TODAY'S BIBLE VERSE

Forms, rituals, precedents, rules of thumb only cramp and bind. There is freedom and room for growth in following the spirit of the supreme leader.

The French parliament is back in session again trying to figure out how much money they can dig out of the United States and how many more American divisions they can get to fight their battles for them.

The Kelauer committee is about to convince the country there is more danger of the racketeers taking over than the Communists. The only thing is that if the Communists get in control, the racketeers, the Capone mobsters, would be their police force.

If you want to avoid runaway inflation with prices soaring to previously undreamed of heights, higher taxes, stiffer curbs on credit, and longer working hours will be necessary, says Stuart Symington, federal economic mobilization director.

That was a good message which President Truman brought back from General MacArthur. We will oppose force with force wherever it raises its ugly head.

General Eisenhower rejected Governor Dewey's "draft" for nomination to the presidency of the United States, but he didn't close the door to nomination by the Republican Party.

Testing New Laws

This would seem to recommend some such provision as that urged by Henry Waldman in the New York Times. He would suspend all laws not of an emergency nature for six months, during which time any citizen could have their constitutionality reviewed by the Supreme Court.

The feeling behind the suggestion is that laws should not be passed and put in force until all possible legal objections are overcome. This would fetter all government operations, an outcome desired perhaps by some, but not to be tolerated in the dangerous world in which we live.

Trouble In An Egg

Many an egg, when broken, has turned out to be filled with trouble. There is trouble brewing for the farm price support program, and part of it comes from the powdered proteins of eggs broken long ago.

Lately it has been disclosed that large quantities of dried eggs are being imported from China for sale to bakeries, which can buy them more cheaply than American dried eggs.

In the baker, whose customers castigate him daily for the prices of his goods, to be blamed for buying eggs as cheaply as possible? Is the importer, whose wage and other overhead costs now go up twice a year instead of only once, to be blamed for making a dollar where he can?

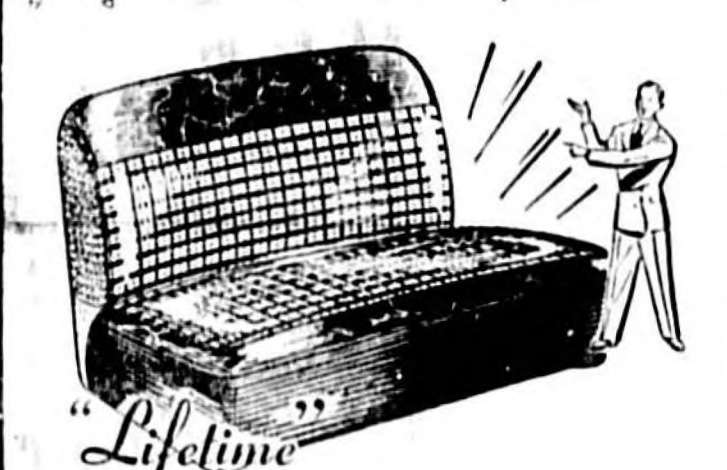

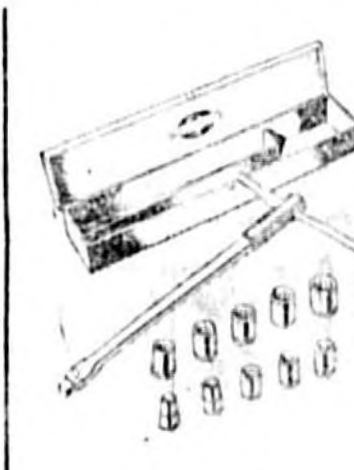

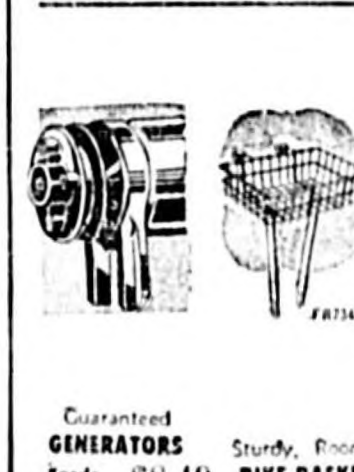
