

## WOMAN SLAYS MAN SHE SAYS IS HER SPOUSE

### Jenious Rage Fnds Partially This Morning In Tallahassee Hotel After Struggle

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Jan. 29.—(AP)—Apparently in a jealous rage a woman giving her name as Mrs. Dixie Goad, 23, of Memphis, Tenn., shot and fatally wounded Robert Henry Goad, 25, also of Memphis, whom she claimed was her husband, at a local hotel this morning.

The shooting took place in the room of the two at shortly before 8 o'clock. Three bullets from a .45 caliber revolver had evidently been fired, one taking effect in Goad's back and coming on through his stomach, and the other two lodging in the wall of the room near an electric fan.

The hotel janitor, who rushed to the room after the shooting, told the police that he had heard some exclamation "I don't think you would treat me that way," and the woman reply, "I'd rather kill you than give you up."

As Goad lay upon the floor, the woman is said to have calmly telephoned for an ambulance and asked that he be taken to a hospital. He died a few moments after arriving there.

Police said they found evidence of a struggle for the revolver. Blood was spattered over one wall.

The woman told the officer that her address in Memphis was 217 South Second Street, and the Goads was 1824 Goodland Place. She said she was in Orlando.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Jan. 29.—(AP)—Ninety families reported in distress from lack of food and fuel in the flood-bound territory south of Crawfordsville, Ind., were the immediate goal today of four national guard airplanes engaged in relief work.

One hundred and 20 bags of food and clothing were ready for the aviators to drop at the houses of these families and others who rounded more than a week ago when the waters of the White and White Rivers overflowed, spreading over a large territory, and then froze. The planes yesterday dropped packages of supplies to 2 persons isolated on Outlook Island.





