McGovern's Simple Secrets Oblivion Up To Nomination

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)— A sense of history which told him times were changing and a passion for organization which gave him the courage to lead the Old Guard at its own game are the simple secrets of George McGovern's boom from oblivion to presidential nomination.

There is little revolutionary about it. It's a story of hard work converted into votes at the convention which gave him the party's nomination Wednesday night.

It seems miraculous that this could happen to a soft-spoken, Farm Belt senator whose name was recognized by only 5 per cent of the American public when he began his quest, there are some answers which make it more plausible.

—First of all, he carried a supreme self-confidence which assumed from the very start that he would win and led him and his staff to proceed even in the darkest days of the campaign as if he would.

—He recruited a staff which complemented all his best traits and shepherded his weaknesses, and attracted untold thousands of devoted volunteers.

—He adopted a strategy which decided firmly a year and a half ago just what he had to do and how he would do it.

—His grasp of the time and just the right issues to use seemed to put him there first and to leave little ground for the competition.

Earle Attacks Corporate Tax

State Representative Lewis Earle (R-Sem-Orange) an opponent of the now-passed State Corporate Tax believes Governor Askew owes an apology to the people of Florida.

Earle based his charges on the statement of this past weekend wherein Jesse Yarborough, public service commissioner indicated that he would allow rate increases of \$12 million dollars as proposed by the large electric and telephone companies.

"When I campaigned against the Governor's corporate Tax," said Earle, "I predicted this is exactly what would happen. It's going to be passed on to the consumer."

The legislator went on that Askew indicated it would apply only to multi-state corporations. Those included in the proposed \$12 million increase are located in and do business exclusively in Florida: \$4.6 million F.P.L., Tampa Electric \$914 thousand; General Telephone \$1.2 million; Southern Bell \$4.4 million; Florida Telephone \$133,000, and Florida Power Corporation has requested an increase of 18.6 per cent.

Earle further illustrated that the state did not need the additional revenues from the Corporate Tax when \$25 million was removed from the 72-73 budget for the construction of the capital building. "All of this taken from this year's budget when in fact it'll take more than five years to construct. They went ahead and raised the tax, and then thought up ways of spending the money."

"I hold no personal animosity with the large utilities. They've been assessed with the tax and now must pass it on to their customers."

45-15 School Plan Is Delayed?

School Board Chairman Keeth: "Would not be economically feasible for us to go on 45-15 on the date established."

Amid speculation that the so-called 45-15 extended year school plan, set to be implemented county-wide starting July, 1973, may be delayed still another year due to insufficient funds, the Seminole County School Board Friday afternoon adopted a \$25.5 million 1972-73 school budget and reduced by one mill the school tax levy.

A public hearing and final approval of the budget has been scheduled for 1 p.m. July 31, at the board's Commercial Street office.

Breaking it down, the school board is allowed to levy 10 mills, which is expected to bring in nearly \$5 million in local funds, plus the additional \$8 million in state aid.

Balance of the "tight" budget will come from state and federal sources.

Faced with a zero contingency account early last week, it was disclosed by Walter Teague, school finance officer, that additional funds were "found" which would enable a contingency account of \$50,053.39 to start the year, with \$100,000 cash carry-over.

However, the contingency is usually much higher at about \$250,000.

