

Ford's NYC Plan Passes First Senate Test, Friday Is Next

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford's \$2.3 billion loan plan for New York City passed its first Senate test today as opponents lost overwhelmingly in an attempt to send it back to committee.

By a vote of 57 to 23, the Senate voted to table a motion by Sen, Jesse Helms, R-N.C., to send the loan bill back to the Banking Committee.

Delay In Defense Spending? WASHINGTON (AP) - The White House budget office

is urging a delay in asking Congress for a new nuclearpowered aircraft carrier to help hold down defense requests next year, administration sources report. The Pentagon reportedly is preparing to ask President Ford to reject this proposal by the Office of Budget and Management on grounds that a year's delay would only

boost the already high cost of a carrier because of in-This could prove to be an early test for Donald Rumsfeld, recently installed by Ford as secretary of defense after the President fired James R. Schlesinger. Only recently Schlesinger said he was forced to resign after objecting to what he called an inadequate defense budget

House Gets Tax Cut Bill

planned by Ford for next year.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The bill to extend this year's tax cut heads for action on the House floor where liberals will attempt to end some tax advantages, including the socalled "Perot amendment."

The House is expected to send the bill to the Senate tonight or Thursday. Both chambers face time pressures te finish the tax-cut extension before adjourning for Christmas either Dec. 12 or Dec. 19 because the tax cuts now in effect expire Dec. 31

Internal Revenue Service Commissioner Donald C. Alexander said Tuesday the government will require employers to increase the amount of taxes withheld from workers' paychecks after Dec. 31 if no taxcut extension has been approved. He ruled out any temporary administrative extension of current tax rates.

Democrats Seeking Issues

WASHINGTON (AP) - Democratic governors are trying to show some political muscle now and increase their campaign influence in 1976, but their chairman says they'll do it by seeking to shape issues, not anoint a

Gov. Philip Noel of Rhode Island, chairman of the Democratic Governors Conference, said Tuesday he wants to make sure governors are heard before the party stakes out its positions in the next presidential campaign. Noel will head the party's 1976 platform committee. Noel said in the past the governors have paid too little attention to political decisions at the national level and that has led to enactment of programs that are undue burdens on the governors and state governments.

FBI Discredited Black Leader

WASHINGTON (AP) - The late FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover approved a plan to discredit a Miciwest black militant leader with anonymous letters accusing him of adultery and of being a bureau informant, according to FBI documents.

The documents, made available by the Senate telligence committee, show that the bureau's campaign against Charles E. Koen lasted from 1968 to 1971 and was approved #1 each step of the way by the late FBI Director

However, it was unclear whether the letters were ever actually sent to Koen, whom a committee spokeswoman said is currently a minister in Cairo, Ill.



Hit-Run Thief Escapes

A bold hit-and-run thief eluded Santord Police Tuesday night at Sanford Plaza shopping center after snatching a \$600 diamond ring from the hand of

a jewelry store manager. Police sealed off a wooded area on the east and north sides of the shopping center after a black male asked to see the ring from a display at Zales's Jewelers and then snatched it from the hand of manager W W. Boatner.

Boatner told police the thief. wearing a blue jacket and white, floppy hat, ran from the store and through a nearby coin-operated laundry. Lt. Ralph Russell and police

patrolmen sealed off the area adjacent to the shopping center and used a Winter Park Police Department K-9 unit in a 70minute search.

Patrolmen Rick Dearing said the police dog tracked the suspect through the wooded area to a spot on U.S. 17-92 between Action Honda and ABC Lounge, north of the shopping at center. Police said the jeweiry thief is believed to have escaped in a waiting car.

Official Killed By Trooper

Was Legally Intoxicated

IN BRIEF

ORLANDO (AP) - A Brevard County official killed by a Florida Highway Patrol trooper who mistakenly thought the man was driving a stolen car was highly intoxicated at the time of his death, officials say. A medical examiner's report shows that Frank D. Booth, 50, had an alcohol blood content of .28 per cent when he was shot while parked on the side of the Beeline Expressway Saturday, Orange County sheriff's spokes man Richard King said Tuesday. A motorist with an alcohol level of .10 per cent is consid-

ered intoxicated under state law. Booth, who headed a job program in Brevard County was shot by trooper Robert Rennie, 25, after Rennie received a radio report that the highway patrol computer listed the license tag on Booth's car as stolen. The report was later found to be in error.





Spain has been the only one under a dictatorship. The parliamentary tradition is weak in Spain. Compromise has seemed alien to the unbending Spanish spirit. Extremism marks the history of the Spanish people.

It was the extremism of the left that brought about the Army officers' revolt against the Republic, the revolt Franco

As caudillo, leader of the nation, he has presided over a period of great economic growth for Spain. But parliamentary nstitutions have remained rudimentary. There has been little freedom for the press and trade unions. It is time for Spain's political progress to catch up with the country's economic

The problem for Juan Carlos, succeeding Franco as head of state, is to bring about the political modernization of Spain while preserving political stability.

The nearby example of Portugal shows the dangers. Since the Portuguese dictatorshop was cverthrown last year, the country has been thrown into chaos. Some observers believe civil war has been averted only because the Portuguese people

The Lakewood Baptist Church sponsored the rock conflagration last week, burning some \$2,200 worth of records and tapes. Associate Pastor Charlie Boykin said the church is campaigning against rock music because the sensual eat unleashes lust He said he had seen statistics which showed

Landers said the church probably should have obtained a permit from his agency before lighting its fire. He said open bonfires are exempt from permit

regulations if they are for ceremonial or recreational purposes. Landers said the record burn-in presumably was a creemonial function. However, he said the exemption does not apply and a permit must be obtained if the fire causes "excessive visible emissions." That's bureacratese for a cloud of thick, black smoke,

Landers said vinyl records most likely would create unacceptable smoke when burned. Boykin conceeded that the record fire was pretty
