Declining Birth Rate

The birth rate in 1938 sank to the lowest figure on record, according to life insurance statistics, while the death rate was a trifle higher than any year within the last five.

The records of 34 states and the District of Columbia for the first nine months of 1938 show that during the period from January to September, 1938, the birth rate within this aggregate of states was 18.5 per 1,000 and the death rate 11.5 per 1,000.

"These figures are provisional, but are not likely to be greatly altered when the late reports come in," the statisticians explain.

"Among the states which in 1938 appear to have so far recorded birth rate declines well in excess of the average are Alabama, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Kansas, Nevada, New Jersey, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Carolina and Tennessee.

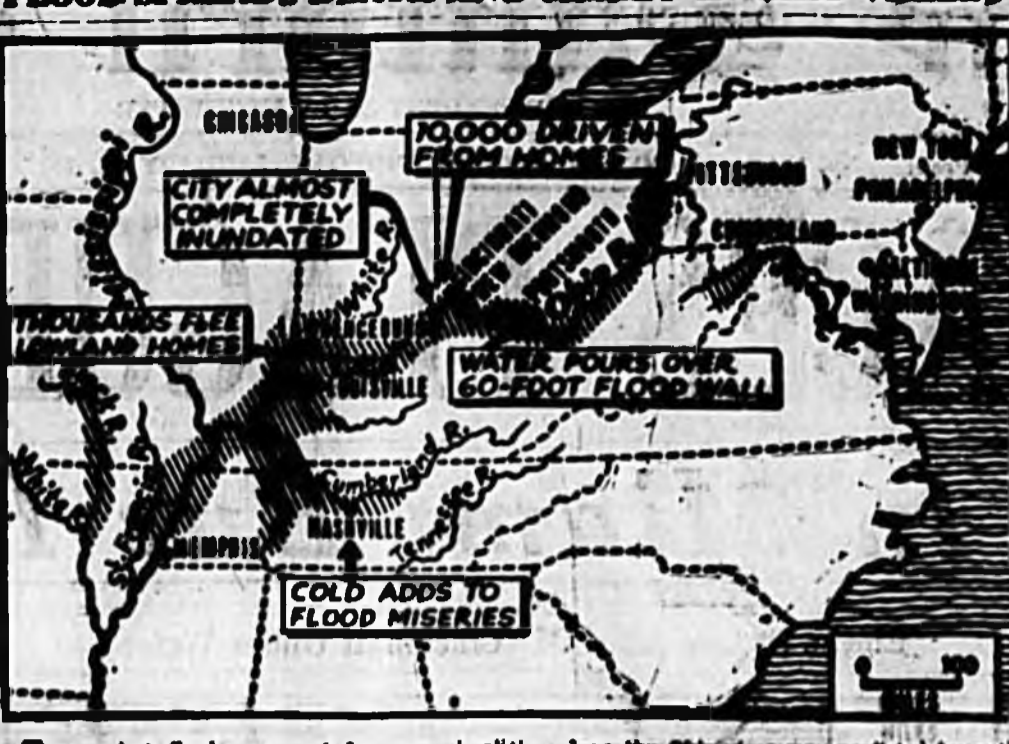

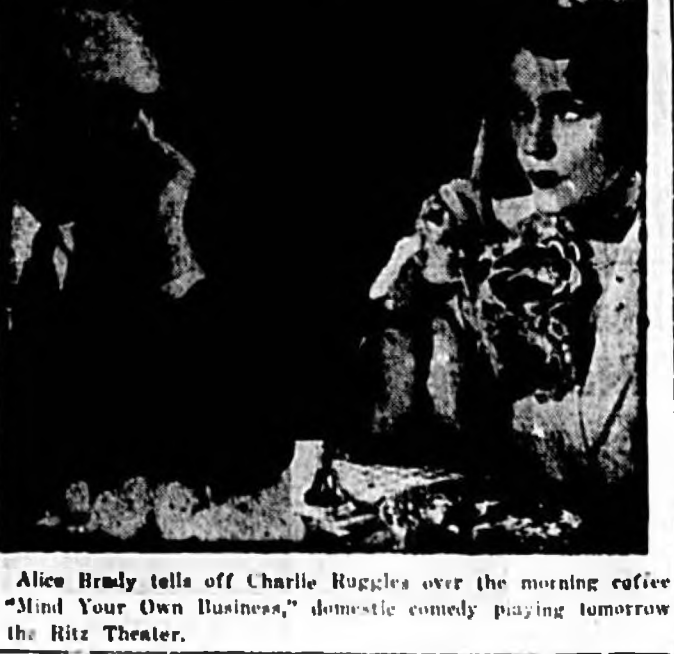
