Blast Is Averted At Seminole High

An 18-year-old DeLand youth is being held by Sanford police after an incident today at Seminole High School, in which a piece of cloth was placed in the gasoline tank of a truck and set afire. Detective Gary Swaim said David Alan Howell has been charged with trespassing after Patrolman Jack Petrunic found him on the school campus early today.

Three other youths also believed to have been on the scene are being questioned regarding the placing of a wick into the portable classroom mover's tank,

The Sanford fire department had to be called to extinguish the blaze from the oil-soaked rag that threatened the school and adjacent area with a massive fire had it exploded.

Swaim said the explosion would have destroyed the mover and killed anyone in the area had the fire entered the massive moving machine's gasoline tank. Two city employes happened by the school at 1:30 a.m. and spotted reveral youths in the area. They called police and Swaim, Sgt. William Lykens and Petrunic were dispatched to the facility.



State Attorney Abbott Herring said today he has no evidence of criminal action that would be answerable by a grand jury indictment of Seminole Memorial Hospital trustees. Herring said he had talked with Dr. John Johnson, medical staff chief; Robert Besserer, hospital administrator, and Gordon Freder.

(Editor's note: Florida's "government in the sunshine" law prohibits public officials from holding secret martings for conducting public business. Violation of the law is a criminal offense, punishable by imprisonment or fine, or both.)

Herring said there appears to be a "gray area" in the setting up of a joint trustee-med ical staff committee to discuss the preparation of a pathologist contract without inviting any-







Before treatment can begin, drug abuse must first be diagposed with that in mind, the following facts are made avail-

Glue sniffing is usually the start of youth down the long road that ultimately leads to "hard core" stuff. Parents may look for tubes of glue, glue smears on clothing, paper or plas-

Dangers associated with glue sniffing include lung, brain, nervous system and liver damage or perhaps death through suffocation and anemia. Physical symptoms of glue sniffers are drunken appearance, dreamy or blank expression, odor of glue on breath, excess pasal secretions and watery eyes.

Heroin addiction is marked by stupor, drowsy appearance with needle marks on the body, loss of appetite, small eye pupils, inattentiveness. Things to look for when use of heroin is suspected are needle with syringe, cotton, tourniquet, burnt bottle caps or spoons, traces of white powder around nostrils. Dangers from using beroin or morphine include death from overdose, infections from dirty needles and addic-

convulsive movements, exhilaration and hallucinations, A white odorless powder indicates a cocaine user and dangers from its use include convulsions, death from overdose and a

tion; excessive atching is prevalent, too. Look for empty bottles that formerly contained paregoric or cough medicine. Dangers from this drug is mostly addiction.

Marijuana smokers have enlarged pupils, sleepy or talka. tive, craving for sweets, increased appetite, erractic behavior and loss of memory. The smell of burnt leaves or rope with a sweetish odor is prevalant. Dangers from marijuana use are liver damage, accident proneness and anti-social behavior,

LSD (acid-mescaline) use is marked by severe hallucinations, incoherent speech, cold sweaty hands, vomiting, crying, chills and suicidal tendencies. Dangers associated with this drug's use are panic, persecution complex, brain damage and unpredictable behavior.



The superintendent said he made reference to the 90-day wage-price freeze imposed by President Nixon in his address to teachers and said the \$310,000 budgeted for teachers' pay raises would go to them "as far as I'm concerned."

> But, the superintendent quickly explained, he is obligated to uphold the law and whatever action is ultimately taken will be based on a legal opinion of School Board attorney Douglas Stenstrom, Angel said he explained his position to the teachers relative to the wage freeze controversy based on information he had received from State Education Commissioner Floyd Christian's office.

(The Herald received guidelines from Christian's office in the Monday Report, a weekly newsletter, which purports that school personnel who started work before Aug. 14 are entitled to pay increases under 1971-72 salary schedules.