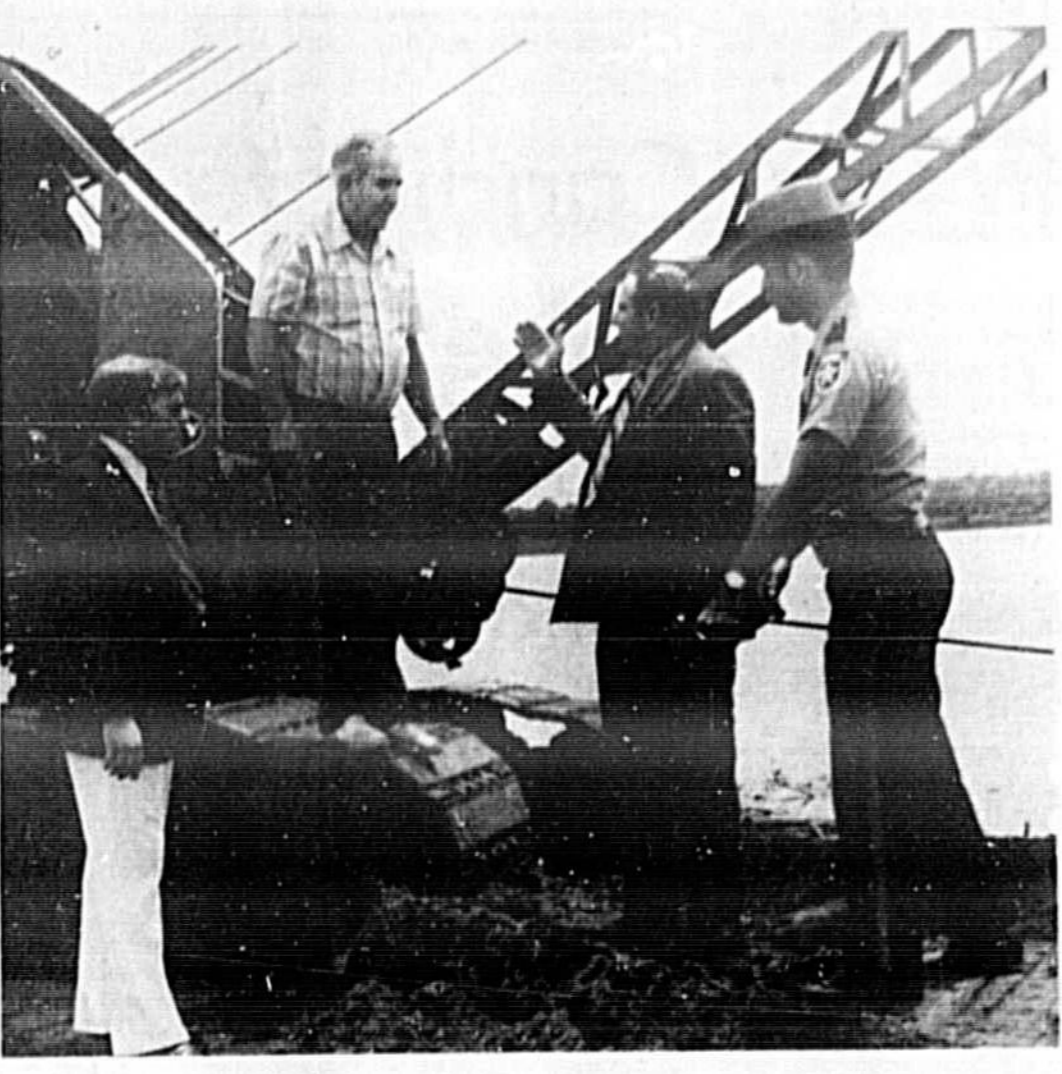
Board got themselves into a financial problem when they voted a teacher pay increase on a sliding scale starting with beginners from \$6,400 to \$6,600 before they knew for certain how much funding would be available. Then to keep the pay increase, the budget trimmers went to work and slashed

operating expenses from the lone down to the marrow. This action eliminated such "extras" as school bus courtesy riders for students living under the two-mile limit from an assigned school.

After the tentative approval of the 1973-74 school budget, Superintendent Joseph A. Wright held a quiet session to a roundtable finish when he recommended that board action on the 45-15 school plan be postponed to "later than July 1973," date set for implementation of the revolutionary new concept.

"We just can't swing it by July, 1973," he advised.

Land Development Planned Near Osteen

OSTEEN — Plans and final proposals will be presented today to the Dist. 3 Zoning Commission in New Smyrna Beach by American Heritage Outdoor Resort for a 593 acre development east of Osteen on the Maytown Road.

The property was purchased in March for \$25,000 by Lewis P. and William D. Rogers, brothers and partners in AHOR. They are also general partners in St. Johns River Associates, Ltd., developer of the tract. Previous owners were Samuel L. Grimes, New York, and Charles C. Baker, associated with First Continental Development Corp. of Orlando, New York and Texas.

The property fronts on the St. Johns River and Deep Creek Diversion Canal runs through the site, which is dotted by lakes. Development plans call for preserving the natural beauty of the area by adhering to strict ecological specifications and leaving more than half the area in open spaces.

Phase One of the development calls for 400 large condominium campgrounds sites and 80 rustic cabins for rental purposes dispersed in the woods and along the riverfront. Buildings are designed to blend in with the surroundings.

Among the recreational facilities planned to serve the resort are a par 3 golf course, stables and riding trails, game courts and sports fields, boating, and canoeing. A boat basin will be built on the St. Johns.
