



ton's Georgetown university medical school, report a type of chest "tourniquet" that may be effective in saving the New Chest

victims of too many sleeping pills. Such modicines affect the breathing centers in the Tournique brain. An overdose permits breathing only through

reflex drives. Experiments with dogs have shown Life fever that the rate of breathing can be increased by chest compression. This is done by binding the middle of the chest with a kind of tourniquet that keeps the animals breathing although their brain conters are descend by the drug.

The Georgetown physicians said, however, that more research would have to be done before they could be sure that such a pre-cedure would aid human victime of barbiturie poisoning.




