

Cotton Crop Nearly All Picked, Says Government Report

WASHINGTON, Dec. 23,--(AP)icking of cotton virtually has een completed in the cotton belt except in central, eastern and northeastern Arkansas, where it has been too cool for this work, the department of agriculture tolay reported in its weekly summary of crop and weather condiions in the southern states.



Figures submitted to the New York Times show there are now twenty million dwellings in this country, but also twenty per cent more families than there are dwellings. It is indicated that within ten or twenty years, if construction activity continues as it has in the last few years, there will be sufficient dwellings to have one for every family.

In New York State there are twice as many families as Baldwin. there are dwellings. According to The Times there is no British other State equally as crowded.
