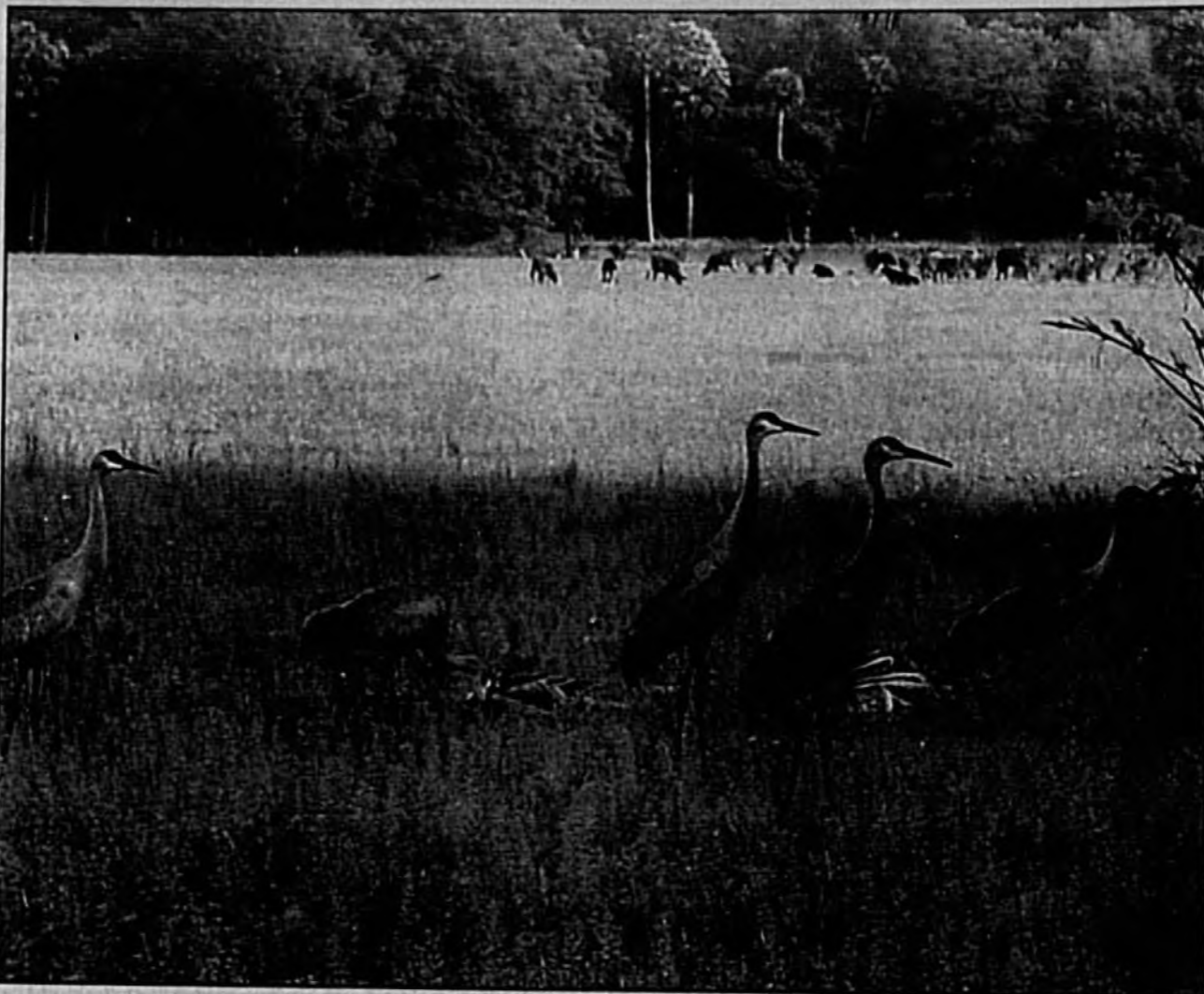

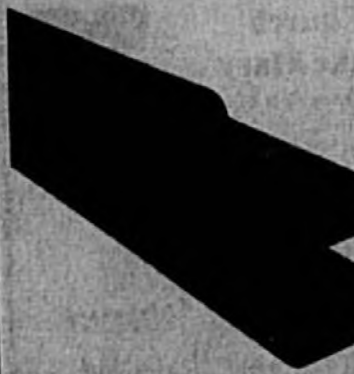

The Seminole County Small Business Development Center, also located in the new facilities, provides day to day services to incubator clients and assists another 300 + individual clients with business counseling. existing configurations [with the Reflections space].  
According to Goard, the proposed airport building would be designed for additional personnel needs and voter services. Another advantage of the airport location is its cost. A 10-year lease with the airport is \$500,000 less than with Reflections, which would not be available by Goard's April 2004 deadline.  
The cost of the airport building

