Television Improves

It was less than a year ago that television was used commercially for the first time. It had a broadcasting range of only 50 miles and little hope was held at that time that this radius could be increased very much for some time to come. Obviously the possibilities of television seemed extremely limited indeed.

And yet early this week, David Sarnoff, president of the Radio Corporation of America, announced that a system of radio relay transmission has already been invented which makes possible television programs for inter-city broadcasts and increases the range up to one thousand miles. Some slight technical improvements would make possible coast-to-coast television broadcasts, Mr. Sarnoff declares. declares.

According to the announcement, the relay system worked out by the R. C. A. engineers is similar in effect worked out by the R. C. A. engineers is similar in effect to the wire networks of sound broadcasting. In its present state of development, it would permit the linking of cities such as Washington, Boston, and New York, and intermediate cities, while similar relay networks, separately operated, could be established in other sections of the country.

A network such as that planned for New York would make television immediately available to some 20,009,000 persons in the East, it was estimated. This system was said to be "one of the post remarkable advances in the de-
