The editor of the Baltimore Sun, who conducts one of the ablest, strongest and most fearless newspapers in the eastern states, prints in a recent issue of his paper some words about the identity of an editor's enemies and why they are hostile to him.

Expressing the same idea that General Bragg of Wisconsin uttered when nominating Grover Cleveland the second time, "We love him for the enemies he has made," this editor writes.

If a stranger desires on coming into a community, to form an accurate opinion of the characters and calibers of the newspapers published there let him take careful note of the kind of men that praise or denounce, that support or try to pull down, and he will be enabled unerringly to size up the different journalistic competitors for popular favor.

The paper that always endeavors to uphold the right of the moral, sociological and economic questions presented for solution, that favors consistently law enforcement and the upholding of the standards that are worthiest will inevitably be opposed and denounced by the lawless element and supported by those who always stand for the right.

In this way can newspaper character always be accurately gauged, by the friends who support and the enemies who oppose.

GREAT SOUTH HIGHWAY

The assumed prospect of a national highway between New York and San Francisco, to be called the Lincoln highway, prompts the Manufacturers' Record to show that it is quite as important to have a highway between the North and South with another fitting into it from the West.

The route between Miami, Florida and Montreal, Quebec, is being along a route to be realized, but there is great need in the suggestion of the Record that there be another great thoroughfare starting from the Central or Middle West and joining the southern highway well down in the southern section of the country.

RUSSELL DEFINES THE LAW