lease will be \$148,000 per year for a proposed 10 years, with two five-year options.  
In an attempt to keep costs low, Commission is asking Goard and county employees to review the amount of space needed for the office in hopes the size of the building can be reduced.  
"We need to have a thorough review of the space needs, looking at where we are and where we are," said Commissioner Grant Maloy. "I want to see it as far under 20,000

as possible. This will ensure that the bill will be as small as possible." According to Maloy, staff should also look at the possibility of outside storage.  
Goard disagrees, stating, "Who would know best the space needs of the elections office than I? I have worked in this office for over 25 years and have served the citizens of Seminole County as supervisor of elections for the last 20 years." "We originally asked for 25,000 square feet and were able to reduce

that to 20,000," she added. "I feel in order to prepare and properly stage an election we will need that 20,000. However, we will work with staff on this. I've always tried to be conservative as can be and I don't plan to change now."  
Although most commissioners said the proposal was the best fit for what the county needs, Commissioner Carlton D. Henley did not agree.  
"I think this is a piecemeal work," said Henley. "We don't

know if it is the best deal or not until we do due diligence."  
A final plan will be brought before the board at a time to be determined. According to Airport President Larry Dale, if Commission backs out of the deal they will be responsible for any funds accrued.  
Other items to note, the commission:  
• Approved a resolution proclaiming April 24 as "Seminole County Farm Tour Day."

• Voted unanimously to allow the School Board of Seminole County to continue to use designated areas of Soldier's Creek Park for at least 20 more years. The School Board currently provides environmental education activities for school-aged children and construction is under way for an educational facility in the park.  
• Voted unanimously to contract Metropolitan Systems, Inc., as the sole vendor of Seminole County's bus benches.

talked of collaboration with stakeholders, Vogel carried through with that commitment during the interview process. Vogel's business card includes his home and mobile telephone numbers, she added.  
"For me, that validated his approach to being superintendent, that accessibility is important to him," Bauer said.  
Vogel was the frontrunner for the position, almost from the beginning. Of the four finalists, he was the only candidate from a field of 10 semifinalists that all five board members agreed should be in the final group. That frontrunner status may have put extra pressure on Vogel. Robinson said Vogel was visibly the most nervous during an interview before the full board.  
"I was slightly disappointed with his interview" before the board, Robinson said. "I was not as impressed as I thought I would be."

She later added, however, "I did not mean to infer that I believe he was not a good fit for Seminole County."  
Each school board member emphasized the importance of finding a superintendent that was "a perfect fit" for the district. Vogel fit the bill, board member Dede Schaffner said, because his current job as superintendent in the 32,000 student St. Lucie district closely matches Seminole County.  
"The fact that St. Lucie has been through the unitary status process is important, too," Schaffner added.  
Seminole County is still under an early 1970s U.S. Department of Justice desegregation order. That order is expected to be lifted in June, granting the district unitary status.  
The three candidates not chosen for the job included Christine Johns, deputy superintendent for Baltimore County public schools; Joe Joyner, an area superintendent

for Orange County schools; and Jude Theriot, superintendent in the Lake Charles, La., school district.  
Bauer said each finalist not only has outstanding credentials, all showed an eagerness to be a part of the Seminole County school system.  
"We had four candidates who wanted very much to come to Seminole County," Bauer said. "I felt like Sally Field: They liked us. They really liked us."  
Bauer also expressed gratitude to the 20-member citizen review board who narrowed the field of applicants from 45 to 10.  
"They really did their homework," Bauer said. "Their input was important because it represented a broad spectrum of the community."  
"Choosing a superintendent is important to the future of Seminole County," she said. "I don't mean that as a cliché. This decision will effect the future of the county for years to come."

1985 he went to work as a shelter manager for the Coalition for the Homeless in Orlando. Just as recently as three weeks ago, he was still there as the vice president of operations for the shelter.  
But all the while Melvin Philpot, chairman of the board at the Coalition and a director at the Rescue Outreach Mission, had lobbied Jones to come over and help run the mission. Finally with Weaver ready to retire, Jones said he prayed about taking over the mission and was led to make the move by God. So he left the Coalition after 17 years of service to become the mission's President and CEO.

Immediately he has gone to work to improve the mission, chiefly trying to raise funds so that it can provide the programs and services that can help the homeless become productive members of society.  
"There's so many things that we'd love to do but we don't have the funding," Izquierdo said. "He shares our vision to be a responsible presence in the community."  
Under Jones, Izquierdo said she sees the mission going into transitional housing and expanding its partnerships, collaborating with even more people to better help the community and those who need the mission's services.  
Jones said that he wants to bring in other agencies to provide individualized services to those that come to the mission, such as the Growth Counseling Center. He would also like to bring in new programs, dealing with things such as HIV testing. And he's "working on upgrading the shelter itself" so that potential donors will recognize it as a worthy facility to donate to.  
"And overall he just would like to get more people involved with the cause, to help the mission help others."  
"What I'm trying to get to the community is that this is not a one church shelter," Jones said. "This is a community problem."  
As for Weaver, she does still have some involvement with the mission. She serves as the Executive Director and Founder, coming once or twice a week according to Jones to "check on things." She also still serves as pastor at the Rescue Church of God, the same church that she spoke to years ago of her vision to open up a shelter for the homeless.  
Though she may not be as active with the mission as she once was, those that have had their lives touched by Weaver will always remember her fondly.  
"(She gets) warm, really warm heartfelt reactions," Izquierdo said. "They remember her for all of her kindness."

