Sanford Splits Twin Bill With Orlando In Holiday Attraction

McCannahan, Porter, Makes Debut In Morning Contest But Loses In Ninth Final Inning Rally Pitcher's Undoing Fergus Pitches Superb Ball In Afternoon Game To Win, 3 To 1

Sanford and Orlando split a double-header yesterday, the Colts winning the morning game in Sanford and the early-Fergus capturing the afternoon contest in Orlando. Both games were hard fought and each ended with the same score, 3 to 1. In the morning contest, Lefty McCannahan, recently acquired by the Champions, made his debut.

McCannahan, hurling excellent ball allowing but seven hits, four of the being of the scratch variety. He also caused seven of the strikeout route. With the exception of being a little wild and showing a few rough spots in his fielding, McCannahan showed the score, neither club could get the ear-mark of a splendid hurler.

In the afternoon game in Orlando, Fergus hurled one of his best games. He limited the hard hitting Colts to six hits while Barron was being sicked for eight.

Sanford scored in the fourth on a crooked hit from Crowe who was out. Bill Meyers singled to right and advanced as Bailey was safe on Lehmann's error. R. Allen was out but Fergus singled and Meyers scored. The last 7th rally came in the fifth when Fergus led off with a single to right, Barclay sacrificed and was safe as Barton erred on it. Both men advanced as R. Allen was grounding out. Fergus was tossed out at the plate on Crowe's grounder but Barclay scored as Lehmann threw the ball away trying to catch him off third.

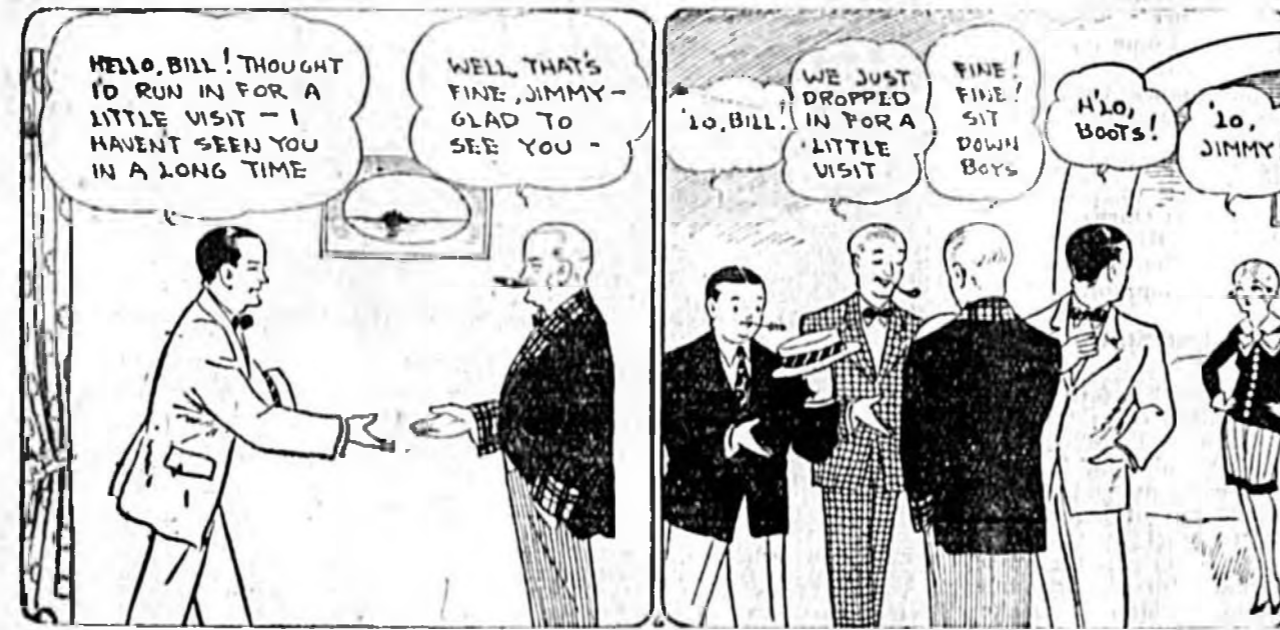
