**Price Increases** 

Though prices have risen very little during the past three or four months (actually four percent from December 15 to March 15) there has been a noticeable increase in the cost of living since one year ago. A comparison of the price level indexes for the week ending April 21, 1934, with those for the week ending April 22, 1933, (the base year 1926 being taken as 100) reveals the following increases:

Farm products, 69.7 this year as compared with 44.6 in 1983: Foods, 66.6 and 56.2; hides and leather products, 89.7 and 69.1; textile products, 75.2 and 61.4; fuel and lighting materials, 73.1 and 62.4; metals and metal products, 87 and 76.8; building materials, 86.3 and 70.2; chemicals and drugs, 75.5 and 71.3; housefurnishing goods, 83.1 and 72.2; and miscellaneous, 69.3 and 57.7.

Food costs comprise the largest part of the budget for the average American family. Retail prices for foods are collected in 61 cities by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The average for the United States for the last week in March shows the following changes in comparison with the same

date a year carlier. Dairy products: Milk averaged 11.1 cents a quart, a gain of 9.9 percent; cheese averaged 24.2 cents a pound, a gain of 15.8 percent; and butter averaged 81.9 cents a pound, a gain of 23.8 percent. Beef: Hound steak averaged 25.1 cents a pound, a






