In other columns of this page The Herald reproduces the text of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation's plan for financing business and industries which are cooperating with the NRA movement. Lack of adequate financing has been the sore spot of the entire recovery program and it is unfortunate that some practical method for extending credit to businesses who were being required to raise wages was not invented before the various codes went into effect.

The government apparently recognizes now that the restoration of ample credit facilities is absolutely essential to the success of any plan to increase purchasing power, and it is now engaged in an almost frantic effort to create credit. The government proposes to buy preferred stock in the banks of the country, hoping that the banks in turn will use the new money to make loans to business men. By its open market operations, the Federal Reserve banks under the direction of the government are buying millions of dollars worth of government bonds from the banks, again hoping that the banks will use the new money to make loans.





HAVANA, Oct. 5 .- (A.P.) Storm barricades were removed today with the passing of an 82-mile-an-hour hurricane which caused slight injuries to 20, sank small vessels in the harbor and led to an orgy of looting. Soldiers ended the looting by killing two robbers.

At the height of the storm one trooper and one sailor were killed and one civilian wounded by shipers who fired on them while they tried to disperse thieves. Politics was at a standstill during the storm but Colonel Flugencio Batista, chief of the rmy, and American Ambassador bunner Welles conferred earlier. Satista assured Welles that the captured Monday in the National Hotel battle would be respected.
