ATLANTA - Lester Maddox says he got started in life with \$4 He was 16 years old then, the scrawny son of a Georgia millworker, and he used the \$4 to convert a pigeon coop into a

He went on from there to become the governor of this state. Now 62, Maddox says things haven't really changed much for

"I started with \$4 and it looks like I'm ending up the same way."

The one-time symbol of Southern segregation says he is broke. deeply in debt, and he fears the pressures of the predicament may very well send him to an early grave. Maddox says his problem is rooted to his past political efforts.

"I would have been a lot better off if I'd never been governor." As it is, he says, he still owes \$182,000 from his political campaigns of 1966 through 1974. "I can't possibly pay it off," he adds, "all I got to my name right now is \$642." Technically, Maddus believes he may be responsible for only a portion of the campaign debt. Much of the \$182,000 obligation was

"But I cosigned all of the loans, and I feel I have an obligation to

pay them off; the thing is, I just can't raise the money." Since spending four years as Georgia governor, and another four as lieutenant governor, he has failed in several business

enterprises, including food service, real estate and even a songand-dance comedy act. At present his income is "unreliable." He receives no

retirement benefits for his public service. He says he has some remaining business connections, "but not enough to count on."

"They are breathing down my neck, The other day my wife went to one bank to cash a check for groceries, and it was refused. That's the first time in 41 years my check wasn't good. I tell you, I'm just worried sick about it."

Maddox says worry over the debt led to a heart attack in September. "I was overworking and losing sleep," he explains, "and it hit me one day while I was out weeding ivy in the yard." Maddox suffered a myocardial infarction, a blockage of the arteries. "The debts did it," he insists, "I know they did."

The former governor is still recuperating from the seizure at his upper middle class home in northwest Atlanta. He is pale, and says he has lost 20 pounds. "I'm feeling better," he says.

"God worked a miracle on me. But it could happen again. You never know. My doctors tell me I must live quietly for now." Friends say Maddox's heart attack has changed him.

In particular, Maddox has mellowed regarding Jimmy Carter. The pair have feuded since Maddox served as Carter's lieutenant governor in 1970-74. When Carter announced his presidential candidacy in 1976, Maddox entered the race "so that I can show America what a phoney and a hypocrite Carter is."

Now that is over, Maddox says. When he was hospitalized, Carter was among the first to send good wishes.

Maddox is grateful: "I think he's a good man, I think he really wants to do what's right for the country. I support him. He's my president and I include him in my prayers almost every day." Maddox says he prays many times a day. But though he feels



Condemned Killer – 19 Years On Death Row

TOKYO (UPI) — Condemned killer Sedemichi Hirasawa usu-ally wakes up at 4 a.m. in his prison cell, recites his Buddhist prayers, and then slips back into bed for a catnap before break-

Every day for the last 19 years he has awakened to the knowledge that - legally - this could be the day the hangman

Hirasawa, who observed his 88th birthday Feb. 17, was convicted of the fatal poisoning of 13 employes of a Tokyo bank during a robbery in Japan's most bizarre crime of modern times.

His last legal appeal was exhausted in 1966, leaving the ministry of justice free to execute him. However, no justice minister has of justice free to execute him. However, no justice minister has ever taken the final step of sealing Hirasawa's death warrant.

For almost 30 years, Hirasawa has been protesting that he is innocent. He has won his fight to survive with a series of deft legal maneuvers that have caught the imagination of the Japanese people. Scores of prominent Japanese belong to a "Save Hirasawa Club." His 35 year-old lawyer campaigns steadily to get the government to pardon the aged convict.

Hirasawa often has been called the "Japanese Caryl Chesman," after the convicted California repist who fought for his life for 12 years before being executed in 1998.

The story started on Jan. 26, 1948, when a self-important little man in a business suit called on the manager of a bank in central Tokyo. He said he was an investigator from the Tokyo health

Syrian Leaders Refuse

To Meet With Atherton...

DAMASCUS, Syria (UPI) - Syrian leaders have refused to meet with U.S. Assistant Secretary of State Alfred Atherton on his current Middle East shuttle, the state-controlled press said today.

"Atherton has expressed his wish to visit Syria on his current Middle East tour and Syria has excused herself from receiving him," the daily Tishrin said. Other Damascus newspapers carried similar stories. The action came as Syria prepared to send a

military delegation to Moscow to discuss details of increased Soviet military aid, agreed on during President Hafez Assad's visit to the Soviet capital last week.

...He's Off To Egypt

JERUSALEM (UPI) - U.S. envoy Alfred Atherton got "concrete suggestions" from Israel for conveyance to Egypt on agreement on Middle East peace guidelines today but said neither side was yet ready to resume direct negotiations.

Atherton planned to take the suggestions with him to Egypt Tuesday and to return to Israel Thursday with Cairo's reply. Atherton met for two hours with the Israeli negotiating team led by Prime Minister

Menachem Begin. He arrived from Egypt Saturday saying he had received concrete suggestions from Cairo about an agreement on the declaration of principles guiding an overall Middle East settlement.

