





#### **Editorial Comment**

## Democrats Have Opened The Door

by the delegates to the National Democratic presidential nominating convention to be the Democratic standard-bearer in the fight to oust President Richard M. Nixon from the White

Indeed there is a similarity in the skillful way in which this modest, frank and outspoken Democrat achieved this political win to the manner in which Nixon maneuvered his nomination to the top of the GOP ticket in '68.

Here, however, all similarity ends. There can be found few dissimilar persons than the mountain state legislator and the Califorian. One is full of and fairly reeks with humanity. The other is the classical figure of the adept politician and gut fighter when the going gets

Democrats have, nevertheless (and probably because of the present characterization of their presidential hopeful) a major task of allowing the ". . . real George McGovern" to stand up and be recognized.

Whether or not they can or will do this is not at all certain. For the McGovern nomination is the product of the most open and most characteristic grassroots convention which modern history records.

It has been praised by such political masters as Secretary of the Interior Rogers Morton (in Miami Beach to let disenchanted Democrats and others to know that the GOP door is wide open).

Paying tribute to his "old rival" Lawrence F. O'Brien, National Democratic Committee chairman, for such a well-conducted and managed event, he also implied that the broadened base the Democrats have achieved cannot be ignored by the Republicans.

Creating this base has been a chancy operation. It required that attention be paid to those who have not been recognized before as important citizens with needs that should be needed and talents that should be encouraged. Necessarily it did not give time for either the publicity or the attention which has been the

undisputed tribute paid to the old machine politicians, the experienced elected officials who basked in such a climate nor the labor chieftains who had assumed that the prominence which they had earned after decades of Democratic loyalty would ever lessen.

These are neglects which must now be remedied if the "outs" are whole-heartedly committed to a strong and purposeful drive to give voters a choice instead of an echo when the Nov. 7th balloting takes place.

In this challenging reforming of the ranks, there is an impelling need that those who are

#### Buck Owens: He's In The Chips

HOLLYWOOD - There was a smile in her voice as the waitress said to Buck Owens: "I can't tell whether you're you or your son - you look so much alike!"

Buck replied that he was much obliged and that it certainly was a nice way to start off the day. It's like that now with Alvis Edgar (Buck) Owens Jr., son of a Texas sharecropper, and one of the eminent figures of country and western music. His harvest is all roses.

Buck plays his share of concerts, makes records, writes songs, stars in his own syndicated TV show and he's still pickin' and grinnin' on "Hee Haw," which moved from CBS into syndication across the land.

By his own estimate, Buck is pretty well fixed. But then, all country and western singers are rich, aren't they? Or, a fellow wondered, is that just a myth?

"Big myth, for danged sure," said Buck Owens. "A few country singers are quite affluent but not all of them. You need a bit of luck. But I got so danged tired of people saying to me, 'Man, you're sure lucky.' I remember how it was, schuffling around from show to show in my old '59 Ford. Then things started perking and I thought it must be luck, after all.

'I mean, I'd see talented singers and their careers might stiff out on 'em. Odd things happen. Yep, it must all be luck. And then I realized something - the harder I worked, the luckier I got."

Buck made his first big imprint, singing with a country and western group in Bakersfield, Calif., about 20 years ago, and he still lives up there. Lives well, too.

"There's another myth about country singers," said Buck. "We make little jokes about how tight we are with a dollar but it's not really true. Without bragging on it, I live in a \$150,000 house. I drive a \$14,000 Mercedes and I also own an

Excalibar. I've got a pilot for my little pressurized Beech-

craft Duke to fly around to regional jobs. In other words, I spend a lot of money I could save." It seems reasonable to ask if Buck owned any of those oil

wells in Bakersfield. He grinned. "No sir! A fella might put in, oh, say \$50,000 to do some drilling in the sand and the well comes up dry. They do that a few times, at so much a pop, and they're out of the oil business. There's nothing as sorry as an oil field that's

Buck leans to other enterprises. He owns four radio stations, two in Bakersfield and two in Phoenix. He owns a few ranches, a talent agency, a music publishing firm, a TV production outfit and a record company. He was saying that he just sunk \$250,000 into his own recording studio.

But his prime interest still lies where his roots are - in country music. We turned to that "In the last three, four years, country and rock have been on a collision course," Buck said. "We in country thought maybe we'd lose our identity. Recently, things began to change. Our music is shedding other influences and it's becoming more country than ever, more down home."

We talked about the impact of "Hee Haw" and Buck said: "What I owe to 'Hee Haw' is that with me it took a voice and a name and put an image to it. I'm just as amazed at the people who don't watch the show as I am by the people who do

"When we started, we got all kinds of flak that the overalls and straw hats and the corny jokes were downgrading country music. So, some of the confirmed country-western fans were put out. "But we've got people like college professors and bank

the lawbreaker Sound very familiar? Not too surprisingly, considering the common origins of the two systems and the increasing homogeneity of the western world in general, Britain has been wrestling with many of the same moral and legal dilemmas as has the United States.

This is the Britain of the popularly pictured law-abiding population, low crime rate, judicial system combining efficiency with scrupulous respect for individual rights and the unarmed bobby who is everyone's best friend.

Not entirely so, it appears. Crime and the exploitation of the law's omissions and ambiguities have been escaating. And, in fact, rebuffing the bobby's somewhat tarnished public image is a major goal of the reform pro-

The major recommendations include modifying requirements that police warn suspects against statements that may be used against them, limiting a suspect's right o remain silent, admission of hearsay evidence and permitting testimony of wives against husbands. The proposals are strongly opposed by British civilliberty organizations, again similar to the American experience. Parliament, however, is expected eventually to enact a modified revision measure.
