U. S. Forces Repulse Japs Killing 700

War Department Says It Is One Of Most Serious Reverses Suffered By Enemy

American Loses Relatively Small

Corregidor Defenders Account For Total Of 15 Tokyo Planes

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5.—(AP)—President Roosevelt today set Feb. 10 as the day for registration of all male citizens of the nation between the ages of 18 and 44 who have not registered previously.

Men in this age group will be subject to military service. The President's proclamation made no mention of the registration of men between the ages of 18 and 44 who are to be registered later but who will be exempt from service with the armed forces under the present legislation.

(AP—Associated Press) The War Department today announced Gen. Douglas MacArthur's Philippine Army repulsed a Japanese attack with heavy enemy losses, estimating at least 700 of the enemy were killed. American—Filipino losses were described as relatively small. The War Department asserted this was one of the most serious reverses suffered by the invaders since the war began.

At the same time the government said Corregidor forces shot down five more Japanese bombers, raising the official count over Corregidor to 15.

Washington reported the Japanese are increasing pressure on American and Filipino defenders north and northwest of Manila. The British, who fled from Tokyo this large fleet transports, presumably carrying reinforcements for the Philippine invasion, are moving southward toward Luzon Island.

Gen. MacArthur's report of conditions in the city of Manila, into which Japanese troops marched last week, convinced that in addition to putting up a vigorous defense of the Philippines areas still under his control the General had been satisfied with the lines of information reaching into the enemy-occupied territory.

With the January through December record for fatal accidents in the United States estimated at about 100,000, the year 1941 has attained the unenviable distinction of being the second consecutive year to show an upward trend in the accident fatality rate, according to figures from the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company. The 1941 number of deaths from accidents is expected to exceed by 3,000 the 1940 total of 96,885.

"In ordinary years this adverse report would be shocking enough. But, today, with the memory of the loss of 3,000 lives in a single day's encounter of the war, our losses through accidents are less impressive. Nevertheless the need for safe practices in our daily activities must not be forgotten," the Metropolitan says.

As in previous years, motor vehicle accidents figured prominently in the accident fatality increase, with a total of over 39,600 deaths exceeding the 1940 total by at least 5,000. Last minute data may even bring the motor vehicle death tally to a figure above the 39,643 that made 1937 the previous peak year. For more than a decade, motor vehicle accidents, which account for four out of every ten accidental deaths, have been the leading cause of fatal mishap.

Greatly increased industrial activity during 1941 is given by the insurance companies as the reason for the sharp rise in deaths due to occupational accidents. Data available indicate that there may be some 1,500 more fatal accidents in this class for 1941 than for the previous year. Most of the rise can, of course, be attributed to the greater total number of hours of employment, much of it in National Defense work.

Two classes of accidental deaths showed a decline. From the information at hand, it appears that about 1,000 fewer persons were killed in home accidents. And a similar decline is observed in deaths due to accidents in public places, other than those involving motor vehicles.

Although there was an increase in the number of accident catastrophes — accidents taking five or more lives — the total number of lives thus lost, up to the closing days of the year, was less than in 1940. In fact, this will be the only year in the past decade in which there was not at least one catastrophe costing 100 or more lives.



Grave New Reverses Threaten Singapore; Jap Planes Are Hit

Hard-Pressed British Troops Fall Back Before Jap March On Malayan Front

Defenders Yield On Both Flanks

Chinese Try To Wipe Out 40,000 Nipponese Caught In Trap

Admiral John Beardall, former resident of Sanford and Orlando, has been selected by President Roosevelt as the next superintendent of the Naval Academy at Annapolis, according to an Associated Press dispatch.

On the Malayan front, grave new reverses marked the British stand today against the Japanese driving toward Singapore. The British acknowledged their hard-pressed defenders yielded further ground at both ends and the front under attacks by land and sea. The British retreated from Xunstan, only 190 miles north of Singapore, and made the second withdrawal in three days to meet a threat to their left flank.

A Chongking military spokesman said today 40,000 Japanese troops are caught in a trap on the plains northeast of Changsha and said the Chinese commandant of them. The spokesman estimated only 50,000 of the estimated Japanese force of 100,000 escaped to Yenan, 100 miles to the north.

In comes along the West Malayan coast from small boats and junks threatened the British naval base area 200 miles north of Singap-

ore, and right with the apparent object of forcing the British to withdraw from their lines farther north.

All Japanese progress in Malaya, however, had been achieved only by costly infiltration. The invader had won no major victory anywhere nor had any major British force been lost.

Japanese troops struggled to escape from a death trap north of Changsha, where they already have lost an estimated 50,000 men, caught yesterday in a rain storm, which bogged them down in mud and deprived them of air support, front dispatches report.

Most heartening to Singapore's people of all developments were the quick progress made in consolidating forces after the appointment of General Sir Archibald P. Wavell as supreme Allied commander in the Far East, and concurrent indications that the Japanese tanks might be soon forced to withdraw. Chinese reinforcements have joined the imperial forces.

The President's Naval aide since last May, Admiral Beardall was educated as a youth here. Mrs. Florence Beardall resides in Orlando with two of Mr. Beardall's brothers, Dr. H. M. Beardall and Major William Beardall of Orlando.

He was born in a log house near Sanford, and attended Seminole County schools.

His nomination as rear admiral is now before the Senate.

The President is understood to have chosen Admiral Beardall for the post because he wants a vigorous young man in the job who can speed up the vital wartime task of educating and commanding naval officers.

In order to satisfy the increased demand for naval personnel the Navy Department has established an Annapolis course and has set up a 120-day naval officer's course to train civilian college graduates.

Admiral Beardall of the Annapolis class of 1908, probably will be installed in his new post at the end of January.

Admiral Beardall commanded the heavy cruiser "Vincennes" before his assignment to the White House.

Instructions To Increase Airport Runways Received

Instructions from the W.P.A. office in Atlanta to increase by 1,000 feet the length of the two runways at the new Sanford C.A.A. airport have been issued, it was learned by the Herald today.
