Blizzard damage: \$585 million

NEW YORK - The four-day "Blizzard of 96" caused an estimated \$585 million in Insured-property damage, bad enough for only fifth-worst in the last 30 years of winter storm losses, insurers said Thursday.

The Jan. 6-9 storm rampaged through 17 states in the Ohio Valley, the mid-Atlantic states and the Northeast, dumping record amounts of snow. The president designated nine states as disaster areas.

Heavy snow, wind, ice and freezing damaged dwellings and commercial buildings, generating 300,000 insurance claims, according to the Property Claim Service division of American Insurance Services Group,

The PCS study is the official appraisal of the property and casualty insurance industry.

In terms of losses, last week's storm ranked behind 1994, with losses of \$800 million: 1993. \$1.75 billion: 1992, \$650 million; and 1983, \$880 million.

Rape suspect arrested

VENICE, Fla. - A man accused of raping an 86-year-old woman in her home was arrested after police found his fingerprints on a candy bar wrapper he dropped on the floor.

Richard A. Leonard was charged Tuesday with sexual battery, battery of a person over 65, burglary of an occupied dwelling and false imprisonment. He was being held at the Sarasota County Jall on \$250,000 bond.

Leonard is accused of breaking into the woman's condominium on July 22, raping her twice and stealing a necklace and ring from her jewelry box.

At some point, police say Leonard also raided her refrigerator, ate a Hershey chocolate bar and dropped the wrapper on the floor.

Venice Police Capt. Dan McGoogan blamed the six-month delay in Leonard's arrest on the backlog of cases at the Florida Department of Law Enforcement in Tampa. which is responsible for processing evidence.

No such thing as a free lunch

FORT PIERCE, Fia. - There's no longer a free lunch at the St. Lucie County Jail. No free breakfast or supper, either. Starting next month, inmates will be charged \$1.20 a day for their rations, whether they eat them or not.

The money will be taken out of "commissary accounts," money deposited by loved ones or from any cash the inmate was carrying when arrested. Inmates who work in the jail will get free meals. "The reason, of course, is so that those who are detained will carry a larger share of the cost of their in-carceration." said department spokesman Mark Weinberg.

Those who don't have the money in their account will still be fed, Weinberg said.

Sheriff Bobby Knowles spends about \$500,000 a year feeding inmates in the 680-bed facility. The balanced-but-bland meals actually cost a bit more than \$2.40 a day for each inmate.

"I don't think people want to come here from around the world for our food, but it's nutritious and meets all legal requirements." Weinberg said. "That's what it's intended to do,

Preparing for Bosnia

PENSACOLA, Fla. - Five Army reservists from a unit that serves as a unique bridge between soldiers and civilians are preparing to take their community-building skills to Bosnia.

Unlike the 20,000 other U.S. troops serving as NATO peacekeepers, those from the Pensacola-based 361st Civil Affaira Brigade will be working with the United Nations after arriving within the week.

Their mission is to help rebuild Bosnia in a way that will maintain the peace long after NATO forces have departed, said Col. Douglas Monroe, who in civilian life is a U.S. Customs agent in Mobile, Ala.

"We're the binders, the doctors, lawyers, the public administrators, and as such our job is to rebuild the infrastructure of the nation." Monroe said Wednesday from Fort Bragg. N.C.

The reservists, all temporarily called to active duty as part of the U.S. Army Special Operations Command, are training at Fort Bragg for a nine-month tour in the Balkan nation.

The others are Lt. Col. Michael Wiatrowski of Miami; Lt. Col. David Allen of Hattiesburg, Miss.; Lt. Col. Michael Whitehead of Tallahassee and Master Sgt. John Elam of Palm Bay.

Florida budget Chiles wants more for children, education

TALLAHASSEE - Gov. Lawton Chiles won't know for months how many of his budget wishes come true.

His \$39.6 billion spending plan released Thursday would give millions more to the governor's top priorities - education, programs for disadvantaged children and job training.

Chiles said he believes his 1996-97 proposal was something the Legislature could embrace. The budget for the fiscal year starting July 1 is the only legi ation lawmakers must pass when they convene March 5 for the 1996 session.

