#### Bishop Cannon's Predicament

Bishop James Cannon, militant dry crusader and equal pugnacious fee of Alfred Emanuel Smith and John J. skob, has made the front pages again, this time not by bitter arraignment of subtle wet propaganda nor by vituper-ative denunciations of the Smith-Reskob domination of the Democratic Party, but through extensive speculation in Wall Street. Ordinarily, a man's operations in Wall Street would scarcely cause the lifting of a single eyebrow but the spectacle of a high church official, of the prominence of Bishop Cannon, interesting himself in such a worldly and highly commercialized business as that of dabbling in stocks, is bound to excite public imagination, and perhaps not without good cause.

For instance, it is extremely interesting to note that the churchman's operations involved several hundred thou sand dollars, a highly respectable amount even in flourish ng times, and one which is not usually considered within the income of a malf-sacrificing religious worker. Curiously snough also is the fact that the good Bishop conducted his dealings through a bucket-shop concern instead of a reputble brokerage house. Incidentally, the firm has since gone into bankruptcy and its operator has been indicted by federal courts, Bishop Cannon, of course, sustaining a heavy financial loss as a result of the crash. But he is evidently not downhearted. Being a good sport, he philosophically remarks, "Of course I regretted the failure of the firm but accepted my loss as an incident common in business trans- tact in the white lights of pubactions.

But these are merely amusing sidelights on the church man's participation in the great "bull-and-bear" game. A more serious consideration, however, produces a far different reaction, impressing us with the fact that his conduct cerainly places him in an embarrassing position, to say the least, His emphatic protests to the contrary notwithstanding. Bishop Cannon's activities, in the final analysis, amount to nothing but gambling. If he finds consolation in the fact that he is within the law, we still wonder how he can consistently reconcile his actions to the Biblical teachings of which he, by virtue of his office, is one of the leading exponents.


