—Army officials today remained undecided whether to hold a funeral for Gestapo Chief Helmrich Himmler in the presence of captured German military and civilian bigwigs. The body still lay on the bare floor of the Lueneburg villa 86 hours after his poison suicide death. It was generally suspected that former Ngal Foreign Minister Ribbentrop the only high Nazi hot yet captured or reported dead-was somewhere in the British sector in
