Declaring that he appreciated the pressing problems facing both the vegetable and citrus growers in Florida, Congressman Joe Hendricks in an interview with a Herald reporter today stated that he desired to assist in any way possible in efforts to find a solution for these problems.

The member of the House of Representatives from the fifth Florida district also pledged his support to the proposed St. Johns-Indian River Canal and to legislation for reimbursing Florida growers for losses during the Mediterranean Fruit Fly campaign.

Declaring that he desires to get a modern hospital in every county in his district, Congressman Hendricks also stated that he expects to get Seminole County's proposed \$127,000 PWA hospital project reinstated after his return to the Capital on Christmas Day.

He said he believed the reason the application for the hospital was turned down was because work could not get underway before the deadline of Jan. 1, and also because the PWA appropriation had been expended. Stating that in his opinion, the project was not turned down because of any engineering defects.

## Dies Committee Will Recommend New Legislature

### Five-Point Program Would Control Subversive Influences

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—(AP)—The House committee on an American activities will recommend to Congress next month a five-point program designed to control the subversive influences in the United States.

The committee which has been embroiled in a controversy throughout its existence, ended four months of testimony yesterday.

Informed persons said today it would suggest stricter immigration laws, with requirement that aliens entering the country say whether they believe in the American form of government, strict enforcement of deportation laws, regulations that organizations shown conclusively to be "un-American" file with the government an accounting of their finances, activities, directors, outlaws all such organizations as soon as possible, regulations that persons who join political organizations reveal their real names; that a list of members be kept available for possible government inspection.

## \$256,848 Expended In Operation Of County's Schools

TALLAHASSEE, Dec. 16.—The cost of operating Seminole County schools last year was \$256,848, according to county reports submitted to State Superintendent Colin Engel.

Cost of instruction, including teachers' salaries, textbooks, and classroom supplies, was \$185,719; cost of transportation \$21,590; cost of county administration \$4,234. Other current expenses included cost of maintenance, heat, water, light, insurance, rent, and health service.

Capital outlay for purchases of a fixed nature such as new buildings, school buses, or equipment totaled \$49,418. Payment for bonds and other debts was \$55,591, bringing the total expenditure to \$338,554.

The combined cost of operating schools in all Florida counties was \$18,891,222, three-fourths of which was for instruction. In addition to this \$9,508,441 was expended as capital outlay and \$4,758,855 for payment of bonds and other indebtedness.

For participation in the contest, Mr. Heeren announced that the lights must be turned on Christmas eve and each night during the following holiday week from 6:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M. Three out of town persons will judge the displays and their decision will be final.

## Early Shopping And Mailing Are Urged By Postmaster R. J. Holly

As an accommodation to the residents of Sanford, all windows at the Post Office will remain open for the next three Saturday afternoons, Postmaster R. J. Holly announced today.

Pointing out that during the holiday season the volume of mail increased approximately 200 per cent, Mr. Holly stated that it is a physical impossibility to handle this mass of mail efficiently and promptly within a few days.

Therefore to assure delivery of Christmas presents, cards and letters by Christmas Day the public should shop and mail early, he said.

"Do your Christmas shopping so that you can mail your gifts, greetings, and letters to relatives, friends, and loved ones at least a week or 10 days before Christmas, according to the distance. This will not only make it certain that they are received before Christmas Day but will be a great aid to your postal service and to postal employees and enable them to spend the Christmas holiday with their families," Mr. Holly said.

Regarding wrapping and packing, the postmaster said all parcels must be securely packed and wrapped. Use strong paper and heavy twine.

Special packing is required for umbrellas, canes, golf sticks, they should be reinforced their full length by strong strips of wood tightly wrapped and tied or otherwise sufficiently wrapped to withstand transportation. When three or more are tied together, wrapped and tied, no reinforcement is necessary.
