Secretary of State Henry Kissinger's "success" in his whirlwind diplomatic overtures to Communist China raises all kinds of interesting questions - and some dangers regarding the political and military situation in

The frightening effect on the Soviet Union comes through the loudest and the clearest in any assessment of reaction to America's cozying up to Mao Tse-tung, Chou En-lai and the other master Reds of Peking. There are other bits of spin-off, too, and they are readily apparent in Tokyo and in Taipei.

However, four specific effects of the apparent upcoming formal diplomatic recognition of Peking by President Nixon (and the concurrent dumping of the Republic of China on Taiwan) involve the Russians:

1. The Kremlin finds that U.S.-China conciliation lessens the effectiveness of its 1,250,000 troops spread along the Chinese border. China has called these troops a provocation and a threat toward invasion. Many other side effects of this troop threat situation come to mind.

2. So anxious is Moscow not to lose its place as the No. 1 Communist friend of America — to the Chinese giant, especially - that it is purring nice words about the same President Nixon that it has denounced over the years. These "nice words" included praise for the President and denunciation of Americans who want the President to resign. The Kremlin, through the mouth of Pravda, calls such Americans "rude, revengeful, irresponsible and small in number.' 3. Russia also is warming up to another old enemy — the previously hated regime of Chiang

Kai-shek on Taiwan. The men of the Republic of China are keeping a straight, silent but secretly amused face about these tacit overtures but they see the thinking behind them. Russia wants continued U.S.-Taiwan ties as a means of thwarting Red China expansion into the Pacific. Projecting this

Inspectors Find Poisons Burglar Gets 120 Years

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - State food inspectors have found packages of two dangerous products in four Florida health food stores, Agriculture Commissioner Doyle Conner says.

The inspectors began searching for Aprikern and Bee-Seventeen after the federal Food and Drug Administration said they contained enough hydroger cyanide to cause possibly fatal cyanide

Conner said Thursday 19 bottles 3 Aprikern capsules and 29 packets of Bee Seventeen were found in a Fort Walton Beach store; 22 packets of Bee-Seventeen were found in Pensacola; 10 bottles of Aprikerns in Orlando and 106 packets of BeeSeventeen in St. Petersburg.

Tag Contract Proposed

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - A con tract for an Arkansas firm to manufacturer approximately three million of Florida's 1973-74 auto and truck tags has been proposed by the state Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles Department.

Director Ralph Davis said the manufacture outside state prisons was needed to prevent extensions of the tag buying deadline as occurred this year. He said the tag shop at Raiford State Prison can make only five million tags in the required time and Florida now is selling eight million a year.

Controllers said the 570-pound unmanner spacecraft continued to perform flawlessly, returning data to earth across 500 million miles of space.

Chrysler Cuts Production

DETROIT (AP) - Following in the footsteps of industry giant General Motors, Chrysler Corp. has announced January plant shutdowns to trim production of large-size automobiles. The nation's No. 3 automaker said it is extending the weeklong Christmas shutdown by three days at two plants which turn out large cars. Chrysler also said four small car assembly plants would be closed three days to allow a balancing of parts supplies with another plant converting from large to small car production About 25, 000 hourly workers will be affected by the threeday shutdowns, spokesmen said. Workers with a year's experience retain 95 per cent of their pay during the temporary shutdowns.

Nixon Considers Rationing

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Nixon is meeting with energy advisers who have been studying whether gasoline rationing, higher gasoline taxes, or both, should be imposed. He scheduled the meeting for today with his Cabinet-level energy group. Sources said the energy group is leaning heavily toward recommending rationing. but Nixon is known to consider that step a last resort.