"Our children's initiative is a real commitment," the governor said. "It's more than one budget or one legislative session. It's about making an investment in Florida's

His proposed budget contains no new statewide taxes. But it would raise nearly \$78 million through a 7 percent increase in university tuition, a 50 cents a month surcharge on cellular phones and a 85 per passenger charge on so-called gambling 'cruises to nowhere."

Chiles called the proposed increases 'infinitesimal."

The governor's proposed budget for the 1998-97 flecal year represents a \$500 million, or 1.3 percent increase, over the current \$39.1 billion budget.

The state expects about \$1 billion in new

tax money from growth in the economy. But Chiles' budget only increases by half that much because of cuts in other areas such as

federal dollars for state programs.

Legislative leaders called the Democratic governor's recommendations a starting point heading into the 1996 session. They viewed much of it as a concession to political realities, with Republicans leading the Senate and sharing power in the House,
"I think he did reach out to us," said

House Republican Leader Dan Webster of Orlando.

"A common thread in Gov. Chiles' proposal is the effort to spend money where it really makes a difference in improving people's lives," said House Speaker Peter Rudy Wallace, D-St. Petersburg.

Doublet Calabro, president of Florida

TaxWatch. a government research group. said Chiles has proposed cutting programs and redistributing the money elsewhere a flocal exercise his predecessors didn't have to complete.

The governor has proposed cutting \$556 million from current government spending and eliminating 1,559 state positions in a variety of areas. Layoffs weren't expected as a result because the positions either are vacant or employees would be shifted to

The total number of state jobs would increase less than 1 percent to 125,240. with most of the new positions in prisons, elder affairs, social services and criminal justice.

"It's very much in the mainstream of what the Florida voters and taxpayers seem to want," Calabro said. "I don't think Floridians want wild-eyed schemes. I think they want to see initiatives that work.


The governor would spend an additional 8409 million on kindergarten through 12th grade, community colleges and universities. That would include money to buy more computers and high-tech equipment, ensure all students have textbooks and classroom materials, and expand programs for preschoolers.

Chiles proposed big increases for programs that provide day care for low-income families (\$60 million), health coverage for uninsured children (\$34 million), and prenatal care for poor pregnant women and infants (\$3.5 million).

"We're determined to better the lives of our younger citizens," he said. "It provides us with a blueprint that puts the needs of our children first.

Despite the gridlock in Washington over efforts to create block grants for welfare, Chiles has proceeded with his plan, called Work First, to require people now on public assistance to get job training and find a job.

The state would limit cash assistance to two years and provide health care and day care to welfare recipients. About 220,000 welfare mothers now receive cash payments from the state.



Heartbreak Hotel for King's kid and Michael

NEW YORK - The King of Pop's marriage has gone bust. Surgically altered superstar Michael Jackson was dumped Thursday by his wife of 20 months, Lisa Marie Presley - a sudden reversal of marital fortunes for a couple that had proclaimed their bliss on national television just seven months ago.

The couple had no children but shared a very large menagerie. It was the second marriage for Presley, 27, and the first for the increasingly odd Jackson, 37.

Why has Presley metaphorically left the building? In papers filed in Los Angeles, Elvis' only daughter cited irreconcilable differences - no real surprise when the husband's closest pre-wedding pals were Bubbles the chimp and serial wife Liz

Taylor. "Michael Jackson and Lisa Marie Presley have mutually agreed to go their separate ways. However they remain good friends," said Jackson's publicist, Lee Soliers.

In the three-page divorce filing. Presley listed their date of separation as Dec. 10, 1995 four days after Jackson's onstage collapse during rehearsals for a TV special in New York.

The good news for Jackson: He was shacked up with a good-looking, incredibly wealthy woman for almost two years. The bad news: He's still a very, very weird dude.

What made this marriage dif-

ferent? Well. Presley had a deeper voice, a darker complexion and less makeup than her husband. They appeared on national television together twice: Once for a creepy kiss at the MTV Awards, again to announce they were having sex. Both appeared topless in one of Jackson's

videos. The lokes were flying soon after news of the pending divorce.

"This hit Hollywood like a brick," Jay Leno said in his Thursday night monologue on his TV show. "What a shock! Michael Jackson and Lisa Marie are divorcing. What could have happened? Well, you know what that means ... kids, he's available.

