# Open Reception Pays Tribute To Artist

The citizens of Deltona will honor the late artist, Helen Mathews, by celebrating her birthday on Wednesday, March 1, at the Home-Decor Gallery, 601 Sunset Plaza, Deltona.

The public is invited to view the art of Helen Mathews at a reception, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

Helen Mathews, affectionately known as "Grandma Mathews," was a legend in her own time when she died, at 88, on Dec. 15, 1978. She was known by sight to the public as she tramped along the streets of Deltona for 12 years, usually wearing an old floppy hat and a long, woolen coat, even in summertime.

After her death and the poignant circumstances of her public funeral, the citizens of Deltona learned that Helen Mathews had been a talented artist in her youth. During the past year, the public has expressed great interest in the 56-year-old oil paintings which were discovered in the small house where Grandma Mathews lived alone.

To conclude the Grandma Mathews birthday celebration, Dr. Decker will make a surprise announcement that one of the 32 paintings by Helen Mathews has been sold.

Dr. Decker will then exhibit the painting, describing the particular technique used by the artist, and will identify the local resident who purchased, for \$1,000, the one and only painting by Helen Mathews that will be offered for sale to the public.
