American Income **Up; Spending Down**

continued to rise in September, and for the first time in several months consumer spending increased at a slower rate than income, the government said today. The Commerce Department reported personal income inreased \$19.8 billion or 0.9 percent in September to an adjusted annual rate of \$2.16 trillion. That follows a \$15.5 billion or 0.7 percent increase in August to \$2.14 trillion. The department also reported Americans increased their

consumer spending by 0.7 percent in September, up \$10.9 billion from the previous month to \$1.74 trillion. In August, consumer spending had shot up by \$18.7 billion or .1 percent — well above that month's increase in personal The figures indicate Americans may be spending their money more cautiously and saving more, evidenced by 6.3

percent increase in personal savings rate to \$84.1 billion in Wages and salaries increased \$10.7 billion or 0.8 percent in September compared to the \$13.8 billion or 1 percent increase registered in August, the Commerce Department said. Aside from the increase in wages in September, reduced consumer spending and lower payroll deductions helped Americans increase their disposable income by \$15.9 billion or 0.9 percent in September compared with a 0.6 percent rise in

The government said the 0.7 percent increase in personal expenditures in September - a smaller increase than the previous month - reflected a decline in major consumer purchases such as automobiles. But purchases of smaller, nondurable items increased \$5.6 billion over the month compared with a \$6.4 billion increase in Agusut.

Nuclear Waste Issue Delayed Once More

Congress has postponed a decision on a disposal system for nuclear waste from the military reactors used to produce atomic bombs and from civilian power plants. That's bad, because the decision has been delayed too long already, and the delay has put a severe crimp in the development of the nuclear power industry. The Senate came up in late July with what we believe is a sound and reasonable plan for nuclear waste disposal. It provided for semi-permanent, away-from-reactor storage of spent fuel. But the leaders of three House committees failed last month to agree on how to merge differing bills on nuclear waste disposal, therby making it almost certain that there will be no





A good soil is a peat-based mixture of one part coarse