For the Silver Hawks, Tony Louka was 2-for-3 and Nick Farkas suffered the loss despite giving up just four hits.

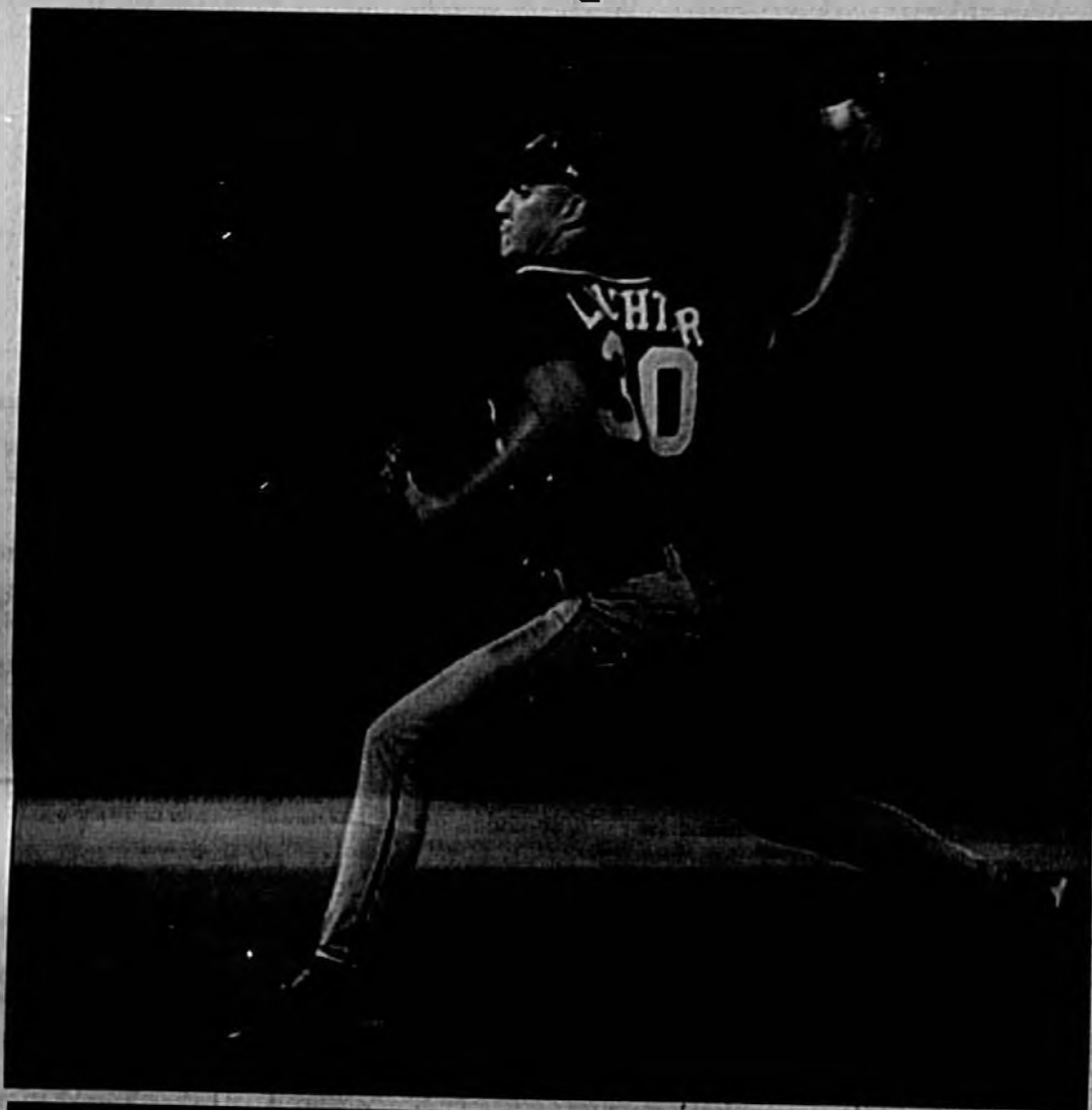
Lake Howell had gotten a big district win on Friday as they doubled up homestanding Pine Ridge, 8-4.
