1/2 cup green pepper strips
Medium onion, thinly sliced
Medium clove garlic, minced
6 tablespoons corn oil
margarine
1-pound can tomatoes in puree
6-ounce can tomato paste
2-ounce can anchovy fillets,
drained and cut up
1/2 cup coarsely chopped ripe
olives
6 loin veal chops
Salt and pepper to taste

In a medium saucepan gently
cook green pepper, onion and
garlic in 1/4 cup of the margarine
until wilted; stir in to-
matoes, tomato paste, an-
chovies and olives. Spread over
bottom of a shallow 3-quart
baking dish. Brown chops
quickly in a large skillet in the
remaining 2 tablespoons margarine;
sprinkle with salt and
pepper; arrange in baking dish.
Bake uncovered in a 375-degree
oven until chops are tender—

before measuring
1/4 teaspoon baking powder
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg, separated
1 teaspoon pure vanilla
extract
1/4 teaspoon milk
1/4 cup finely chopped walnuts
Stir together the flour and
baking powder. Cream butter
and sugar; beat in the egg yolk,
vanilla and milk. Gradually stir
in flour mixture. (Cover and
chill if necessary to have dough
firm enough for rolling.) On a
prepared pastry cloth with a
prepared stockinet-covered
rolling pin roll out dough, one-
half at a time, about 1/4-inch
thick. Cut out with a 2-inch

Try Corn Flitters For Tasty Meal

If you go to the Pennsylvania Dutch Folk Festival in Kutztown, Pa., this year (June 28 through July 5), I strongly advise you to try the Corn Flitters. Yes, they're called flitters — not fritters.

When I visited the festival last summer, I was just as surprised as you probably are by the name. After one taste of this delicious offering, I sought out the young man who runs the stall where the flitters are made, to ask how that "fl" got there and beg for the recipe.

His name is Dick Shaner and his regular work is teaching school. "I call them flitters because they flitter in the pan," he told me as we watched a charming Pennsylvania-Dutch girl at the flitter stall ladle batter into hot corn oil in a black iron skillet. Occasionally the batter did indeed flit to one side, making slightly irregular shapes. Dick Shaner gave me the recipe and when we tried it in my test kitchen our flitters were exactly like those I relished at the festival.

If you try the flitters at the 28th annual Pennsylvania Dutch Folk Festival this year, you may enjoy making them at home. Or you may want to make the flitters before visiting Kutztown, then taste Dick Shaner's and compare.

Flitters are of course just one small delightful taste of the festival. It's a huge demonstration and display of the lore and folkways — involving farms, families, crafts — of the Pennsylvania Dutch through the years. If you are interested in America's food history, don't miss the old-time corn husking, shelling and grinding. (I bought a pound of cornmeal made from corn that had been shucked, shelled and ground at the festival and found it so wonderfully good for cornbread that I was sorry I hadn't brought home pounds of it.) If you'd like to enjoy the time way of a few fruits and vegetables and making apple butter. Taste the old-fashioned funnel cakes and big soft pretzels.

Have a family-style meal at the Country Kitchen — an open-

side exhibit of farm cooking on a wood-burning stove — or at one of the pavilions where the food is prepared by Pennsylvania Dutch church women. All are wonderful and offer all you can eat. I stuffed myself on ham, chicken, potato filling, schmitz and knupp, vegetables, salads, sweets and soups. What a treat!

Kutztown lies in Berks County in southwestern Pennsylvania, halfway between Allentown and Reading. The hearty food at the festival reflects both the past and the present of folks of Pennsylvania Dutch ancestry.