Budget showdown

Dole prods Clinton administration on capital gains cut

WARHINGTON - The Clinton administration is considering lowering the top capital gains tax rate to 20 percent and eliminating the tax on home sales, according to Republicans close to the budget talks.

The administration plan would cost roughly 80 billion over seven years and would ecome effective the middle of this month, said the Republicans, who spoke on

condition of anonymity.

Though far less oweeping than the provisions in the vetoed Republican budget legislation, Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., said Thursday the Clinton plan had "some merit."

Dole spoke a day after Republicano canceled a White House bargaining session. The talks remain stalled, with no new sessions scheduled, and the two sides are blaming each other for the hall.

"The president has already decided the talks are ended, and he's started to lay the groundwork with this document for 1986, for his re-ejection bld." Dole said.

Senate Budget Committee Chairman Pete Domenici, R-N.M., predicted the White House and congressional Republicans would reach no budget agreement this year. "No, we're not going to have a deal," he said Thursday night on NET Political NewsTalk Network, a cable





Happy birthday Mr. Birnbaum

Ten score years ago, (that's 100), on January 20, 1896 Nathan Birnbaum was born in New York City. He's still with us, and has virtually become a legend. He changed his name many decades ago, and we know him now as George Burns.

In 1963, he wrote a book entitled, "How to live to be 100," and has certainly managed to follow his own suggestions.

Burns launched his show business career in 1903 by joining the Peewee Quartet at the age of seven. He is still singing, although it is now mostly in jest, having lost his vocal control. He followed that with vaudeville, traveling through all the entertainment circuits for almost 20 years.

With Gracie Allen, whom he later married, he began working in radio in 1932, carrying that over into television without ever stopping, except for a brief time following Gracie's death.

He has been the subject of books, discussed his life and beliefs with many interviewers. and has been honored by presidents as well as co-workers in his own show business world.

There is no doubt, George Burns has the respect of all who know him, and many who do not. He has not only given us many de-cades of smiles and laughs, but at times his philosophy has been extremely astute.

Unfortunately, there are some who are now saying Burns is "starting to lose it." They say he is not quite as sharp as he used to be in dealing with the public. (What do they ex-

pect?)
The point here is that we not only have Burns of national prominence, but others, some right here in Burnord and Seminole County, who have been with us for 80, 90, even 100 years. Are we paying any attention to them? Are we bothering to take time to learn anything from them? Do we wish them happy birthday, merry Christmas or happy valentine's day when the times come?

Burns is a celebrity. As such he has had celebrity status. In our own families and our own towns however, we have our own celebrities.

Congratulations, George Burns aka Nathan Birnbaum for 100 years. And congratulations to all the others who have been survivors. The younger age today may have sophisticated computers and electronic thinking-machines. but you can still teach us much, if we but bother to listen.

An end to race-based scholarships?

Years ago, waiting for a college president in his office, I picked up a copy of The Chronicle of Higher Education. I have not missed an issue since. This large-size weekly often breaks stories that reverberate far beyond campuses.

Recently, for instance, Paulette Walker reported that Colorado Attorney General Gale Norton has "told the state's 28 public colleges they should no longer provide race-specific scholarships, nor should they help select students to receive such scholarships from outside groups." But, "when a private organization provides a race-based scholarship" and itself selects the recipient, college officials may accept the money.

Through the Chronicle, I have obtained the Colorado attorney general's actual memorandum. In it she explains why she believes that race-based scholarships violate the Constitution:

"When a public institution chooses to devote some of its limited scholarship dollars to a program which is open only to certain racial and ethnic groups ... the institution excludes other applicants because of their race or ethnicity." She cites the 1995 Supreme Court decision

(Adarand v. Pena): "The Constitution protects persons not groups." The attorney general does note that a racial

in a memorandum bristling with Supreme Court and other judicial precedents, Gale Norton emphasizes that "the only interest which has been found to justify race-based decision making is the need to remedy the present day effects of specific incidents of prior government discrimination ... a racial classification cannot rest on some generalized assumption that discrimination exists in society or on a particular campus."

Since "there are no specific findings of intentional racial discrimination by any of the institutions of higher education in Colorado." scholarships that exclude all but one race are

a "racially diversified student body" be considered a compelling state interest. U.S. Supreme Court case law is undeniably clear on that, despite the insistence to the contrary of the head of the Civil Rights Division in the U.S. Justice Department.

