

# The Lesson Of History

Walter Lippmann wrote the other day that the one great lesson of history is that nobody learns anything from the lessons of history, Most thoughtful people.have anticipated that sooner or later the lessons of World War Il would be forgotten and the slogan, "Remember Pearl Harbor," was popularized to help keep them in mind, but no one expected that so soon after the horrible failure of appearement, isolation, and unpreparedness, we

would find ourselves being urged to try that road again. Henry Wallace may be right that "Getting tough with Russia", may lead to a third World War, but there is no reason whatever to believe that being soft with her will be any more fruitful of peaceful results than Neville Chamberlain's humiliating surrender to Hitler at Munich "Peace at any price" was tried, even before that by Woodrow Wilson, who said, "There is such a thing as being too proud to fight," and that too failed. For once, let's see what being strong and ready will do.

It may lead to war. And all of us can agree with Henry Wallace and his communist allies that it will be a terrible war, that thousands of our sons will be sent to die on foreign soil, and that whole cities will be destroyed and civilian populations decimated. Nobody wants such a war, certainly not in this country, and probably not in Soviet Russia. And nobody advocates a "preventive war" now in order to avoid such a war in the future.

But if Russia is determined to continuo har aggressive tactics, if she is going to continue to subjugate the peoples of other countries as she has been doing in Poland, Finland, Lithuania, Estonia, Bulgaria, Roumania, Hungary Yugoslavia, Manchuria, Mongolia, and Korea, AS YOUR MUSCLES GROW if she is going to demand military bases in independent pressure your MENTAL AND nations like Turkey and Iran, and naval outposts at MORAL GRIP SHGULD GROW Trieste and Tunisia, Isn't it better to know it now, and PIRMER. TEST YOUR SELF: to prevent it, than to wait until Russia has all of Europe; do, do it with thy might.—Eccl. North Africa, and China under her control?

If Russin would precipitate a war in order to gain control of Trieste or the Dardanelles, she would not hesitate to march her troops into France, even as Hitler did into Poland with the complete co-operation of his Russian ally. This policy of resorting to force in order to expand her frontiers is not new to the Russian communists. They fought a war against Finland In 1940 for the sole purpose of gaining a narrow isthmus. They would go to war today against Turkey if they felt sure they could win.

Henry Wallace said Friday night that; despite his ittack on American foreign policy, he still believes in "One World." We are forced to believe he means One World dominated by the communists.

# Stalin Tells World That Threat Of New War Does Not Exist Urges Prevention Of Conflict Even To

Russian Policies In Germany Not To Be. Directed Against Britain And U. S.

MOSCOW, Sept. 24, (P)— Prime Minister Stalin put up a calming hand today and told the world that he did not think there would be another war in the near future because he believed there was no real danger of a new war and that the threat of war does not exist at the present. -

Stalin suggested that the ruble new war were just so much talk — but for a purpose. He blamed the talk on what he called naive politicians and military-political intelligence agents — who, he said, need this clamor to do three things.

To help their government wrest more concessions, to make it hard to cut the military budgets of their countries, and to put a brake on the demobiliza-tion of troops and thereby evade quick growth of unemployment in their countries.

Stalin did not mention the countries he had in mind.

There were many things that he said, in reply to a list of questions submitted to him by the Moscow correspondent of the London Sunday Times, in which the United States was mentioned specifically.

The Russian Prime Minister said the United States now holds a threat to peace in having a monopoly of atomic weapons. Stalin minimized this by declaring that he does not believe the atomic bomb to be as serious a force as certain politicians are inclined to regard it; that atom bombs margle are intended to intimidate weak nerves and that in themselves they can not decide the outcome of a war, and that the atomic bomb monopoly will not last for very long and besides, use of the bomb will be prohibited.

Stalin was asked whether he believed the earliest withdrawal of all American troops from China is vital to future peace. Stalin answered, "Yes, I do."