Fishermen Defend Slaughter

TOKYO (UPI) - Fishermen who herded 1,000 dolphins to shore and beat them to death with clubs responded today to an international outcry against the slaughter, calling it a matter of their own survival.

The killing of the bottlenose dolphins by Iki Island fishermen last week brought strong protests from foreign environmental groups. Major Japanese animal care groups today called the action "embarrassing" and "disheartening."

The fishermen call the dolphins the "gangsters of the sea" for eating the islanders' commercial catches of cuttlefish and yellowtall' snappers. The local government paid a \$12 bounty for each dolphin killed.

With counting complete, Mrs. Gandhi's "Indira Congress" won 152 seats - more than twothirds of the 224 seats at stake and more than anyone, including her supporters, had predicted for the party.



Congress Does Read Its Mail

President Carter seems to have profited by criticism of his technique for dealing with

He and his staff are injecting more of a personal touch in the political game that every administration needs to play with Capitol Hill.

This does not mean, however, that his problems

with Congress will disappear. Experience is a good teacher, and there is more than one lesson for Mr. Carter in the opposition or indifference with which Congress has greeted some

of his major legislative proposals.

The most adroit salesman in the White House cannot get Congress to buy a program if Congress isn't convinced that the people want it. His energy program calls for new taxes and more

regulation when the public mood is for less of both. His welfare reform proposals actually would add to the cost of welfare when that subject is associated in the public mind with waste and abuse.

His lobbying for a consumer protection agency did not fail because the House of Representatives is not sympathetic with consumers, but because so many House members do not want to run for reelection this year defending the creation of still

another federal agency.

The old liberal formulas which are stock-in-trade for the Democratic Party are not going down well with the current Congress, especially among new members who joined it in the elections of 1974 and

Many programs coming from the Carter White House fail to account for the conservative swing revealed in public opinion polls in recent years— an irony considering Mr. Carter's courtship of conservative voters in 1976.

A recent Gallup Poll, for instance, indicated that a majority of Americans believe balancing the federal budget and controlling inflation are more important than cutting federal taxes.

This suggests that Mr. Carter's pledge to work toward a balanced budget was in keeping with the public's understanding of the nation's economic, problems, while his retreat from that goal, for the sake of a tax cut, is not.

Neither Labor, with its massive support of Democrats in congressional elections, nor doctrinaire liberals wedded to bureaucratic solutions to all our problems, have been getting this Congress to jump through hoops.

Nor are they likely to as long as Congress keeps Nor will Mr. Carter, with any amount of charm,

if his own policies and programs don't make a better match with what the people are saying in the choice of senators and representatives they send to

The Postal Service, which through deficits and perceived deterioration of service has tempted Congress to reconsider the action taken in 1971 to remove the service from politics, itself remains loyal to businesslike concepts. The agency is going to private firms for some of its stamps

The Postal Service will seek bids to print and package for shipment four commemorative postage stamps to be issued during 1979 and 1980.

Stamp production costs of the government's Bureau of Engraving and Printing last year amounted to \$43.6 million. If the stamp printing bill can be lowered through the competition of the free enterprise system, the Postal Service will have bolstered its hopes of remaining independent of

'Quiet Pro' Holds Up Bank, Slips Into Crowd In Mall

"He did nothing dramatic. He didn't say much." That's the picture which emerged today as police began piecing together the details of a robbery at the Sun Bank of Seminole is the Altamonte Mail, according to Sgt. Jim Perry of the Altamonte

The man, described as about six-feet, three-inches tall, athletically built with blond hair and wearing a leather jacket, entered the bank on the top floor of the mall at 2 p.m. and asked a teller for change of a \$100 bill.

According to FBI agent George Watt, he never showed the teller the \$100, instead he pointed a small caliber revolver at her and demanded \$20s and \$100s.

The teller complied and simultaneously a second bank em-

ployee touched off the silent alarm, Perry said. There were two customers and five employees in the bank at the time. The man took the money from the teller, then moved to adjacent teller's window where he reached over the counter an

leather-like briefcase, authorities said. He ran outside the mall, along the mall's sidewalk, until

Authorities have been unable to trace his trail once he went inside the department store, FBI agents said. "We're very fortunate no one was hurt," Faye C. Agoes, chairman of the board of Sun Bank, said after arriving at the obbery scene Monday afternoon.

"We haven't determined how much was lost, we're still in th process of doing the accounting." FBI agents were still processing film from the bank's cameras this morning, but were doubtful they would come up with anything useful. "The film could have run out before then," Watt

He also said the FBI believes there is a "possibility" the same man could have been responsible for three other area bank robberies since November

However, in two of the three robberies the bank's camera failed to produce any visual evidence. "The only pictures we have are from the Dade Federal Saving and Loan robbery," Watt said. That banking institution, at 103

Lee Rd., was robbed Nov. 18 by a man whose physical description was similar to the man involved in Monday's robbery. Also fitting the same general description and in each case


