Loch Arbor Woman Dies In Midnight Fire

Maxine Thompson, 57, a secretary for local government agencies for 15 years, died in a midnight fire that destroyed her Sanford home at 215 Vinewood Drive, Loch Arbor, sheriffs deputies

Mrs. Thompson, a widow, lived alone at the address, and had been recuperating at home for the last two weeks with a cracked wrist in a cast, of-

She joined the Sanford Airport Authority as secretary to Airport Manager J. S. "Red" Cleveland in 1970 after serving as secretary to the late Bob Brown, Seminole County Zoning Director

Neighbors reported flames leaping from the south end garage and kitchen area of Mrs. Thompson's concrete block home at 11:50 p.m. Sheriff's deputy R. S. Morton arrived on the scene four minutes later, according to sheriff's reports and said he was unable to gain entry to the smoke-

Seminole County Fire units arrived minutes later and broke through a bedroom window on the north end of the house.

Deputies said firemen found Mrs. Thompson lying on the bedroom floor near the window but were unable to revive her. She was pronounced dead at Seminole Memorial Hospital.

Fire units, using water tanker trucks because the Loch Arbor residential area has no fire hydrants, contained the blaze to the garage, kitchen, rear porch and central areas of the house which were gutted by the fire.

Authorities said Mrs. Thompson is believed to have died of smoke inhalation but an autopsy was to be performed today to determine the cause of





President Stumps Country For His Energy Program

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) - President Ford is continuing to stump for his embattled energy program, which has encountered new criticism from some of the nation's governors. Ford flies to Kansas for statehouse meetings and an address before the state legislature in Topeka today on the second leg of his journey. He will hold a news conference tonight. In addition to a speech and a meeting with five Southwest governors in Houston Monday, Ford also held a surprise private meeting with former Treasury Secretary John B. Connally, who faces trial this spring in federal bribery and perjury charges. White House Press Secretary Ron Nessen reported the two men talked abut energy and the economy but did not talk politics. "Gov. Connally's legal problems were not discussed," he said.

Retirees Providing Training

NEW YORK (AP) -- Recently retired U.S. Army aviators working for a private American company run by their former commanding officer are providing the Shah of Iran's emerging army with the latest tactical training in combat helicopter assault warfare. Veterans of the 10year attempt to perfect air mobile warfare in Vietnam, these officers are part of a 1,500-man American civilian force assembled in Iran in the past 18 months by retired U.S. Army Maj. Gen. Delk M. Oden, former commanding general of the U.S. Army Aviation Center at Ft. Rucker, Ala. As president of Bell Helicopter International, Oden is directing his men to help create the Iran Sky Cavalry brigade, a strike force using helicopter gunships and



Kissinger Is 'Hopeful'

JERUSALEM (AP) — Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger is "very hopeful for chances of progress," his spokesman reported today as the American peace negotiator held his second meeting in less than 12 hours with Israeli Premier Yitzhak Rabin. Rabin's press aide said hard bargaining would not begin

until after Kissinger visits Cairo on Wednesday. The secretary of state and the premier met for breakfast at Rabin's residence and then were to go into a full working session with their advisers. Kissinger arrived Monday to begin his latest Middle East

peace shuttle and met for almost two hours Monday night with Rabin and an Israeli negotiating team. Spokesmen for both sides said there was a "general review" of positions. An Israeli spokesman said the purpose of the meeting was to agree on an agenda for future negotiations, and "no specifics were discussed."

Gunman Kills 2 In Ireland

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (AP) - A gunman killed two Roman Catholics in the first hours of the Irish Republican Army's new cease-fire. There was speculation that Protestant extremists were trying to sabotage the truce because they believed it was the first step in a British sellout to the Irish Catholics fighting to unite Northern Ireland with the Irish Republic There was no immediate reaction from the IRA, but its cease-fire proclamation did not rule out a resumption of guerrilla warfare against Protestant extremists. It

Four other Catholics were slain Saturday night, Sunday and Monday. Thirteen persons have been killed since the IRA's Christmas cease-fire expired on Jan. 16, and the official death toll since August 1969 has risen to 1,157.

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) - Space agency of ficials say a strike of 200 workers at the Kennedy Space Center will not delay a joint U.S.-Russian space mission unless the walkout lasts until June.

Glenn Lashley, president of local 1163 of the 1 ternational Association of Machinists, said Monday that the walkout probably would delay the joint Apollo-Soyuz space mission July 15 and launch of a Telsat communications satellite March 6. But Walter Kapryan, director of launch operations, said

the strike would affect the manned space project only if workers remained out until early June. John Neilon, director of unmanned launch operations, would not say if the strike was expected to delay the launch of the communications satellite.

Previous strikes at the space center have never delayed a launch, officials said.