In an interview with the Chronicle of Higher Education, Gale Norton said that instead of race-specific criteria for scholarships, colleges ought to use financial need and/or a disadvantaged background. This is just what Justice William O. Douglas suggested in 1974 in his dissent in DeFunis v. Odegaard:

"Decisions should be made on the basis of individual attributes, rather than according a preference solely on the basis of race." Included. for instance, said Douglas, would be the qualities of "a black applicant who pulled himself out of the ghetto" and "a poor Appalachian white" who had overcome other barriers.

Obviously, race must be taken into account whenever there is specific discrimination. But when general racial preferences - intentional and with government support - discriminate against individuals who are not of that race, the Constitution has been substantially diminished. This is also true of gender and ethnic preferences



now deceased Mr. David and Mrs. Pearl Rachel Marie Wright Wright, began her life's journey through the challenges which would sharpen her view of humanity and develop her character.

As a small child, she grew up in a disciplined family in which the children learned all the social graces. She, however, like the other children who grew up on Lake Avenue in the Goldsboro section of Sanford, explored and enjoyed the revelry afforded by the woods which adjoined the State Farmers Market property. To this day, the woods still run from Highway 17-92, behind Sanford Middle School (which was at that time Seminole High), and border Lake Avenue.

She attended preschool under Maude Collins at the corner of 13th Street and Lake Avenue. While there, Rachel was a frequent participant in the activities of the school, including the annual Tom Thumb Wedding. Then she went on to Goldsboro Elementary where her first mentor. Thelma DeBose, helped to further her lifelong love of words and knowledge.

When she reached sixth grade at Crooms Academy, she was unaware that her life was soon to take a dramatic departure from the childhood cares which had surrounded her-Without warning, Rachel contracted the deadly disease Pemphigus which resulted in. among other complications, blindness. During Rachel's Illness, Melissa Roberts, her teacher, became a constant source of solace and gifts. Rachel was also blessed to have one of Seminole County's most humane physicians. Dr. Orville Barks, as her family doctor. At a time when color often prohibited equal treatment of patients, Dr. Barks honored his Hippocratic oath and the essence of himself by treating Rachel with devotion which led to her survival.

Rachel went through many years of treatment and travels, by Greyhound bus, to and from Orange Memorial Hospital in Orlando, where Rachel and other people of color had to sit under trees and wait to be attended to in the basement of the hospital where often the fumes from the morgue would aggravate her already delicate condition.

Somehow, the good, nevertheless, always evidenced itself in Rachel's life. After a long process of recovery, she resumed her education. Dorothy Mahon Morrison, a prominent family friend and wife of W.A. Morrison, owner of the Strickland-Morrison Ford dealership. arranged for Rachel to attend the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind in St.

Augustine. There, Rachel mastered her studies, began writing her own poetry and learned to play the plano.

She returned to Sanford and later went to New York. There, while working at the Lighthouse for the Blind, she earned her GED from The University of the State of New York in 1967. In that same year, after the death of her father, Rachel came back to Sanford to assist her mother.

Two years later, Rachel worked briefly with the Lighthouse for the Blind in West Palm Beach. Returning to Sanford. Rachel eventually entered and graduated from Seminole Community College and then went on to receive a bachelor of science degree at Florida State University in 1979.

Upon graduating from FSU, Rachel worked for the Division for the Blind in Orlando. A year later, she accepted a job with the Idaho Division for the Blind. When her mother died in 1987, Rachel again made Florida her home.

For eight years, Rachel worked for the Florida Division of Blind Services in Cocoa and Daytona, where she was a rehabilitation specialist who touched many lives and enjoyed inspiring the adults and children in her care.

In 1994, Rachel was diagnosed with cancer. She was determined to survive and to fulfill all her dreams - primarily helping young children cope with and overcome their blindness. She rebounded and continued her work, but a year later, she could see the coming of the end. This made her all the more determined to win the toughest battle of her adult life.

During her illness. Rachel was surrounded by her entire family. She also had another cadre of caretakers from Hospice of Central Florida, North Team, headed by Susan V. Morin. Among these was Staff Chaplain Maureen Kramlinger with whom Rachel, in her last days, continued development of her spiritual attributes, prominent from early childhood. The Lions Club also offered their support.

