Henderson Airfield Still Held By U. S.

Offensive To Drive Japs From Guadalcanal Into Sea Is Underway

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3. (AP)—Navy Secretary Frank Knox warned today that the "most optimistic" about the Solomon Islands situation, asserting that no doubt, the Japanese fleet would be driven from Guadalcanal and added there is still a bitter, tough fight.

(By Associated Press)

In the Solomon Islands, the American offensive to drive Japan's invasion forces into the sea is apparently underway in the jungle-clad hills of Guadalcanal as United States Marines, supported by a terrific air assault, hammered the enemy farther from the island's prized airfield.

Swiftly following the withdrawal of the Japanese fleet, American "devil dog" fighters drove the Japanese back two miles in one sector.

Faced by fighter planes and dive bombers which altered enemy artillery, the American ground force, strong small-scale offensives and at one point a land of Marines made a two-mile advance last night.

The attack was launched to the west of Henderson Airfield and a "small force" of Marines succeeded in driving across the Maclean River.

The Japanese were reported to be retreating slowly to a command post.

This retreat came Sunday after fighter planes and bombers which hammered enemy positions in the northwest sector of Guadalcanal. American air forces also pounded away at enemy bases in the Rekata Bay area—125 miles northwest of Guadalcanal.

Earlier the Navy revealed that U. S. submarines hammering a way at Japanese supply lines extending from Japan to the North Solomon, had 10 more ships to the toll of destruction and damage wrought against the enemy.

The undersea blows were independent of those struck in the Solomons area last week by American planes and ships which probably saved Guadalcanal by hammering seven Jap men-of-war and destroying more than 100 planes in the biggest air-sea battle since Midway.

Last week's sea battle forced a huge Jap invasion armada to retreat to bases in the North Solomons and left the Americans with at least temporary control of waters around Guadalcanal.

Taking advantage of this opening, American surface vessels pounded enemy positions on Guadalcanal—as reported in Sunday's communication.

This bombardment, it developed, was the prelude to the land offensive launched by the Marine forces Sunday.

With huge four-motored Army Flying Fortresses spearheading the drive, they crossed the Maclean River and attacked the Japs in the westward of Henderson Field.

Legion Opposes New Amendment To Youth Bill

A resolution declaring American Legion opposition to the amendment passed by the Senate to the Selective Service Act which will require that draftees of 18 or 19 years of age must be trained within this country at least 12 months before being sent into foreign service, was passed last evening at a meeting of Campbell-Lossing Post at the Legion Hut.

Lloyd F. Boyle, service officer and former Post commander, was instructed by Commander Neil Smith to draw up the resolution which will be sent to Florida senators and to Representatives Joe Hendricks and Lee Green.

Action of Senator Claude Pepper in opposing the amendment was commended by the Legionnaires, and they ordered a letter be sent Senator Pepper lauding his stand.

On the other hand, Senator C. O. Andrews will be urged to consider his vote in support of the amendment when the bill comes up for final action.

"We feel that any bill requiring an 18-month period of training by the young men, will definitely hamper the war effort," said Commander Smith, who also pointed out that military authorities in his opinion, are the best judges as to the length of training periods, and that there was no time to hamper them with restrictions and regulations as to how to conduct the war.

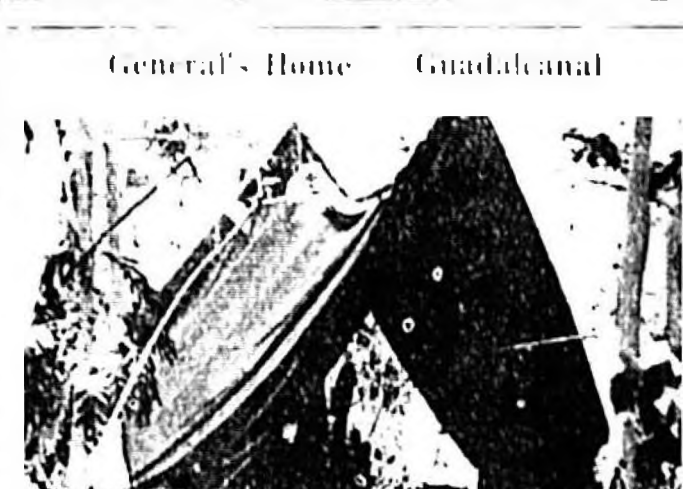

Naval Station Commissioned

When Ed Higgins and the Chamber of Commerce first began working for a new airport at Sanford some two years ago, there were plenty of people here who said nothing would ever come of it and a few who objected to the comparatively small percentage of the total cost to be borne by the City. Last July when work actually began on the Naval Air Station, there were some who insisted it would never be completed until after the war was over.

But today as the station nears completion and the commissioning ceremonies "take place," we believe everyone admits a wonderful job has been done, and a few who will see it perhaps for the first time will regard it as a miracle of transformation. Never before in the history of this town has so much been accomplished in so small a period of time.

