ST. PETERSBURG-M. T. Dixon, director of the Department of Veterans Affairs for the State of Florida has announced that almost a million veterans who hold GI life insurance policies are using their regular annual dividends to guard against loss of their insurance.

The VA has paid nearly \$230 million in dividends for 1964 to more than 4.7 million veterans and servicemen who hold participating GI insurance.

GI policy holders may arrange, Dixon said, to leave future annual dividends with the VA as interest as a credit to meet monthly premiums should the policy holder fail to pay them before the end of the 31-day period.

These dividends are subject to withdrawal by the policyholder on request.

McNamara has proved out this thesis in electronic war gaming both for 1964 and for the early 1970s. Mathematically he has proved that his contentions are dead-certain.

Air Force Chief of Staff LeMay argues that in his experience wars never go the way planners plan them. Few battles go according to the book; weapons don't work out as expected. The enemy unexpectedly develops countermeasures.

Lellay says you have to be able to change your plans and your fighting as the situation develops when the chips are down. Missiles are fine and LeMay wants them. But missiles will do only one thing. You press a button and the missiles fly (if all goes well) to fixed, predetermined targets. They're inflexible,