On Jan. 4, 1996, Rachel Marte Wright, in the quietude of her home and in the midst of her relatives, conceded that God knows best and left this life - enriched by her presence and her contributions.

Because (she) could not stop for death, He kindly stopped for (her).


Syria's Assad may be too set in his ways

WASHINGTON - Is Syrian President Hafes al-Assad truly ready to make peace with israel?

In background briefings, peace negotiators and U.S. State Department officials answer a resounding "yes." Secretary of State Warren Christopher also appears optimistic as he takes another stab at shuttle diplomacy in an attempt to bridge the gap between these historic rivals.

But Intelligence officials we've spoken with say the 65-year-old Assad is in no hurry to make a deal with Israel .. even though he's not getting any younger and still wants very much to get back control of the atrategic Golan Heights.

To regain the Golan Heights - and peace with Israel -would require a dramatic, personal about-face by Syria and its fron-fisted leader. Assad has offered "full peace" in exchange for Israel's complete

never agree to a

perspective, a complete opening of borders, exchange of ambassadors and Assad's agreement to stop harboring terrorists within his own borders. Without such an olive branch, it would be

political and strategic folly for Israel to abandon the military edge it gains by controlling the Golan Heights. The Israeli public would never agree to a peace that didn't include a dramatic gesture on the part of Assad, whose leadership so far has been defined by his hatred of Israel.

Make no mistake about one thing, however: Any decision to make peace with Israel rests squarely with Assad himself. A quarter century after taking power. Assad still rules Syria like a dictator, making all major decistons himself.

Unfortunately, this might be the biggest deterrent to peace. While other Arab leaders, like PLO Chairman Yasser Arafat and Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak, have taken great risks to make peace with Israel. Assad remains stubbornly deflant of the peace process. According to a "Top Secret" psychological profile compiled by the CIA. which we have seen. Assad is an intensely private man, uncreative yet disciplined -traits which might explain his reluctance to cut a deal with Israel.

'He is known to work many hours a day with few outside commitments," the CIA report says. "Hours are unimportant; he calls his staff even in the middle of the night to discuss problems. He is single-minded in his desire to be an effective leader without sensitivity to others' needs and activities."

The report continues: "He perceived a need for disciplining himself in order to reduce any stress that would result from encountering the unexpected. Ordering one's existence is most satisfying to such personalities and lack of same is to be avoided."

This self-discipline is what helped him rise from humble beginnings in a desolate mountain village that was home for the Alawites, a sect considered somewhat heretical by mainline Muslims. Since then, he has managed to make his sect the rulers of Syria, and thus a strong influence in Middle East politics.

Even his original family name. Wahish (wild beast) was changed to Assad (lion) to add a touch of class. But State Department cables, describing meetings between Assad and American officials, including President Clinton, have described him as "charming" and "softspoken" at times.

Even today, however, Assad remains something of an enigma to Middle East observers.

'By the year 2000," he said. "89 percent of the jobs will require more than just a high school diploma."

Schools need to be reformed in order to better prepare students for the work world, he said. Students don't just need a diploma. They need applied course work that prepare them for jobe.

A fast-paced video produced in the district to promote the School to Work program for students was shown to those attendance.

Youngsters will be encouraged to take part in the programs in order to give themselves more choices. Students are learning. the 15-year-old narrator said. that everything they learn in school has a practical workplace application.

Brogan applauded the district for what is being done in the

tech prep program here. "Seminole County is making successes in education," he said. "It is working because you've got local government, the local school system, the community, the parents, the youngsters, everybody working more closely together. You're innovative.

And, guess what? It shows. In Seminole County you're not waiting for the train to pull into the bus station with something new. You are going out there and doing what it takes to give students the technical skills and the academics they need."



Explain exactly what constitutes stealing and why it is wrong, ilt would have been better for this to have started very early in his life.) Establish clear consequences and penalties for his stealing. Aside from returning the item, he should be made to make restitution in another way, such as doing chores for the people he has stolen from.

Finally, provide rigid super-vision. Make it clear that he can expect regular room checks and even pocket checks at random intervals. The best thing you can do for your son is to make him understand how dreadfully serious this problem is.