With hundreds of sailors already here and hundreds of cadets soon to be brought here for special flight training, this new air station may well prove the salvation of Sanford's economic life. Hundreds of our best young men have gone away to join the Army or the Navy. Hundreds more have left to work in defense factories. There are still other hundreds yet to go before this war is over.

And so Sanford needs the new air station no less than the air station needs Sanford. With complete co-operation we can go a long way together. We can help them and they can help us.

And local Doubting Thomases must admit: "They tackled the thing that could be done, and they did it!"

The Child's Outlook

Wendell Willkie after his recent trip around the world is more convinced than ever that men and ships and planes will win the war, but that American homes must help secure the peace by giving children a world outlook. Writing in the November issue of "Parents Magazine," Mr. Willkie says: "We can best justify the sacrifices of the men who are struck down in this war by the creation of a world in which those who survive them, and their sons and daughters, can live in freedom and in peace."

"We cannot wait until the war is over to begin work on that aim," he declares. "We must build a world in which men of all races and creeds and religions and nations can live in peace and harmony, in which the just fruits of enterprize will find their just fulfillment, in which children may look forward to a constantly better world, free of hatred and bitterness and narrow isolationism and of economic degradation."

Mr. Willkie adds: "To build such a world the nations of the earth need each other's help. It will be a new idea to many Americans that the United States may in the future need help from other nations. But we do need help if our idea of personal liberty, of justice, of equality, of hope, growth and expansion are to survive. We can keep America to ourselves though I doubt if the America we keep to ourselves would be free. . . . If we are to have freedom we must share freedom."

"Already we owe much to other people who are fighting for freedom. After Dunkirk the British stopped the German tide while we were slowly rousing ourselves from the delusions of peace. We had an opportunity to get our industries on a war footing, thanks to the brave Russian people. And how greatly in debt we are to China for the five long years of fighting by which she checked the Japanese."

"American liberty is a religion. It is a thing of the spirit. It is an aspiration on the part of people for not alone a free life but a better life. . . . Now it is our duty to look, and to help our children to look, beyond the bloody horizons of the present, toward the shadows of the future which rise up like majestic promises of what may be our reward. Never has there existed such hope for mankind as exists today. Never have there existed on the surface of this planet so many human beings who know what freedom is and who are determined that, though it cost their lives, it shall endure."

The French Ships

At the Fall of France, some of its fleet lay in French harbors. Some of it lay at Dakar and other colonial points. Some of it lay at Laval. Hitler had wanted to get his hands on those ships, but Marshal Petain was able to hold him off. Laval has no moral or patriotic inhibitions. Darlan appears to play the Hitler game. Hitler thinks now he can get those ships.

It makes a great difference to both sides who has them. If Hitler can add them to an active navy, they will be a great asset. If they can be held inactive, as they have been so far, their menace to our side is removed. There's a much better chance of invasion. If the United Nations could take them over that would be a great gain but such possibility seems out of the question in the near future.

The B. B. C. recently broadcast that Hitler had sent an ultimatum to Laval, demanding the surrender of all merchant ships, French or foreign, now in French harbors. If he gets these, he will be after the naval shipping next.

The French do not like these demands. Unarmed, they have been helpless. Now assistance is drifting in, so far as a mere trickle. Their day is coming, however. Hitler knows it. That's why he is in haste about French ships.

Rats Controlled By Poisoned Potatoes

GAINESVILLE, Nov. 3. (Special)—Sweet potato baits dusted with zinc phosphite controls water rats, rice rats and cotton rats in truck and cane fields of the Florida Everglades and Dade County, says L. C. Whitehead, district agent with the Fish and Wildlife Service.

Field tests conducted recently by H. J. Spencer, Fish and Wildlife Service representative in Gainesville, showed that sweet potatoes dusted with the zinc phosphite and distributed down the rows were very effective in killing the rats. The zinc phosphite is cheaper and more easily obtained than poisons which have been used for the purpose.

Community-wide control is necessary for the poisoning to be effective.

