Lake Mary keeps property tax low For the 8th year in a row, city maintains

one of the lowest rates in Seminole

LAKE MARY -- For the eighth consocutive year, Lake Mary residents will have the second lowest levy in Seminole County.

During Thursday's meeting, City Commission approved on first reading a millage rate of 3.7648 mills, which is lower than every city within Seminole County except for Wister Springs' mill-age rate of 3.5495 mills.

A mill is 1/1,000 of a dollar, and is defined as the millage needed to raise the same total dollars of Ad Valorem taxes as in FY 2000. As property values increase, a mill is worth more.

"We are proposing no increase in any fees, but do anticipate some possible

adjustments in our garbage/recycling rate, as well as some new fees to be added related to development review services for which we currently do not charge," Lake Mary City Manager John Litton said.

The total General Fund budget for FY

2001 is \$11.3 million, Litton said. Personnel costs, including salaries, insurance and other benefits make up about 70 percent of the fund.

General Fund revenues are projected

to increase 9.9 percent. "This is not based solely on anticipated new residential units or commercial construction, but a realistic evaluation of trends which we have observed over the past several months," Litton said.


Lake Mary High School provides artists for mural By Arthur Zielinski Staft Writer

Florida Covernor Jeb Bush and Commissioner of Education Tom Gallagher have been busy presenting money to achoois around the state. The money is part of the Bysh/Biogan A+ School Recognition Plan which recognizes achools that are achieving and showing improvements. entinois County's share of actinuited \$24 million, is \$1,575,105 A total of 19 achools will receive the money.






Recently, Carey Ferrell purchased an old leather Seminole County Fire Department helmet,

"I paid a fellow \$250 for it at a flea market," he said Wednesday. "We've got it in our window and several old firemen are asking about it. I tell them this one isn't for sale.

"That's a problem I have with Sanford items. I want to keep them for myself." he said. Inside the helmet is the name M.C. James, Engine 221, A Shift.

"I figure M.C. James was a lieutenant. There's one bugle on this one a nozzle - indicating he was a lieutenant," Ferrell said.

"You don't see items like this," Ferreil said. "When a fireman retires, he takes his helmet with him. The helmet is retired, also. Somehow, this one turned up in Lake County. Maybe the guy's wife left it."

Ferrell said he wanted to be sure the heimet was from Seminole County, Fla. and not from Seminole County in Oklahoma or in Georgia.

"One day, a fellow came in and said he knew or M.C. James. The helmet was from Seminole County, Fla.," Ferrell said.

Another recent purchase, Ferrell said, was a book that came out in 1970 and cost \$4.50. Entrapped in a bidding war with a woman who lived nearby, Ferrell bought "Sanford As I knew It" for \$183,

"Of course I paid too much, but I wanted the book," he said.

The author, Peter Schaal, used a number of old Sanford Herald newspapers to write about what was happening in Sanford from 1912 to 1935.

"I saw it advertised on eBay, Ferrell said. "It turns out the fellow selling has a shop right near us. Lemuel DeBose who owns the Junk Exchange." Ferrell said he was still

searching for a book titled "Small Town South" that was written about Sanford residents of the 1940's. Ferrell said it was supposedly a fiction book but was about real people in Soutout,

"It caused quite a stir," Ferrell said. "Someone I know has the book and has written the real names next to the fictional ones



MATER NASCAR officials consider revamping points

ear after year, NASCAR faces questions about Its points system. The driver with the most meewins doesn't win the points championship. A driver on a hot strock fails to make up much ground. Why aren't drivers rewarded more for winning races? For next senson, NASCAR officials are considering changing the system -- at least for the Winston Cup. But Kirk Triplett, NASCAR's director of operations, said the altered system might not be used in the

isuson urand National and Craitsman Truck series. The Cup points system hasn't produced close, late-season championship races. This year, Bobby

Labonte led the points race since April. His consis-tent performances — three wins, 13 top-five and 17 top-10 finishes — put Labonte in control early. Last year, Dale Jarrett grabled the lead in May and heid the contenders at bay. Technically, champion-ships haven't been clinched until the closing races, hut drivers have taken consortable leads into the final works of the season.

final weeks of the season. Buyer Wallies has you four races this season, a race posted 14 top-10 runs and led 1,439 laps, more than twice that of any other driver. But he is 397 points behind Labonte. The reason? Wallace has three finlahes of 30th or worse.

Wallace has won and lost under the current system. In 1993, he won 10 races but did not win a champi-onship. He won six races in 1989 and came away with the title.

"Just about the time I say it's not what I like, then I wish it was the way I like," Wallace said. "I've got a consistent year going with nu wins or not great runs like a couple of years ago, but now this year we've got a bunch of poles and wins and we're kind of wishing they had some more homus points for stuff like that. Bet, All in all, it's worked for many, many years, and i think it's fine the way it is."

NASCAR is concerned about the lack of drama in the points race. The potential for change is great, but finding the correct change is difficult.

Triplett said it's more than just a math puz-sie. While officials consider the options, they must account for how the drivers will react. He said the sanctioning body is not considering changing the way points are awarded for finish-ing each race or giving bonus points for winning poles.

"That's such a one-lap deal," Triplett said of ualifying. "We've run some numbers on qualithe state of the or seven poles in the outree of the season but sverages finishing 15th ... Qualifying is such a different case than the actual race."

NASCAR officials are looking at awarding bonus points during various segments of a race, such as the halfway point, Triplett said. Although officials have applied the proposed system to the past four or five scenons, the results might not mirror what actually would

have happened. "The difficulty in that is you're applying bonuses to paper," Triplett said. "You don't know what the motivation to the driver would be. This condition, which is common in men over 60, results when blood is not contained in the erectile cylinders of the penis. Viagra alters this. Under the influence of the drug, blood is trapped in the penis, leading to erection. This beneficial consequence is usually welcome but, remember, men with heart problems or those taking nitroglycerine should avoid Viagra.

Second, female menopause. As women age, physiological changes occur. (I won't enumerate them all because you are more than familiar with them.) Two consequences of menopause are vaginal dryness



DEAR DR. GOTT: I often experience sharp pains behind my breastbone; they may spread into my left arm and jaw. I obtain some relief from antacids, and I avoid spicy foods. I am 43. Should I see a doctor? Is this an ulcer?

DEAR READER: It could be. Or you could simply be suffering from symptoms of stomach irritation (gastritis) or hiatal hernia with reflux. You should be examined by your family doctor who will probably order a GI X-ray series to check your upper alimentary tract. This test should show the cause of your discomfort. If the GI series is inconclu-

sive, you may be a candidate for upper endoscopy, during which a specialist examines your esophagus, stomach and part of your small intestine, using a lighted fiberoptic tube. The fact that your pain is