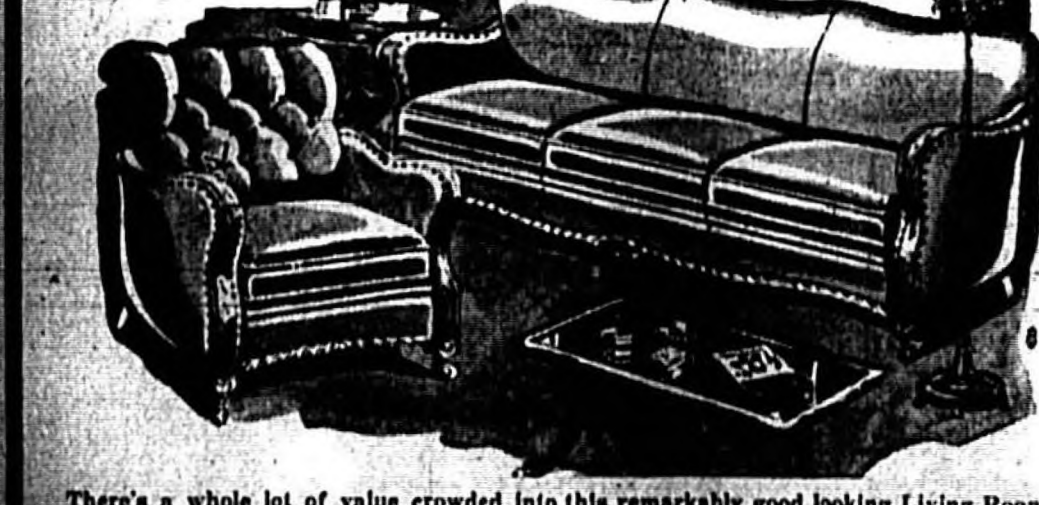

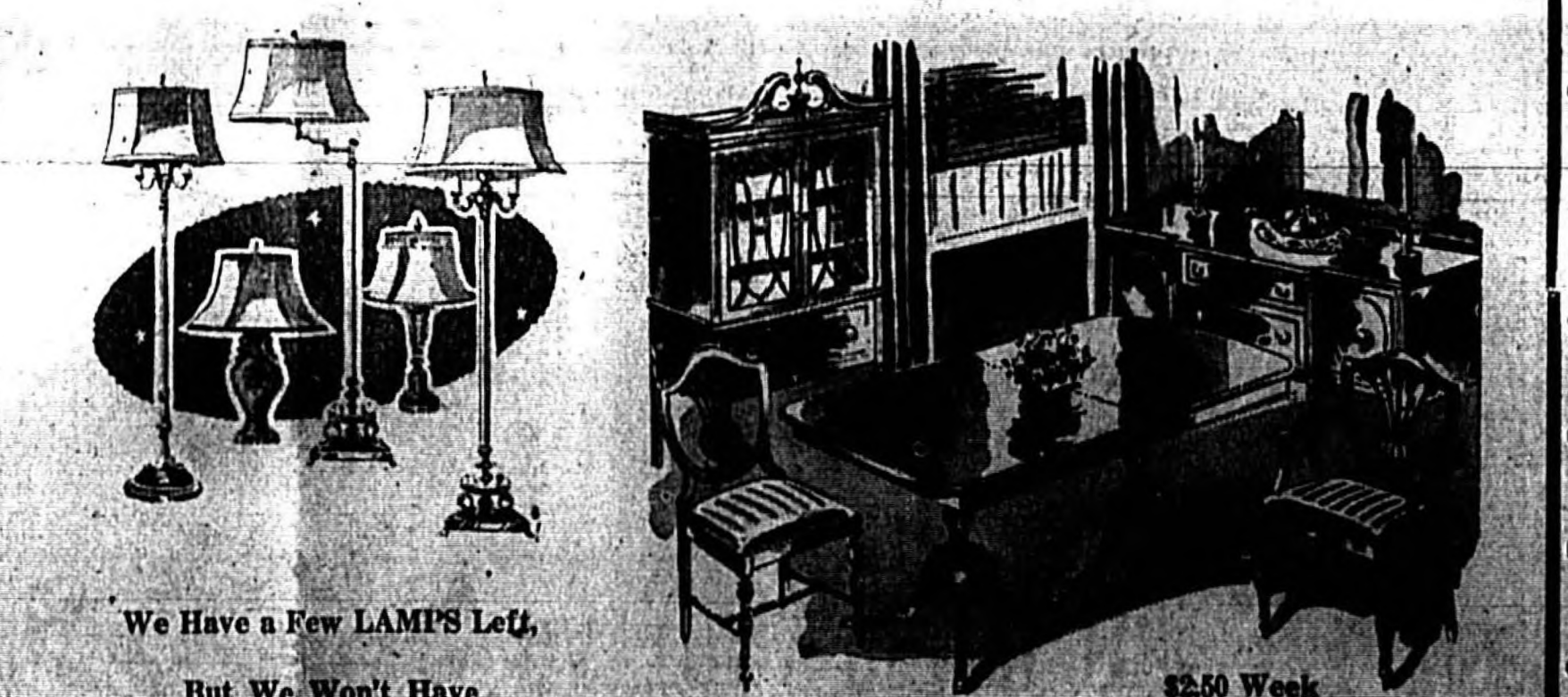

British Army Wins Flaming Six-Hour Battle In Egypt

Allied Planes Pound Retreating Enemy Forces As Fight Picks Up Speed

CAROLINE, Nov. 4. (AP)—Directly behind the British heavy bombers destroyed the medium sized merchant vessels and approximately half of the jetties in the harbor of Tobruk, a United States Army Middle East communication announced today.

Britain's desert armies were reported today to have won the first major test in the new campaign for Egypt by routing the Axis in a flaming six-hour battle and jeopardizing Field Marshal Erwin Rommel's entire position on the El Alamein front, 80 miles west of Alexandria.

A Cairo bulletin said the British Eighth Army again thrust itself forward in two sectors along the 38-mile front Monday, and again yesterday after defeating Rommel's tank forces Monday.
